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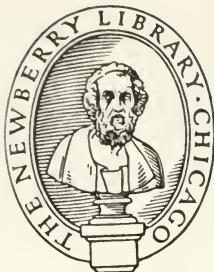

DISTRICTS.

The First District comprises the entire City of Chicago exclusive of the Second District as described below.

The Second District comprises the territory bounded on the North by the center line of 71st street, on the West by Cottage Grove avenue, from 71st street to 95th street; thence East on the center line of 95th street to the center line of the Illinois Central Railroad; thence Southwest along said center line of said Railroad to the East and West half section line of Section 27, T. 37 N., R. 14 E. of the 3rd P. M.; thence East along said half section line to the center line of Cottage Grove avenue as extended South; thence South to the City limits; on the South by the City limits and on the East by the City limits and Lake Michigan.

JURISDICTION.

The Municipal Court has jurisdiction in the following cases:

First Class: All actions on contracts expressed or implied when the amount claimed, exclusive of costs, exceeds one thousand dollars; all actions for the recovery of personal property when the value of the property sought to be recovered as claimed by the plaintiff exceeds one thousand dollars; all actions for the recovery of damages for the conversion of personal property and actions for the recovery of damages for injuries to personal property when the amount of damages sought to be recovered as claimed by the plaintiff, exclusive of costs, exceeds one thousand dollars.

Second Class: Causes transferred from other Courts.

Third Class: All criminal cases in which the punishment is by fine or imprisonment otherwise than in the penitentiary, and all other criminal cases which the laws in force from time to time may permit to be prosecuted otherwise than on indictment by a grand jury.

Fourth Class: All civil actions, quasi criminal actions excepted, for the recovery of money only when the amount claimed by the plaintiff, exclusive of costs, does not exceed one thousand dollars, the amount in any action on a bond to be determined by the amount actually sought to be recovered and not by the penalty of the bond; all actions for the recovery of personal property when the value of the property sought to be recovered does not exceed one thousand dollars; all actions of forcible detainer; all proceedings for the trial of the right of property; and all actions and proceedings of which Justices of the Peace formerly had jurisdiction and which are not otherwise provided for in the Municipal Court Act, in which class of actions and proceedings the Municipal Court has jurisdiction where the amount sought to be recovered does not exceed one thousand dollars. In any action of the fourth class for the recovery of money only, judgments may be rendered for over one thousand dollars where the excess over one thousand dollars shall consist of interest or damages or costs accrued after the commencement of such action.

Fifth Class: All quasi criminal actions excepting bastardy cases.

Sixth Class: All proceedings for the prevention of the commission of crimes; all proceedings for the arrest, examination, commitment and bail of persons charged with criminal offenses;

all proceedings pertaining to searches and seizures of personal property by means of search warrants; and all bastardy cases.

VENUE.

In cases of the first class the defendant may be served anywhere in the City of Chicago; in cases of the fourth class he must be served within the district in which he resides or is found, except where part of the defendants are found within the district where the suit is started, in which case summons may issue to another district for service upon the other defendants; proceedings in rem, in fourth class cases, where the defendant is not personally served, must be started in the district where the property or garnishee is found.

When the amount of money or personal property claimed by the plaintiff exceeds \$200, but does not exceed \$1,000, the clerk's costs are as follows:

In actions of forcible detainer the costs are as follows:

Plaintiff's costs	\$2.00
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In forcible detainer cases the defendant pays no costs unless he demands a trial by jury.

Where plaintiff unites with his claim for possession a demand for rent or damages for withholding possession, the same fees, in addition, from both plaintiff and defendant as in a suit on the money demand.

Demand for jury trial by either party, in all cases	\$6.00
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IN CRIMINAL AND QUASI-CRIMINAL CASES, AND CASES OF THE SIXTH CLASS.

The clerk's fees in every case of this character, in full for all services rendered, are \$6.00, except that in proceedings for the arrest, examination, commitment and bail of persons charged with criminal offenses, the costs are \$15.00.

TRANSCRIPTS.

The fees of the clerk in all cases for making and certifying copies of papers or records, are ten cents for each one hundred words.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The clerk's fees for taking and certifying the acknowledgment of a deed, mortgage (other than a chattel mortgage), power of attorney, or other writing, are twenty-five cents. The clerk's fees for the acknowledgment of a chattel mortgage are thirty-five cents, and fifteen cents for each folio over one hundred words for docketing the same.

BAILIFF'S FEES.

The bailiff's fees for serving any summons, writ of attachment, writ of replevin, subpoena, writ of execution or other process, are for each person served, in first class cases, \$1.75; in fourth class cases, \$1.00.

In cases of writs of attachment, replevin and execution the bailiff is to receive, when any levy upon or seizure of property is to be made thereunder, an additional sum of \$1.75 in first class cases, and \$1.00 in fourth class cases.

When any such levy or seizure is made, the bailiff is also to receive the actual expense of seizing or caring for the property levied upon or seized.

No costs for the service or return of any alias writ shall be chargeable when the costs above provided for the original writ have been paid.

The bailiff, as commissions on money realized by execution in fourth class cases, is to collect from the defendant in the execution 5 per cent. upon the amount realized, if it do not exceed \$100, but if the amount realized exceeds \$100, the bailiff is to collect 5 per cent. on the first \$100 and 3 per cent. upon the excess over \$100.

Other fees are the same as those allowed to the Sheriff of Cook County for similar services.

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RULES OF PRACTICE

OF THE

Supreme Court of Illinois.

IN FORCE MARCH 1, 1911

Records of Trial Courts—How Prepared.

RULE 1. The authenticated copy of the record of the judgment, order or decree of the trial court, to be filed in this court on appeal or error, or in return to a writ of error or *certiorari*, shall contain, in chronological order, copies of—first, the process and service; second, the pleadings; third, the verdict in jury trials; fourth, the judgment or decree of the court; fifth, all orders in the cause; sixth, the bill of exceptions, or, in chancery cases, all depositions, the master's report and certificate of evidence, if any; seventh, the appeal bond, in cases of appeal. But in civil cases a party or his attorney may, by *praecipe*, direct what files of the cause shall be included in the transcript, and in such case, if the transcript shall be insufficient to fully and fairly present the questions involved, the requisite portion shall be applied at his cost, and if unnecessarily voluminous, he shall pay the cost of unnecessary matter. In cases removed from the Appellate Court there shall be added a transcript of the proceedings in such court. In no case shall the clerk insert in any transcript any matter not a part of the record, and the clerk of this court shall not tax as costs any matter so inserted contrary to rule.

Supersedeas—Manner of Applying For—Bond.

RULE 2. If a *supersedeas* shall be applied for, the transcript of the record on which the application is made must be complete, and so certified by the clerk of the court below; or, in civil cases, there shall be attached to the transcript a certificate of the judge who heard the cause below, that the transcript contains all of the record necessary to a full and fair presentation of the errors complained of; and the requisite bond must be entered into and filed in the office of the clerk of this court according to law, with the assignment of errors written on or appended to the record. And on every application for a *supersedeas*, an abstract of the record, with a brief containing the points and authorities relied upon, and pointing specifically to those portions of the record upon which the alleged errors arose, shall be presented, with the record, to the court or judge to whom the application is made. Every such application must be accompanied by a proper affidavit of some credible person, showing the sufficiency of the proffered bail or bond.

RULE 3. Whenever a bond is executed by an attorney in fact, the clerk shall require the original power of attorney to be filed in his office, unless it shall appear that the power of attorney con-

tains other powers than the mere power to execute the bond in question, in which case the original power of attorney shall be presented to the clerk and a true copy thereof filed, certified by the clerk to be a true copy of the original.

RULE 4. When a writ of error shall be made a *supersedeas*, the clerk shall endorse upon said writ the following words: "This writ of error is made a *supersedeas*, and is to be obeyed accordingly," and he shall thereupon file the writ of error, with the transcript of the record, in his office. Said transcript shall be taken and considered as a due return to said writ, and thereupon it shall be the clerk's duty to issue a certificate in substance as follows:

State of Illinois,
Office of Clerk of Supreme Court. }^{ss.}

I do hereby certify that a writ of error has issued from this court for the reversal of a [judgment or decree] obtained byvs..... in thecourt of, at the..... term, A. D. 19.., in a certain action of, which writ of error is made a *supersedeas*, and is to operate as a suspension of the execution of the [judgment or decree] and, as such, is to be obeyed by all concerned. Given under my hand and the seal of the Supreme Court, at Springfield, this.....day of..... A. D. 19..

.....
Clerk.

Writs of Error—Process.

RULE 5. Writs of error shall be directed to the clerk or keeper of the record of the court in which the judgment or decree complained of is entered, commanding him to certify a correct transcript of the record to this court; but where the plaintiff in error shall file in the office of the clerk of this court a transcript of the record, duly certified to according to the rules, before a writ of error issues, it shall not be necessary to send such writ to the clerk of the interior court, but such transcript shall be taken and considered as a due return to said writ.

RULE 6. The process on a writ of error shall be a *scire facias* to hear errors, issued on the application of the plaintiff in error to the clerk, upon the filing of the transcript of record, directed to the sheriff or other officer of the proper county, commanding him to summon the defendant in error to appear in court and show cause, if any he have, why the judgment or decree mentioned in the writ of error shall not be reversed. If the *scire facias* be not returned executed, successive writs may issue without an order of court. If the application for the *scire facias* shall

be made on or before twenty days before the first day of the succeeding term of said court, then the *scire facias* shall be made returnable on the first day of such succeeding term; but if the application is not made on or before twenty days before the first day of the succeeding term, then the *scire facias* shall be made returnable on the first day of the second succeeding term.

RULE 7. The first day of each term shall be return day for the return of process, and no party shall be compelled to answer or prepare for hearing unless the *scire facias* shall have been served twenty days before the return day thereof; nor shall a defendant be at liberty to enter his appearance and compel the plaintiff to proceed with the cause unless the defendant shall have given the plaintiff twenty days' notice, before the term, of his intention to enter his appearance and have the cause proceed to a hearing. If the *scire facias* is served less than twenty days before the return day thereof, the defendant will be required to plead or join in error by the first day of the second succeeding term to which the cause shall stand continued.

RULE 8. In all cases in which a writ of error is made a *supersedeas*, the plaintiff in error shall, on filing the record with the clerk, at the same time order and direct a *scire facias* to issue to hear errors, and shall use reasonable diligence to have the same served twenty days before the first day of the term to which it is made returnable. On failing to do so, the defendant in error shall have the right to a hearing at the said term, after joining in error, without giving twenty days' notice as required by rule 7: *Provided*, if there be not twenty days between the allowance of the *supersedeas* and the sitting of the court the cause shall stand continued until the next term, unless, by consent of parties, it shall be otherwise ordered.

Notice to Purchasers and Tenants.

RULE 9. In all cases wherein guardians, executors or administrators, or others acting in a fiduciary character, have obtained an order or decree for the sale of lands in causes *ex parte*, and a sale has been had under such decree or order, and the same shall be brought to this court for review, the purchaser or tenants of such lands, if known, shall be suggested to the court by affidavit of the plaintiff in error, and notice given them of the pendency of the writ of error twenty days before the first day of the term of the court to which the *scire facias* is returnable, so that they may appear and defend.

Time for Filing Records—Hearing Docket.

RULE 10. No case brought to this court by appeal or on error shall be placed on the court docket for hearing unless the record is filed on or before twenty days before the first day of the term, nor in cases brought by writ of error unless the *scire facias* shall have been served twenty days before the first day of the term, except in extraordinary cases the court, upon special application, may order a cause to be placed on the hearing docket.

Assignment of Errors.

RULE 11. The appellant or plaintiff in error shall, in all cases, assign errors at the time of filing his record in this court, and on failing to do so the case may be dismissed or the judgment or decree be affirmed; but other errors may be assigned after the filing of the record, by leave of the court or of one of the justices. The appellee or defendant in error shall have the right to assign cross-errors, as allowed by the statute, within two days after the record is filed in this court, and not afterwards without special leave of the court or of one of the justices. The assignment of errors and cross-errors must be written upon or attached to the record.

Inspection of Original Papers.

RULE 12. Whenever, in the opinion of the presiding judge of any inferior court, an inspection of an original paper in an action on appeal or writ of error shall be important to a correct decision of the case, such judge may make such order for the transmission, safe keeping and return of such original paper as to him may seem proper. And the clerk of this court will receive such original paper in connection with the transcript, and hold the same subject to such order.

Removing Records.

RULE 13. No person shall remove from the office of the clerk any record of this court, except upon special leave granted for that purpose. No record shall be taken from the files of the court, except on application therefor to the clerk or his deputy, and it is made the duty of the clerk to report promptly to the court every violation of this rule. The clerk shall be held responsible for the safe keeping and production of the records: *Provided*, that in cases in which the appeal or writ of error is transferred to an Appellate Court because the same should have been taken to, or sued out of, that court, the clerk shall transmit the record, abstracts and briefs to such Appellate Court; and in all cases in which an appeal is dismissed, where the party still shall have the right to sue out of this court a writ of error, the clerk shall permit the party to use the transcript of the record as a return to a writ of error sued out of this court, and no special order shall be necessary for such purpose. And provided further, that when the original bill of exceptions or certificate of evidence shall be incorporated in the transcript of the record and the judgment or decree shall be reversed and the cause remanded for another trial or hearing, said original bill of exceptions or certificate of evidence may be withdrawn by either party desiring to use the same on another trial or hearing, and the clerk of this court, upon application therefor, will detach the same from the transcript, substituting therefor the receipt of the party to whom the same is delivered and a certified copy of any original document included in or annexed to such bill of exceptions or certificate of evidence as an exhibit.

Abstracts.

RULE 14. In all cases the party bringing a cause into this court shall furnish a complete abstract or abridgment of the

record, referring to the pages of the record by numerals on the margin. And where the record contains the evidence, it shall be condensed in narrative form in the abstract, so as to clearly and concisely present its substance. The abstract shall contain a complete index, alphabetically arranged, giving the page where each paper or exhibit may be found, with the names of the witnesses and the pages of the direct, cross and re-direct examination: *Provided*, that in cases brought from the Appellate Court the abstracts filed in such court under its rules may be filed here by changing the cover to conform to the rule, and filing therewith a printed abstract of the record of the Appellate Court and an index. The abstract must be sufficient to fully present every error and exception relied upon, and it will be taken to be accurate and sufficient for a full understanding of the questions presented for decision, unless the opposite party shall file a further abstract, making necessary corrections or additions. Such further abstract may be filed if the original abstract is incomplete or inaccurate in any substantial part.

Briefs.

RULE 15. Each party shall file a printed brief in the cause. The brief of appellant or plaintiff in error shall contain a short and clear statement of the case, including, first, the form of the action; second, the nature of the pleadings sufficiently to show what the issues were, and to present any question subject to review arising on such pleadings; third, in cases depending upon the evidence the leading facts which such evidence proved or tended to prove, without discussion or argument and without detail; fourth, how the issues were decided upon the trial or hearing, and what the judgment or decree was; and fifth, the errors relied upon for a reversal. The statement so made will be taken to be accurate and sufficient, unless the opposite party shall, in his brief, point out wherein it is inaccurate or insufficient. Following the statement of the case, the brief shall conclude with the points made and the authorities relied upon in support of them; and in citing cases, the names of the parties must be given, with the book and page where the case is reported. No alleged error or point not contained in such brief shall be raised afterwards, either by reply brief, or in oral or printed argument, or on petition for rehearing.

The brief of appellee or defendant in error shall contain a short and clear statement of the propositions by which counsel seek to meet the alleged errors and sustain the judgment or decree, or by which such errors are obviated. Counsel may also, in such statement, point out any insufficiency or inaccuracy in the statement of the opposite party, and supply or correct the same, and, in cases depending on the evidence, may state the leading facts or conclusions which the evidence proved or tended to prove, without discussion or argument and without detail. Such brief shall conclude with the points and authorities relied upon, in like manner as required in the briefs of appellant or plaintiff in error. All briefs shall be signed by counsel filing the same.

In all cases brought from the Appellate Court, the party bringing the case to this court shall file as an appendix to his brief the printed opinion of such Appellate Court in the cause, including the statement of facts, if any, prepared by that court.

The brief of any party may be followed by an argument in support of such brief, which shall be distinct therefrom but bound with the same. The argument shall be confined to discussion and elaboration of the points contained in the brief. Evidence shall not be copied at length in such argument, but it shall refer to the abstract for the same; *Provided*, that where it may be important to determine what questions were raised in the Appellate Court, certified copies of the briefs and arguments filed and used in that court may be filed in this court on motion and leave granted. Briefs filed in the Appellate Court will not be received for any other purpose.

Printing Briefs and Abstracts.

RULE 16. Abstracts and briefs shall be printed in a neat and workmanlike manner, with small pica type and leaded lines, upon white paper 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ by 10 inches, as near as may be, bound in book or pamphlet form, with a suitable cover containing the title of the court and cause and the court from which the case is brought. The name of the trial judge entering the judgment, decree or order to be reviewed shall appear upon the cover of the abstract. Twelve copies of each abstract and brief shall be filed with the clerk of this court, one of which shall be for the use of the opposite party and one for the official reporter.

Motions.

RULE 17. The clerk of this court will enter all motions of course, such as for hearing, taking the case under advisement and entering decisions. Special motions may be made immediately after the decisions of the court are announced, but at no other time, unless in case of necessity or in relation to a cause when called in course. They shall be in writing, and when based on matters which do not appear of record shall be supported by affidavit. They shall be filed with the clerk, together with the reasons in support thereof, at least one day before they shall be submitted to the court and at least one day before the cause stands for trial, except as above provided. Objections to motions must also be in writing, and oral arguments will not be heard: *Provided, however*, that before such motions are made, a copy thereof, together with the reasons and showing in support of the same, shall be served on counsel of the opposite party, unless such service shall be shown, by affidavit, to be impracticable.

Time to Plead.

RULE 18. In all cases in this court where the defendant in error or appellee desires to plead and not join in error, he shall file his plea in the office of the clerk not later than the first day of the term at which the cause stands for hearing, and the issue thereon must be made up before the day the cause is to be heard.

Security for Costs.

RULE 19. Upon filing an affidavit that any plaintiff in error is not a resident

of this state, or insolvent, and that no bond for costs has been filed, a rule shall be entered against him, of which he shall take notice, to show cause why the writ shall not be dismissed.

Original Actions.

RULE 20. In proceedings in original actions relating to the revenue, process or notice of a motion shall be served on the defendant at least twenty days before the first day of the term. If there shall not be twenty days between the day of service and first day of the term, or if a declaration setting forth the cause of action shall not be filed at least twenty days before the first day of the term, the cause may be continued on the application of the defendant.

Final Process.

RULE 21. No final process shall issue in any case before the close of the term, unless, for good cause shown, the court shall otherwise order.

Agreed Cases.

RULE 22. No judgment will be pronounced in any agreed case placed upon the docket of this court, unless an affidavit shall be filed setting forth that the matters presented by the record were litigated in good faith about a matter in actual controversy between the parties, and that the opinion of this court is not sought with any other design than to adjudicate and settle the law relative to the matter in actual controversy between the parties to the record.

Docketing and Rehearing.

RULE 23. Causes in which the people are a party, and in which they have a direct interest in the decision, shall be placed at the head of the docket; all other cases shall be docketed and called for argument in the order in which the records shall have been filed with the clerk: *Provided, however,* that causes which, in the judgment of the court, involve important public interests may be advanced on the docket.

RULE 24. In preparing the docket of the business of the terms the clerk shall place upon the same all cases pending in which final judgment has not been entered, and in all such cases where the case shall have been submitted to the court for consideration, the clerk shall note upon the docket the term at which such case was submitted.

RULE 25. All petitions for rehearing shall be docketed separate and apart from the trial docket.

Call of Docket—Expiration of Rules.

RULE 26. The trial docket shall be called numerically, and the causes shall be argued, continued or otherwise disposed of as they are called, unless, for good cause shown, they be placed at the foot of the docket. All unexpired rules will terminate upon the call of the cause for hearing: *Provided,* that if the court shall give time to either party without the consent of the other, the cause shall not lose its precedence on the docket.

Call of Docket—Time of Filing Abstracts and Briefs.

RULE 27. The call of the docket will commence on Thursday of the second week of the term and twenty cases per day shall be subject to call. Abstracts and briefs of the appellant or plaintiff

in error must be filed in the clerk's office on or before twenty days before the first day of the term at which the cause will stand for hearing, together with proof of service of copies of such abstracts and briefs on the opposite party or his counsel, personally or by mail, and in case either the abstract or brief is not so filed within the time prescribed, the judgment of the court below will, on the call of the docket, be affirmed. The appellee or defendant in error shall file his brief, with like proof of service, not later than the first day of the term, unless the time for filing the brief of appellant or plaintiff in error shall be extended, in which case he shall have twenty days from the day on which the brief of appellant or plaintiff in error is actually filed. Appellant or plaintiff in error shall then have seven days in which to file a reply brief, with like proof of service, at the expiration of which time the cause will stand for decision and no further printed arguments will be received.

Oral Argument.

RULE 28. Oral argument will be heard on behalf of each party who shall have complied with the rule for filing briefs, and who shall file with his briefs a statement of his intention to argue such cause orally, which statement of intention to argue orally shall be printed at the bottom of the outside or first page of the cover of the brief, and no further brief shall be received on behalf of any party after he shall have argued the case orally. The time allowed for oral argument shall be restricted to one hour on each side, unless otherwise specially permitted. But in the division of his time the appellant or plaintiff in error shall make a fair opening of the cause, and shall not raise any new point in reply. Oral argument shall be strictly confined to the questions at issue in the cause: *Provided,* that where any cause shall be argued on one side only, such argument shall be restricted to thirty minutes.

Transferred Causes.

RULE 29. Where a cause is transferred to this court from an Appellate Court, for the reason that it was wrongfully taken to that court when it should have been taken directly from the trial court to this court, the same rules shall govern, in reference to the preparation and filing of briefs and abstracts and in reference to docketing and hearing the cause, as though it had been brought here by appeal from the Appellate Court, the date of the order of the Appellate Court transferring the cause being regarded, for the purposes of this rule, as though it were the date of an order allowing an appeal in the cause from the Appellate Court to this court.

Rehearings—How Applied for.

RULE 30. The manner of applying for a rehearing shall be as follows: Within fifteen days after an opinion is filed, a party desiring a rehearing shall file a notice in writing of his intention to make such application with the clerk of this court, and shall within said time, deliver a copy thereof to the official reporter of this court, and within twenty-five days after the filing of the opinion shall place on file in the clerk's office twelve printed copies of the petition, and within the

same time deliver a copy to said official reporter. Application for a rehearing in any cause shall be made by petition to the court, signed by counsel, stating concisely the points supposed to have been overlooked or misapprehended by the court, with proper reference to the particular portion of the original abstract and brief relied upon. In no case will any argument be permitted in support of such petition. This rule will be strictly enforced, and any petition in violation thereof will be stricken from the files.

Stay of Proceedings on Petition.

RULE 31. Where an opinion is filed and a petition for rehearing shall afterwards be presented to a justice of the court, if such justice shall certify that in his opinion the case should be further considered by the court on such petition all further proceedings in the cause shall be stayed until the next term of the court. If it is practicable to do so, such application shall be presented to the justice who wrote the opinion in the case.

Docketing Rehearings—Time of Filing Briefs.

RULE 32. When, in any case, a rehearing is granted, the case shall be placed for hearing at the foot of the docket. The original brief and argument of the petitioner shall stand as his printed brief and argument, on the hearing. The opposite party shall, in all such cases, have ten days from the time of granting the rehearing to reply to the petition and the petitioner shall have five days to file his closing argument, and the case shall then stand for final decision. Where a cause is re-heard oral argument shall not be permitted except it be ordered by the court upon its own motion, and, when oral argument is allowed, if the party against whom the rehearing is granted wishes to avail himself of the permission to argue orally, his closing printed argument must be filed on or before the calling of the cause. Oral argument on both sides, when allowed, shall close the arguments in the case.

Clerk's Fees Advanced.

RULE 33. There shall be advanced by the party filing the transcript of the record from the court below in this court, at the time of filing the same, the sum of ten dollars, said sum to apply on account of taxable fees to the clerk; but no additional advanced fees shall be required of either party except as fees are earned, if the case shall be again docketed on any motion, petition for rehearing, or for any other purpose.

Taxing Printer's Fees for Abstracts.

RULE 34. Upon printed abstracts being furnished in conformity to the rules of this court, it shall be the duty of the clerk to tax a printer's fee at the rate of twenty cents for each one hundred words of one copy of such abstracts against the unsuccessful party not furnishing the same, as costs, to be recovered by the successful party furnishing such abstract. Appellees or defendants in error who shall file additional abstracts under the rules of this court shall, if successful in the cause, be entitled to have taxed like fees for such additional abstracts on motion, if the court shall be of the opinion that such additional abstracts were necessary.

Library.

RULE 35. The librarian of the law library attached to this court shall not permit any person, except those authorized by these rules, to take from the rooms of this court any book or books belonging to said library without the consent of the court being first obtained for that purpose; and if any person not so authorized shall take away a book without such consent, such person shall be considered in contempt of the court, and may be fined at the discretion of the court.

RULE 36. Books may be taken from the library upon the written order of a judge of the United States circuit or district court.

RULE 37. The books of the law library shall not be marked or underlined with pen or pencil, nor shall the pages of the same be folded down. The librarian shall adopt such rules as to the safe keeping of the books as he may deem expedient.

Seniority—Chief Justice—Order of Succession.

RULE 38. Seniority among the justices shall be determined by length of continuous service, but if the terms of two or more justices shall begin at the same time, they shall determine the seniority, as between or among themselves, by lot, unless they shall be able to determine it by agreement. The term of chief justice shall begin on the first Monday of June in each year. No justice shall be eligible as chief who shall not have served as a justice at least two years. Among those who are eligible, justices who have not before served as chief shall be preferred, and among the latter seniority, as determined by this rule, shall control. If all the eligible justices shall have before served as chief, then that justice shall succeed whose last term as chief is most remote in point of time.

Admissions to the Bar—Board of Examiners.

RULE 39. There shall be appointed by this court a State Board of Law Examiners, to consist of five members of the bar of at least five years' standing,—one from each Appellate Court district and one from the State at large,—to hold, regulate, supervise and control examinations for admission to the bar, and to examine and report upon applications for admission, based upon admission to the bar in another State or foreign country. Every application to this court for admission to the bar shall be made in term time, by motion in open court, based upon a report of said Board of Law Examiners. Each examiner shall act as a member of such board for a term of three years, except under the first appointment, which shall be for a term of one year for one, two years for two and three years for the remaining two of said examiners, and until the appointment of their successors.

Examinations shall be conducted by written or printed interrogatories, in whole or in part, and be as nearly as possible uniform throughout the State; to be held at Ottawa on the last Tuesday in February; at Chicago the first Tuesday next succeeding the fourth day in July; at Springfield the first Tuesday in October, and at Mt. Vernon on the first Tuesday in December in each year.

Rules of Supreme Court of Illinois.

Such examinations shall be held by the examiners as a body, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum.

Each applicant examined must sustain a satisfactory examination upon the law of real and personal property, personal rights, torts, contracts, evidence, common law and equity pleading, partnerships, bailments, negotiable instruments, principal and agent, principal and surety, domestic relations, wills, corporations, equity jurisprudence, conflict of laws, criminal law, and upon the principles of the constitutions of the State and of the United States, and legal ethics.

The board shall certify to this court every person who shall pass a satisfactory examination, provided such person shall have in other respects complied with the rules regulating the licensing of attorneys, which fact shall be determined by said board before the examination. If an applicant, on examination, should be rejected, he shall not again be admitted to an examination, until at least one examination has intervened after such rejection, and shall file with the board proof that he has studied law during the intervening time subsequent to the prior examination.

Each applicant for admission to the bar, whether upon examination or admission in another State or foreign country, shall pay to said board, in advance, a fee of eight dollars, and shall present his affidavit, or that of some other reputable person for him, that he is of the age of twenty-one years or above, a resident of this State and a citizen of the United States, or has declared his intention of becoming a citizen thereof; also, a certified transcript of the record from a court of record of this State showing that he is a person of good moral character, which transcript shall show that at least two reputable members of the bar practicing in the court in which the record is made, and whose names shall be given, appeared before said court and testified that the applicant was a reputable person and of good moral character.

Every applicant, except those who apply for admission by virtue of admission in another State or foreign country, shall present to the Board of Law Examiners satisfactory proof, in writing, by examination or otherwise, as the board may direct, that he has had a preliminary general education equivalent to that of a graduate of a high school in this State, and has pursued for the period of three years, during at least thirty-six weeks in each year, a course of law studies covering the subjects above enumerated, naming the law books studied, and that such law studies have been pursued in an established law school considered by the board to be in good standing, or under the tuition of one or more licensed lawyers, and that the applicant, if studying under such tuition, has submitted to regular and satisfactory examinations by such lawyer or lawyers during said period, upon each subject. Such proof shall consist of the affidavit of the applicant and the certificate of the secretary or one of the professors of the law school, showing personal attendance at such law school, or the certificate or certificates of the lawyer or lawyers under whose tuition such studies have been pursued, or if, in consequence of the

death or absence of such lawyer or lawyers, his or their certificate cannot be procured, its place may be supplied by the affidavit of any credible witness having knowledge of the facts. The course of study may be made up by attendance upon a law school for a portion of the time and under the direction and supervision of one or more lawyers for the remainder of the time.

The papers produced to the board of examiners in conformity with the foregoing rule shall not be deemed conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated, and if it shall come to the knowledge of said board that any person who has presented to said board such transcript, has imposed upon the court in which the record is made and is not, in fact, a person of good moral character, or that any certificate or affidavit is untrue, said board shall, after full investigation, certify their findings in that respect, together with the reasons therefor, to this court with their certificate of qualification. Any fraudulent act or representation by an applicant in connection with his application for examination or admission shall be sufficient cause for the withholding of the license by this court, or for its revocation after it has been issued.

Every applicant for admission to the bar upon a license or other voucher showing his admission as an attorney at law in another State or foreign country, must, in addition to the other proofs above required, present to the board such license duly certified, or a copy of the record of the court showing his admission to the bar, duly proved, as required by law for the authentication of the records of courts of sister States when offered in evidence in the courts of this State. Such license or voucher must confer the right to practice in the highest courts in such State or foreign country. Such applicant shall be admitted upon such license or voucher without examination by the board, if it appears to the court, by certificate of said board, that in the State or country in which the license was issued the requirements for admission to the bar were equal to those prescribed in this State, or that the applicant has been engaged in active practice for a period of five years in courts of record under such license. The board shall certify to this court persons entitled to admission by virtue of such admission to the bar in such other State or foreign country.

Out of the fees received by the board of examiners they shall pay all necessary expenses for examinations, including necessary traveling expenses. The remainder of said fund in each year shall be divided equally among the examiners: *Provided, however,* that no examiner shall receive more than \$750 per annum, and if, after the payment of such sum to each examiner, there shall remain a surplus, said surplus shall be paid over to the succeeding board of examiners, and shall constitute a part of the receipts of the next succeeding year. The board of examiners shall render an account of their receipts and disbursements to this court at the October term of each year.

Proceedings to Strike Attorneys from Roll.

RULE 40. In case an application shall

be made to strike the name of an attorney from the roll there shall be filed an information making clear and specific charges, giving time, place and acts of misconduct, with reasonable certainty, signed by the Attorney General, a State's Attorney, the president and secretary of a regularly organized bar association, either incorporated or unincorporated, or any person aggrieved by the misconduct of the attorney charged. Where the information is signed by such aggrieved person he shall verify it by an affidavit, upon which perjury can be assigned, and such aggrieved person must be represented in the proceeding so instituted by an attorney whose name then appears upon the roll of the attorneys of this court. When the information shall be deemed sufficient the court will enter a rule to show cause on a day named, and when the rule shall be answered, the court will prescribe the time of closing proofs by the respective parties, and the cause shall then stand for hearing.

Reporting and Publishing Decisions.

RULE 41. As to the time and manner of publishing decisions the following rules shall be observed:

First—The reporter shall publish, in book form, all such opinions as are to be reported, which may be filed hereafter, within three months after the filing and recording of the same, except where more opinions of the court shall be filed at the same time than will comprise one volume of the Reports, in which event the reporter shall publish the first volume of such opinions within three months after the time of the filing and recording thereof, and the residue shall be published in volumes at the rate of one volume for every three months.

Second—In order to facilitate the publication of the opinions hereafter to be filed, as herein prescribed, it shall be the duty of the clerk of this court to transmit to the reporter, without delay, a copy of the printed abstracts, briefs and arguments in each case taken by the court.

Third—In cases where application for rehearing shall be made under the rules of the court, the reporter shall not publish the opinions therein until such application shall have been disposed of.

Fourth—Each volume of Reports hereafter to be published shall contain not less than seven hundred pages, and shall be of the same general character, typographically, as those heretofore published by the present reporter, subject to such changes as the court may, from time to time, specially direct. The paper upon which the reports may be printed shall be clear, white paper, supersized and calendered, and of not less than 50 pounds to the ream. The binding shall be of the best law-sheep, without blemish or patches, and the boards used in binding shall be good tar boards.

Fifth—The reporter shall prepare a proper and correct headnote or syllabus in each case, and may publish the briefs of counsel, in his discretion. He shall furnish a table of cases reported in each volume, arranged in alphabetical order, and an index of the matter contained in the volume, distributed under appropriate

heads, with cross-references and numbers. In any volume which shall close a term of court there shall be published a table of the cases directed not to be reported. Such rules as may be from time to time adopted by the court shall be published in the volume next succeeding their adoption.

Sixth—It is made the duty of the reporter to superintend the printing of the Reports, and see that they are accurately and properly printed. He shall transmit to each of the justices of this court a printed copy of all the cases reported, before the regular edition shall be printed.

Seventh—The reporter is not required to attend upon the term of this court, except as may, from time to time, be specially directed.

Eighth—It shall be the duty of the reporter to keep constantly on hand, of the Reports hereafter to be published, a sufficient number to meet promptly any demand of the profession therefor.

Certiorari.

Rule 42. In case application shall be made to require any case decided by an Appellate Court to be certified to this court for review and determination, there shall be filed a petition for a writ or certiorari, signed in writing by counsel by his or their individual name or names, together with transcripts of the records of the trial court and Appellate Court, as required by rule 1 in cases removed from the Appellate Court to this court, and with an assignment of errors written upon or attached to the transcript of the record of the Appellate Court. It shall not be necessary to file a copy of the original transcript of the record of the trial court filed in the Appellate Court, but it shall be sufficient to file such original transcript, authenticated by the seal of the Appellate Court and the certificate of the clerk. Upon the filing of the petition, together with the transcript of the record of the Appellate Court, the clerk of this court shall issue to the clerk of the Appellate Court a certificate of such filing, and the clerk of the Appellate Court shall thereupon transmit to the clerk of this court the original transcript of the record of the trial court. In case the writ shall not be granted the original transcript of the record of the trial court shall be returned forthwith to the clerk of the Appellate Court. The petition shall be docketed, "..... Petitioner, v Respondent." The petitioner shall file with his petition an abstract of the record prepared in accordance with rules 14 and 16 in cases brought from an Appellate Court. The petition shall contain a concise statement of the case and of the points and authorities relied upon for reversal, without argument, and shall be accompanied by a copy of the opinion of the Appellate Court. Twelve copies of such petition and abstract shall be filed, with proof of service of copies thereof upon the opposite party or his counsel. No petition shall be heard at any term unless filed on or before twenty days before the first day thereof. The respondent may file a reply to the petition on or before the first day of the

term, stating briefly and concisely, without argument the points and authorities relied upon to meet or obviate the alleged errors and sustain the judgment, which shall constitute an appearance in the case. Twelve copies of such reply shall be filed. Oral arguments will not be heard upon such petition. If the petition shall be granted it shall not be necessary to send the writ of certiorari to the clerk of the Appellate Court, but the transcript of the record filed, with the petition, shall be taken and considered as a due return to the writ and the cause shall thereafter be docketed as in cases of writs of error, the peti-

tioner being designated as plaintiff in error, but it shall retain the original number of the petition, and no additional docket fee shall be required of the petitioner. A scire facias to hear errors shall be issued in the manner provided by rule 6, returnable on the first day of the next term, for all respondents who have not appeared in opposition to the petition. After the petition is granted the cause shall proceed as if pending on writ of error, and the rules in regard to the filing of briefs and arguments and making oral arguments shall apply as in other cases.

UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT

FOR THE NORTHERN DISTRICT OF ILLINOIS.

RULES IN BANKRUPTCY

It is hereby ordered, that until otherwise ordered by the court the following temporary rules be and are hereby adopted and prescribed for the regulation of proceedings in bankruptcy in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois.

Rule I.—Adopted March 29, 1899.

All notices required to be given under Section 53 of said Act shall be printed on postal cards or on cards to which one cent stamps may by postal regulations be attached, and said cards properly stamped and addressed, together with proper blank affidavit of mailing, which shall contain a list of the names of the creditors to whom notices are to be sent and their respective addresses, as appears by the schedule filed by the bankrupt, shall be delivered by the bankrupt or his attorney to the referee (except the notice of the petition for final discharge and affidavit of mailing thereof, which shall be delivered in like manner to the clerk of this court) at least one day before the same are required to be mailed under the provisions of this Act; and the same referee or clerk, or some person in their employ, shall mail said notices and execute the proper affidavit thereof. The referee or clerk shall direct the form or manner of publication and proof thereof, of the notices mailed by them respectively, and shall sign the original of each notice.

Rule II.—Adopted Feb. 8, 1899.

Where voluntary bankrupts have heretofore omitted to subscribe the several sheets of their schedules attached to their petitions, they are hereby ordered so to do, whether their said petitions are in possession of the clerk, referee, or trustee, without any further order in their respective cases.

Rule III.—Adopted March 4, 1899.

The petition for a discharge must be in the form prescribed by the Supreme Court (No. 57), and shall be filed with the clerk, who upon the presentation of such petition to him shall enter the order which is part of form No. 57, and shall set a day for a hearing, not less

than ten days after the date of entry of such order. The clerk shall also attend to the publication and mailing of such order, and certify to the same as provided in form No. 57, but the clerk may require the bankrupt or his attorney to prepare all necessary copies and notices in form as directed. The publication as aforesaid shall be made at least one week, and the copies shall be mailed to creditors at least ten days prior to the day named for the hearing on such petition.

There must also be presented to the clerk at some time before the final discharge is granted a report or certificate of the referee that the bankrupt has in all things conformed to the requirements of the Act and that so far as the referee has been able to ascertain the said bankrupt has committed none of the offenses and done none of the acts prohibited in Sub-division (b) of Section 14 of the Act, and that such bankrupt is in the opinion of the referee entitled to his discharge.

If no creditor or other party in interest appears and opposes on or before the day named in the order to show cause, the discharge may be granted. Opposition to the discharge by a creditor or other party in interest shall be made in the manner prescribed in general order XXXII. The issue thus joined may be referred to the referee to ascertain and report the facts with his conclusions thereon. Either party may except to such report, and the exceptions may be heard by the judge upon one of the days designated by him for such hearings.

Rule IV.—Adopted March 30, 1899.

Upon the filing of a petition for a meeting of creditors to consider a composition as per form 60 prescribed by the Supreme Court, the matter shall be referred by the clerk to the proper referee, who shall give the notice therefor as prescribed by Rule I of this court.

Upon the filing of a petition for confirmation of a composition the referee shall fix a day within which parties in interest shall show cause in opposition thereto in the manner provided in general rule XXXII. of the Supreme Court.

Rules in Bankruptcy.

and shall mail notices thereof to the creditors in accordance with rule I of this court, which notices shall be mailed at least ten days before the said date fixed by the referee. If no creditor or other party in interest shall appear in opposition to the confirmation of such composition within the time so fixed, as provided in said rule XXXII, and the bankrupt shall file the written approval of the referee of the composition, the same may be confirmed by the court, but if opposition is made to such confirmation, the issues shall be by the clerk referred to the referee to ascertain and report the facts, together with his conclusions thereon. Either party may except to such report, and the exceptions may be heard by the judge upon one of the days designated by him for such hearings.

Rule V.—Adopted April 26, 1899.

The petitioner or petitioners in all cases in bankruptcy shall, at the time of filing their respective petitions, deposit with the clerk the sum of five dollars (\$5) to indemnify the referee for his necessary incidental expenses, including office rent, clerical aid, stationery, etc., and out of which sum the referee may be reimbursed for such expense. The sum so advanced by the bankrupt or other person, may be repaid him out of the assets of the estate, if any, as costs of administration.

Where expenses shall be incurred by the referee in excess of said deposit of five dollars, in any particular case, a special order with reference to the same may be made by the judge on application of the referee.

The referee shall keep an account as against said fund, showing the items of disbursements and incidental expenses incurred in each case.

Rule VI.—Adopted May 15, 1899.

In all cases in this district, wherever funds are to be distributed by the clerk, trustee or referee, the same shall be by check payable to the order of the creditor in whose name the account is proved, or to the attorney in fact of such creditor or to the assignee of such account (provided the power of attorney or assignment is filed with the referee); but such check may be delivered to the attorney of record in this court of such creditor or assignee. And in all cases which have been referred to a referee, all checks shall be signed by the clerk or proper trustee and also by the referee to whom the cause has been referred, before they are issued; and whenever the statute or general rules provide for the deposit of funds and the checking out thereof under the direction of the judge of this court, it shall be proper to have same deposited in the name of the clerk, and checks against said fund shall be signed by the clerk and also by the proper referee before they are issued, except on special cause shown in a particular case.

Rule VII.—Adopted Oct. 24, 1899.

All specifications of objections to discharge of bankrupts when duly filed, will be referred by the clerk to the proper referee to take testimony and report the same together with his conclusions thereon to the court.

Rule VIII.—Adopted January 5, 1900.

The referees in bankruptcy appointed by this court are hereby designated and authorized to countersign checks drawn on funds in the depositories of this court, in the cases assigned to them respectively, whenever such checks are required by the terms of Supreme Court rule XXIX to be countersigned by a judge or referee.

Rule IX.—Adopted July 24, 1905.**Receivers.**

Upon every application for a receiver in bankruptcy, notice thereof shall be first given to the bankrupt unless it be made to appear to the court, by the petition or affidavit showing the facts, that the service of such notice is impracticable.

The receiver, upon his appointment and qualification, shall proceed, without delay, to make an inventory of the property coming to his possession, and shall file the same immediately upon its completion, with the clerk of this court.

The receiver shall not employ an attorney or counsel without having obtained leave of court therefor, upon written application, setting forth the facts showing the necessity for such employment, and no attorney or counsel for such receiver shall be allowed compensation out of the estate for services other than for such as are reasonably necessary, and of a strictly legal character.

No sale of property shall be made by a receiver unless he present to the court his verified petition setting forth the necessity therefor, and also make it appear to the satisfaction of the court that the estate will suffer loss unless such sale be made before the election of the trustee. In no case shall a sale be made without notice to creditors as provided in Section 58 a, nor shall a sale be made before adjudication without the bankrupt's consent, except as provided for in Section 2 (5) and General Order in Bankruptcy XVIII.

All moneys belonging to a bankrupt estate, coming into a receiver's hands, shall be by him immediately deposited in one of the designated depositories, and the same shall not be withdrawn except on checks signed by the receiver and countersigned by the clerk of this court, upon the order of the judge (unless otherwise provided where the receiver is conducting the business under orders of the court), provided checks may be drawn and signed, as aforesaid, to cover small in-so orders.

Immediately upon the appointment and qualification of a trustee, the receiver shall turn over to such trustee all the money and property in the receiver's possession, taking the trustee's receipt therefor, and the receiver shall file his final report and account within five days after the qualification of the trustee, unless such time be extended by order of the judge.

Rules in Bankruptcy.

Receivers shall receive for their services, payable after they are rendered, out of the first moneys coming to the hands of the trustee, such compensation as the court may allow, provided that the maximum allowance to the receiver shall not exceed the maximum to be allowed trustees for their services under Section 48 (a) of the Bankruptcy Act as amended February 5th, 1903, for moneys disbursed by them, and, provided, also, that where tangible property other than money is turned over to a trustee by the receiver, such receiver's maximum compensation shall be based upon the fair value of such property in addition to the aggregate of the money actually disbursed and turned over to the trustee, or the receiver's fees be held in abeyance until the trustee reduces the property to money.

See opinion of Judge Lowell, *In re Cambridge Lumber Co.*, 136 Fed. Rep., 983.

Rule X.—Adopted July 24, 1905.**Petitioning Creditors.**

It shall be the duty of the petitioning creditors, through their attorneys, to procure the adjudication of the bankrupt as speedily as the law permits. The attention of petitioning creditors and their attorneys is especially directed to General Order in Bankruptcy IX.

Rule XI.—Adopted July 24, 1905.**Petition to Dismiss Proceedings.**

Every application to dismiss a voluntary or involuntary petition in bankruptcy,

as contemplated by Section 59 g of the Bankruptcy Act, must be by petition in writing, signed by such applicant or his attorney of record in the case, and if made in an involuntary case before the schedules provided for in Section 7 of the Act have been filed, such application must be accompanied by a list of all of the known creditors of the bankrupt, which list must either have been sworn to by the bankrupt or by one of the petitioning creditors or his attorney in the case. Upon the filing of such petition to dismiss, an order will be entered of record in the case, fixing a day more than ten days after the filing of the application, upon which creditors and all parties in interest may show cause before the judge, if any there be, in opposition to such petition to dismiss, which order shall also provide for notice to be given in accordance with Section 58a (8) of the Bankruptcy Act. If such application to dismiss is presented before adjudication and reference, the notice aforesaid may be given by the clerk; if filed after the adjudication and reference, the notice shall be given by the referee to whom the case stands generally referred, and in such case, a certified copy of the order to show cause shall at once be furnished the referee. The certificate of the clerk or referee, as the case may be, showing that the aforesaid notice has been duly given, shall be filed in the clerk's office on or before the day fixed in the order to show cause.

REFEREES' RULES CONCERNING PETITIONS IN BANKRUPTCY

The following rules governing the preparation of petitions and schedules in bankruptcy, and amendments thereto, are hereby adopted by the referees for the counties of Cook, Lake and McHenry in said district:

1. Petitions in voluntary cases and schedules in all cases must be in the printed form prescribed by the United States Supreme Court and the information therein required, must be set out in full under the appropriate headings, without erasure or interlineation. In Schedule A., the data called for by each heading must be placed in the column directly below such heading and must be confined within the vertical lines enclosing that column. The columns must be so ruled as to provide a reasonable space for inserting the appropriate matter, and in order to comply with this rule as to Schedules A. and B. (1) it will be necessary to use forms with the printed matter running lengthwise of the legal

cap page so that the requisite space may be afforded.

2. The Post Office address of the bankrupt, as well as that of his lawyer, if any, shall be endorsed on the wrapper of the petition.

3. The address of each creditor must contain the Street number, City, and State, when known. When unknown, that fact shall be stated.

4. The use of ditto marks is forbidden by Supreme Court general order V. (In re Orne, Fed. Cas. 10582.)

5. Claims for exemption must be itemized with amount of the bankrupt's valuation against each item, and the total stated. The appropriate allegation must be made if the bankrupt claims the exemption as the head of a family.

6. Oaths to the petition and schedules must not be administered by the attorney of the affiant.

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APPELLATE COURT RULES

FIRST DISTRICT OF ILLINOIS

Adopted November 22, A. D. 1911. Amended December 28, A. D. 1911

Rule 1.—Records of Trial Courts—How Prepared.

The authenticated copy of the record of the judgment, order or decree of the trial court, to be filed in this court on appeal or error, or in return to a writ of error or *certiorari*, shall, except as otherwise provided by law, contain, in chronological order, without grouping, copies of the process and service; the pleadings; the verdict in jury trials; the judgment or decree of the court; all orders in the cause; the bill of exceptions, or, in chancery cases, all depositions, the master's report and certificate of evidence, if any; the appeal bond, in cases of appeal. But in civil cases a party or his attorney shall, as by law provided, by *praecepe*, direct what parts of the record of the cause shall be included in the transcript and in such case, as by law provided, if the transcript shall be insufficient to fully and fairly present the questions involved, the requisite portion shall be supplied at his cost, and if unnecessarily voluminous, he shall pay the cost of unnecessary matter. In no case shall the clerk insert in any transcript any matter not a part of the record, and the clerk of this court shall not tax as costs any matter so inserted contrary to rule.

Rule 2.—Supersedeas—Manner of Applying for—Bond.

If a *supersedeas* shall be applied for, the transcript of the record on which the application is made must be complete; and so certified by the clerk of the court below; or, there shall be attached to the transcript a certificate of the judge who heard the cause below, that the transcript contains all of the record necessary to a full and fair presentation of the errors complained of.

An assignment of errors must be written on or appended to the record when filed.

If a *supersedeas* shall be granted, the requisite bond must be entered into and filed in the office of the clerk of this court according to law, except in those cases of the fourth and fifth classes from the Municipal Court of Chicago, in which no further bond is required. And on every application for a *supersedeas* three copies of an abstract of the record, with three copies of a brief containing the points and authorities relied upon, and pointing specifically to those portions of the record upon which the alleged errors arose, shall be presented, with the record, to the court or judge to whom the application is made. Every such application in which a bond is required must be accompanied by a proper affidavit of the surety or sureties, showing the sufficiency of the proffered bail or bond.

Rule 3.—Bond by Attorney.

Whenever a bond is executed by an attorney in fact, the clerk shall require the original power of attorney to be filed in his office, unless it shall appear that the power of attorney contains other powers than the mere power to execute the bond in question, in which case the original power of attorney shall be presented to the clerk, and a true copy thereof filed, certified by the clerk to be a true copy of the original.

Rule 4.—Form of Writ When a Supersedeas.

When a writ of error shall be made a *supersedeas* the clerk shall indorse upon said writ the following words: "This writ of error is made a *supersedeas*, and is to be obeyed accordingly," and he shall thereupon file the writ of error with a transcript of the record, in his office. Said transcript shall be taken and considered as a due return to said writ, and thereupon it shall be the duty of the clerk to issue a certificate, in substance as follows, to-wit:

I do hereby certify that a writ of error has been issued from this court for the reversal of a judgment obtained by _____ v. _____ in the _____ court of _____, at the _____ term, A. D. 19____, in a certain action of _____, which writ of error is made a *supersedeas*, and is to operate as a suspension of the execution of the judgment, and as such is to be obeyed by all concerned.

Given under my hand and the seal of the Appellate Court of the First District, at _____, this _____ day of _____, A. D. 19____.

_____, Clerk.

Rule 5.—To Whom Directed.

Writs of error shall be directed to the clerk or keeper of the record of the court in which the judgment or decree complained of is entered; but where the plaintiff in error shall file in the office of the clerk of this court a transcript of the record, duly certified according to law, before a writ of error issues, it shall not be necessary to send such a writ to the clerk of the inferior court, (except in cases of the fourth and fifth class from the Municipal Court of Chicago), but such transcript shall be taken and considered as a due return to said writ, except as aforesaid.

Rule 6.—Process on Writs of Error—*Scire Facias*.

The process on writs of error (except in cases of the fourth and fifth class from the Municipal Court of Chicago), shall be a *scire facias* to hear errors, issued on the application of the plaintiff in error to the clerk, directed to the sheriff or other officer of the proper county, commanding him to summon the defendant in error to appear in court and show cause, if any he have, why the judgment or decree mentioned in the writ of error shall not be reversed. If the *scire facias* be returned by the officer, not served, an *alias* or *pluries* may issue without an order of court.

In cases of the fourth and fifth class from the Municipal Court of Chicago the party suing out a writ of error from this court shall not be required to serve upon the opposite party any *scire facias* to hear errors, but in lieu thereof shall within five days after the issuance of the writ of error, file the same with the clerk of said Municipal Court, and make proof to this court of such filing, and said writ of error so filed shall be notice to the opposite party of the suing out and prosecution of such writ of error.

Rules of Appellate Court—First District.

Rule 7.—Return Day—Waiver of Service—Notice by Defendant.

The first day of each term shall be return day, for the return of process; and no party shall be compelled to answer or prepare for hearing, unless the *scire facias* shall have been served ten days before the return day thereof (except as provided in Rule 6); nor shall a defendant be at liberty to enter his appearance and compel the plaintiff to proceed with the cause, unless he shall have given the plaintiff ten days' notice, before the term, of his intention to enter his appearance and have the cause proceed to a hearing, except as aforesaid.

Rule 8.—Scire Facias to Hear Errors—Notice—Continuance.

In all cases in which a writ of error is made a *supersedeas*, the plaintiff in error shall, on filing the record with the clerk, at the same time order and direct a *scire facias* to issue to hear errors (except as provided in Rule 6), and shall use reasonable diligence to have the same served ten days before the first day of the term to which the writ of error is made returnable; on failing to do so, the defendant in error shall have the right to a hearing at the said term, after joining in error, without giving ten days' notice, as required by rule 7.

Provided, if there be not ten days between the allowance of the *supersedeas* and the sitting of the court, the cause shall stand continued until the next term, unless by consent of parties it shall be otherwise ordered.

Rule 9.—Notice to Purchasers and Terre Tenants.

In all cases wherein guardians, executors or administrators, or others acting in a fiduciary capacity, having obtained an order or decree for the sale of lands in causes *ex parte*, and a sale has been had under such decree or order, and the same shall be brought to this court for revision, the purchaser or *terre tenants* of such lands, if known, shall be suggested to the court by affidavit of plaintiff in error, and notice given them of the pendency of the writ of error ten days before the first day of the term of the court to which the writ of error is returnable, so that said *terre tenants* may appear and defend.

Rule 10.—Writ of Error—Parties—Summons—Severance.

In all cases brought to this court by writ of error, wherein the party suing out the writ is one of several parties plaintiff or defendant below, the party suing out said writ shall in his *praeceipe* filed herein join as parties plaintiff in error in this court, his co-plaintiffs or co-defendants below against whom the order, judgment or decree was rendered, and in case said co-plaintiffs in error so joined herein as aforesaid do not join in the prosecution of said writ, the party bringing said cause to this court, as aforesaid, may upon filing the transcript of record herein, order and direct that a summons issue for said parties so joined as plaintiffs in error, commanding them to appear on the return day of said writ and join in the prosecution of said writ of error and the errors assigned, or to assign errors. On failure of said plaintiffs in error so joined as aforesaid to appear and join in the prosecution of said writ of error, after having been served with summons more than ten days prior to the first day of the term to which said summons is returnable, the party suing out said writ of er-

ror, as aforesaid, shall be entitled to an order of severance in said cause and to leave to prosecute said writ of error alone.

Rule 11.—Removing Records.

No record shall be taken from the files of the court, except on application, therefor, to the clerk or his deputy. The clerk shall be held responsible for the safe keeping and production of the records. Application for leave to remove records may be considered at any time, in the discretion of the court.

Rule 12.—Assignments of Error.

The appellant or plaintiff in error shall, in all cases, assign errors at the time of filing his record in this court, and on failing to do so, the case may be dismissed; but other errors may be assigned after the filing of the record, by leave of the court. The appellee or defendant in error shall have the right to assign cross-errors for two days after the expiration of the time within which the record is required by law to be filed in this court, and not afterward, without special leave of the court. The assignment of errors and cross-errors must be written upon or attached to the record.

Rule 13.—Inspection of Original Papers.

Whenever, in the opinion of the presiding judge of any inferior court, an inspection of an original paper in an action on appeal or writ of error shall be important to a correct decision of the case, such judge may make such order for the transmission, safe keeping and return of such original paper as to him may seem proper. And the clerk of this court will receive such original paper in connection with the transcript, and hold the same subject to such order.

Rule 14.—Assignment of Cases—Designation of Courts.

For the purpose of the assignment of cases, the Appellate Court, created by an act entitled "An Act to establish appellate courts," approved June 2, 1877; in force July 1, 1877, shall be known and designated as the "A" Appellate Court. The first branch Appellate Court created by an act entitled "An Act to Amend an Act entitled 'An Act to Establish appellate courts,' approved June 2, 1877, and providing for the creation of branch appellate courts," approved and in force June 2, 1897, shall be known and designated as the "B" Branch Appellate Court; and the second Branch Appellate Court created by an act entitled "An Act providing for the Creation of Additional Branch Appellate Courts," approved June 6, 1911, in force July 1, 1911, shall be known as the "C" Branch Appellate Court; and the third Branch Appellate Court, created by an act entitled "An Act providing for the Creation of Additional Branch Appellate Courts," approved June 6, 1911, in force July 1, 1911, shall be known as the "D" Branch Appellate Court; and the clerk of this court will so indicate upon the clerk's docket the assignment of each case when made, in the manner aforesaid.

All motions, etc., must be made before the court to which the cause stands assigned, and in the absence of any assignment, must be made before the "A" Appellate Court.

Rule 15.—Motion Days—Orders of Course.

The Appellate Court will convene Mondays; the "B" Branch Appellate Court Tuesdays; the "C" Branch Appellate

Rules of Appellate Court—First District.

Court Wednesdays, and the "D" Branch Appellate Court on Thursdays at ten o'clock A. M., and motions may be made at the opening of court each day immediately after the decisions of the court are announced; but at no other time unless in case of necessity, or in relation to a cause when called in course. Motions will be entered by the clerk with orders made therein, in such manner that a perfect record may be kept of each step in the cause.

Rule 16.—Motions—Objections—Notice.

All motions shall be in writing, and when based on matters which do not appear of record shall be supported by affidavit. They shall be filed with the clerk, together with the reasons and affidavits, if any, in support thereof, at least one day before they shall be submitted to the court, and at least one day before the cause stands for trial, except as above provided. Objections to motions must also be in writing, and filed not later than the next day after the motion is made, and replies to objections to motions will not be allowed, and oral arguments will not be heard: *Provided, however,* that a copy of the motion and of the reasons and showing in support of the same, shall be served on counsel of the opposite party at least one day before they shall be submitted to the court. On all motions to dismiss appeals or writs of error, or for *supersedeas*, or to continue in force injunctions, three copies of the reasons or affidavits in support thereof shall be filed with the motion, and three copies of the objections to said motion shall also be filed within the time as above provided.

Rule 17.—Bond for Costs.

Upon filing an affidavit that any plaintiff in error is not a resident of this state, and that no bond for costs has been filed, a rule will be entered against him, to show cause why the writ shall not be dismissed.

Rule 18.—Time to Plead.

In all cases in this court where the defendant in error or appellee desires to plead and not join in error, he shall file his plea in the office of the clerk at least five days before his brief would be due under Rule 24 had he joined in error, and the issue thereon must be made up within said five days or such further time as may be allowed by the court.

Rule 19.—Abstracts—Number of Copies—Index.

In all cases, a party bringing a cause into this court shall furnish a complete abstract or abridgement of the record, therein referring to the appropriate pages of the record by numerals on the margin, and shall cause such abstract to be printed in a neat and workmanlike manner, with small pica type, and leaded lines, and it shall be sufficient to cause such abstract to be printed on both sides of the paper, with the same measure and margins as the volumes of the Appellate Court Reports, and folded and bound in pamphlet form.

The abstract shall contain a complete index, alphabetically arranged, giving the page where each paper or exhibit may be found, with the names of the witnesses and the pages of the direct, cross and re-direct examination.

The abstract must be sufficient to fully present every error and exception relied upon, and it will be taken to be accurate and sufficient for a full understanding of the questions presented for decision unless the opposite party shall file a further ab-

stract, making necessary corrections or additions.

Six copies of said printed abstracts shall be filed in each case; one for each of the justices, one for the appellee or defendant in error, one for the court reporter and one to remain on file with the record.

Rule 20.—Additional Abstracts by Defendants.

The counsel for appellee or defendant in error shall be permitted, if he is not satisfied with the abstract or abridgement furnished by the counsel of the opposite party, to file such further abstracts as he shall deem necessary to a full understanding of the merits of the cause.

Rule 21.—Briefs—Number of Copies.

Printed briefs will be required in all cases, whether argued orally, in full or in part only, or when submitted on briefs without oral argument. The briefs should contain a short, clear statement of the points, and the authorities in support thereof; and in citing cases from published reports, counsel will be required not only to give the book and page, but also the names of the parties as they appear in the title of the reported case; and the names of counsel filing brief or abstract must appear to the same. But the filing of a printed brief shall not preclude the party from filing full printed arguments in support of his brief of points and authorities, provided he does so within the time his printed brief is required to be filed.

Six copies of the briefs must be filed in each case; one for each of the justices, one for the opposite party, one for the court reporter and one to be filed with the record.

Rule 22.—Docketing and Hearing of Causes.

Criminal causes shall be placed at the head of the docket; all other cases shall be docketed and called for hearing in the order in which the same shall have been filed with the clerk; provided, however, that causes which in the judgment of the court involve important public interests, may be advanced on the docket.

Rule 23.—Call of Docket—Expiration of Rules.

The docket shall be called numerically, and the causes shall be taken under advisement, continued, or otherwise disposed of, as they are called.

Not more than forty cases shall be called on any one day. Stipulations of parties or their attorneys changing the order in which cases are to be called, will not be recognized. All unexpired rules will terminate upon the call of the cause for hearing; *provided*, that if the court shall give time to either party, without the consent of the other, the cause shall not lose its precedence on the docket.

Rule 24.—Time for Filing Abstracts and Briefs.

In all cases not being appeals from interlocutory orders, up to and including No. 80 on the term docket, the appellant or plaintiff in error shall file with the clerk his abstract and brief on or before the third Monday of term and

In all cases from 81 to 100, inclusive, on or before the 4th Monday of the term.

In all cases from 101 to 120, inclusive, on or before the 5th Monday of the term.

In all cases from 121 to 140, inclusive, on or before the 6th Monday of the term.

In all cases from 141 to 180, inclusive, on or before the 7th Monday of the term.

Rules of Appellate Court—First District.

In all cases from 181 to 220, inclusive, on or before the 8th Monday of the term.

In all cases from 221 to 260, inclusive, on or before the 9th Monday of the term.

In all cases from 261 to 300, inclusive, on or before the 10th Monday of the term.

In all cases from 301 to 340, inclusive on or before the 11th Monday of the term.

In all other cases on or before the 12th Monday of the term.

In case of the failure of the plaintiff in error or appellant to file both his abstract and brief within the time above limited, the appeal or writ of error will be dismissed on motion and notice before, or without notice on the call of the docket, unless the delay is excused upon circumstances to be shown. In all cases, the appellee or defendant in error shall file his brief within not exceeding thirty days after the expiration of the time limited in this rule for the filing of briefs by the appellant or plaintiff in error, or within thirty days after any extension thereof.

Reply Briefs.

Reply briefs must be filed before the case is called, unless otherwise specially ordered.

Interlocutory Appeals.

On all appeals from interlocutory orders granting injunctions or appointing receivers, the appellants shall file abstracts and briefs, as required on other appeals, within seven days after filing the record in this court. And the appellees shall file briefs within the next five days after notice that the appellants' briefs and abstracts are filed. Then the cases will be taken under advisement on briefs filed, or on motion of either party set for oral argument at such time as the court may fix.

Provided, however, that it shall be the duty of the appellant from such interlocutory order to give the opposite party or his solicitor notice of the time of filing the record and appellant's abstracts and briefs in said appeal, on or before the day of filing the same. And on failure so to do, the appellee shall have such further time to file briefs as the court may direct.

Rule 25.—Oral Arguments.

Oral arguments will not be heard on the calling of a cause upon the regular call of the docket, but causes will be placed on the oral argument calendar on motion of either party when reached on the call. Printed arguments on behalf of either party, in addition to the brief, will not be received unless the same shall have been filed within the time prescribed by these rules for the filing of printed briefs by such party.

Rule 26.—Time for Argument.

The time allowed for each oral argument upon the hearing of a cause shall be restricted to one hour, except the closing argument, which shall be restricted to thirty minutes, unless otherwise specially permitted. Oral arguments will not be heard upon any motion, unless specially directed by the court. If the appellant or plaintiff in error makes no opening argument, the appellee or defendant in error will be allowed but fifteen minutes, and the appellant or plaintiff in error shall be allowed fifteen minutes in which to reply.

Rule 27.—Damages on Dismissing Appeals.

When appeals from decrees, judgments or orders for the recovery of money are dismissed by this court for want of prosecution, or for failing to file authenticated copies of records, as required by law, the

court will award damages against the appellant upon the amount recovered in the court below, not exceeding ten per cent. on the first \$100, and five per cent. on any excess.

If the judgment order or decree appealed from is not for the recovery of money, the court will enter judgment for not less than fifty (50) dollars, nor more than two hundred and fifty (250) dollars damages.

Rule 28.—Rehearing—Time and Manner of Application.

Application for a rehearing of any cause shall be made by petition to the court, signed by counsel, stating the grounds for a rehearing, and the authorities relied on in support thereof. Within ten days after a decision is entered of record, the party desiring a rehearing shall give notice in writing to the opposite party or his attorney, of his intention to make such application, and shall, within said ten days, file with the clerk of this court a copy of such notice, with proof of the due service thereof, and within said ten days he shall also file with the clerk six printed copies of the petition for a rehearing. If a rehearing be granted, the case will be reconsidered upon the record, abstracts, original briefs, petition, and any answer thereto, of which six printed copies shall have been filed with the clerk of the court within ten days after the order granting a rehearing is entered of record.

Rule 29.—Rehearing—Stay of Proceedings.

Whenever a petition for a rehearing shall be presented to either of the justices of this court in vacation, if he shall certify that there are probable grounds for granting a rehearing, all further proceedings authorized by the judgment of this court shall be stayed until the next term of the court.

Rule 30.—Taxing Printer's Fees for Abstracts—Additional Abstracts.

Upon printed abstracts being furnished in conformity with the rules of this court, it shall be the duty of the clerk to tax a printer's fee at the rate of twenty cents for each one hundred words of one copy of such abstracts against the unsuccessful party not furnishing the same, as costs, to be recovered by the successful party furnishing such abstract. Appellees or defendants in error who shall file additional abstracts under the rules of this court shall, if successful in the cause, be entitled to have taxed like fees for such additional abstracts on motion, if the court shall be of the opinion that such additional abstracts were necessary.

Rule 31.—Extending Time for Filing Abstracts and Briefs.

No extension of time in which to file abstracts or briefs will be granted, except upon at least one day's notice to the opposite party, or upon a stipulation and consideration by the court of circumstances shown by affidavit, of which a copy has been served with the notice.

Rule 32.—Appellate Court Library.

The books of the law library of this court shall not be marked or underlined with pen or pencil; nor shall the pages of the same be folded down; and no books shall be taken from the conference room without the consent of the court being first obtained for that purpose. Any violation of this rule will be considered as a contempt of court, and the person offending be fined therefore at the discretion of the court.

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RULES OF THE Circuit Court of Cook County

In Effect March 21, 1910.

GENERAL RULES.

Hour of Opening Court.

Rule 1. Ten o'clock in the forenoon shall be the hour for opening court, except that on Saturdays court shall convene at 9:30 a. m. and shall adjourn at 12 o'clock noon.

Numbering of Causes.

Rule 2. Suits brought in this Court are at once given two numbers, the general number and the term number. The first is the proper number of the suit in its order and is never changed, and in this numbering no distinction is made between suits at law and in chancery.

Suits brought during the year are numbered in the series of term numbers to which they belong.

In calling the attention of the Court to any pending suit the term number must be used. When a cause is finally disposed of, the files are arranged in the vault according to the general numbers.

The Clerk will at the close of each day's business distribute in rotation among the Judges who have common law calendars the common law causes begun on such day, and at the same time, and in the same manner distribute among the Judges who have chancery calendars the chancery causes begun on such day, and will place upon the wrapper of each case the name of the Judge to whom the same is assigned. All pleadings will be settled and orders entered in a cause by the Judge to whom the same is assigned, but in the absence of such Judge, any other Judge may take default or enter orders in causes assigned to such absent Judge.

Provided, that the Chief Justice, upon such notice and such showing as he may deem sufficient, may direct the clerk to withhold any case from its proper distribution in rotation, as provided in said rule, and may assign any case, either at the time the suit is begun or at any stage thereafter (provided the Judge on whose calendar such case is pending shall not object), to any judge to promptly take for hearing and disposition any such cause.

Clerk's Registers.

Rule 3. The Clerk shall keep law and chancery registers in which shall be noted respectively:

1. The numbers and titles of all causes, petitions or proceedings begun in this Court.

2. The names of the respective attorneys or solicitors therein.

3. The date and time of day of filing each paper filed in such cause, describing the same as briefly as may be necessary for identification.

4. The date when any paper shall be taken from the files and to whom delivered.

Filing and Removal of Papers.

Rule 4. Copies of all pleadings and all exhibits accompanying the same must be filed with the Clerk at the time the originals are filed, and unless such copies are furnished at that time the Clerk will refuse to file the originals.

The files in pending causes shall be kept in the law and chancery file-rooms.

No paper filed shall be delivered to any person other than an attorney, solicitor or counsel in the case, or his clerk, known to be such; nor shall the entire files or any bond, writ or other process be delivered to any other person than a bailiff or deputy Clerk of this Court.

Copies of pleadings and papers may be withdrawn to be returned within three days upon leaving receipt for the same.

The Clerk of the Court will not permit the originals of pleadings and papers in any case to be withdrawn without an order of Court.

On good cause shown, any Judge of this Court may, on application, permit the original files to be withdrawn.

Any person withdrawing without leave of Court any paper filed with the Clerk in any case will be deemed in contempt of Court.

Calls of Calendars—Notice.

Rule 5. Parties shall take notice of all calls of the calendars.

First Calls.

Rule 6. On the calls of the trial calendars of all causes there will from time to time be first calls of not exceeding two hundred causes, for the purpose of ascertaining what causes are ready for trial, on which calls causes will be marked for trial, continued or stricken from the docket.

No cause stricken from the docket will be reinstated except on written notice to each attorney or solicitor of record and each party whose appearance has been entered without an attorney or solicitor and each infant and insane person served with process personally for whom no guardian ad litem has been appointed before the cause was stricken from the docket.

Rules of the Circuit Court of Cook County.

Trial Calls.

Rule 7. Causes are called for trial in their order upon the calendars. The call for each day is announced before the adjournment on the preceding day. There will be no call of the jury trial calendars on Saturday.

Printed trial calendars will be made up for the September term each year, including all pending causes; and new calendars from time to time thereafter as may be necessary. Notice of the preparation of new calendars will be given in the Law Bulletin ten days or more before the first day of the term for which such calendars are prepared.

Certificates of Good Moral Character.

Rule 8. All applications for certificates of good moral character shall be filed in the office of the Clerk of this Court, together with the recommendations in writing of two or more sponsors at least ten days before being presented to the Court on motion.

Costs—Appearances.

Rule 9. When there are several defendants, if a single appearance is filed for all, but one appearance fee of three dollars (\$3) is required to be paid, but if several appearances are filed for different parties, either by different attorneys or solicitors, or by the same attorneys or solicitors at different times, an appearance fee must be paid for each appearance.

When the appearance fee has been paid no costs are required upon filing a cross-bill.

Costs—Upon Setting Aside Defaults and Overruling Demurrers.

Rule 10. Whenever a default is set aside or a demurrer is overruled or sustained, and leave to plead or leave to amend is prayed for, the Court may, in granting such motion, impose as terms costs not less than \$5 nor more than \$10, to be paid by the losing to the successful party on the motion, or his or their attorney or solicitor.

Costs—Suits in Forma Pauperis.

Rule 11. Before a person may be permitted to begin and prosecute a suit as a poor person he shall make an affidavit stating that he has a meritorious cause of action; that he is unable to pay the costs and that he will not settle or compromise the claim or release the defendant until all accrued costs are paid. The attorney or solicitor of such person shall also state in writing, that he has investigated the facts and that he believes the party has a meritorious cause of action, and, further, that he will not accept any compensation from the plaintiff nor from any person in his behalf until all costs are first paid. After appearance by defendant, it shall be the duty of his attorney or solicitor of record, as an officer of the Court, to see to it that in the event of settlement or compromise of the suit, all costs accrued shall be paid out of the proceeds of any such settlement or compromise; provided, that, in case the Judge to whom such application is presented

shall refuse to grant leave, he shall so endorse the affidavit.

All applications for leave to begin suit as a poor person shall be made in person, unless the applicant be physically incapacitated from appearing in open Court, in which event an affidavit must be presented to the Court, showing the fact of the incapacity and such other facts as will entitle the applicant to begin suit as a poor person.

Demurrers.

Rule 12. No demurrer shall be allowed to be filed to any pleading unless upon a certificate of counsel that in his opinion it is well founded in point of law, and unless supported by the affidavit of the party, or by his agent duly authorized, or attorney or solicitor, that it is not interposed for delay.

Depositions—Opening of.

Rule 13. The following order shall be entered on the first day of each term:

"Ordered, That leave be, and is hereby given the Clerk of this Court to open and file all depositions returned and to be returned during the present term of this Court."

Motions.

Rule 14. Motions of course are heard and disposed of in order on the opening of Court and before the call of the docket by the Judge on whose trial calendar the cause has been placed or to whom said cause has been assigned. A memorandum of all such motions, stating the term number, the title of the cause, the nature of the motion briefly, together with his own name, and, except in default cases, or where no appearance has been entered, the name of the opposing attorney or solicitor, shall be placed upon the motion book provided by the Clerk by the attorney or solicitor for the moving party before the opening of Court. Neither attorneys nor solicitors will rise to address the Court upon a motion until it has been called in its regular order from the motion book by the Clerk. All motions not of course shall be made in writing, and when founded on matters of fact not otherwise appearing by the pleadings, or other proceedings in the cause, such facts must be presented by affidavit, which shall be filed, with the motion with the Minute Clerk of the Judge before whom the motion is to be made, and a copy thereof served with notice of the motion. Counter affidavits may ordinarily be filed in opposition to such motion; but counter or supplementary affidavits will not be allowed on applications for continuances, or in applications for security for costs, or for sureties on appeal bonds to justify or to set aside defaults.

Notice of Motions—When Required.

Rule 15. No motion will be heard or order made in any cause without notice to the opposite party, when an appearance of such party has been entered, except where a party is in default or when a cause is reached on the call of the trial calendar.

Rules of the Circuit Court of Cook County

Notice of Motions—How Given.

Rule 16. Notice to the opposite party must be in writing, state the motion, designate the Judge before whom the same is to be made, and the time and place of hearing, and be served by delivering a copy to such party or his attorney or solicitor of record before 4 p. m. of the business day next preceding the day mentioned in the notice for calling up, either personally or by leaving a copy thereof at his office with some person in charge thereof on his behalf, and be supported by affidavit whenever based on matters of fact not appearing of record or by the files in the case, but all notices served on Saturday shall be served before 12 o'clock noon of that day.

Passing and Continuing Suits.

Rule 17. When the principal attorney or solicitor of record, or the attorney or solicitor specially charged with the trial of the case of a party, is ill or actually engaged in the trial of a cause in some other Court at the time the cause is called for trial, and the other party is ready, the Court will pass the cause for the time without prejudice, where it appears by affidavit or otherwise that the party seeking the delay has used due diligence to be ready for trial, and would have been ready but for the illness or engagement of his attorney. Provided, That a sound discretion will be exercised by the Court in the enforcement of this rule in extreme cases, in favor of plaintiffs in attachments and suits on demands which would be barred by the statute of limitations if dismissed; and also in all cases where any substantial injury might result.

No suit will be passed for the second time for either of the causes above mentioned, and any suit so passed shall be in order to be called for trial upon notice at any time after the cause for which the same was passed shall cease.

No cause passed by stipulation of the parties shall be, on account of any such engagement or otherwise, called for trial until there has been an opportunity given for trial of all succeeding suits set for trial on the last preceding preliminary call.

If no such notice shall be given during the term or terms the trial calendar shall be called, the suit shall be placed by the Clerk, without further order, on the next trial calendar.

Service of Rules.

Rule 18. The service of rules or orders made by the Court, or by the Judges during summer recess, shall be by delivering a certified copy. When neither the party nor his attorney or solicitor resides in or has an office in the City of Chicago, all notices may be served by mail, and when either party has appeared by attorney or solicitor, service of any rule, order or notice made on such attorney or solicitor shall be deemed sufficient, unless where the object is to bring a party into contempt for disobeying any rule or order, in which case the service shall be upon the party personally, or by registered letter.

In General.

Rule 19. All matters pertaining to the administration of the Circuit Court, not herein otherwise provided for, shall be under the direction of the Chief Justice. He shall determine the necessity for, and designate from time to time such outside Judges as shall be required to assist in the work of the Circuit Court of Cook County, and such Judges shall discharge their duties under his direction. He shall also have general supervision and direction of the clerk's office, to the end that the provisions of law and the rules of the court can be conformed to.

COMMON LAW RULES.**Affidavit for Capias.**

Rule 1. When an affidavit for a capias or petition for habeas corpus is presented to a Judge he shall indorse thereon a minute of the order refusing or granting the writ.

Default.

Rule 2. In all suits at law made returnable to any term of the Court where process has been duly served and declaration filed ten days before the first day of the term, the defendant shall plead or demur before the opening of Court on the morning of the third day, and the plaintiff shall be entitled to judgment by default in all suits where the plea or demurrer is not so filed, unless the party has obtained an extension of the rule so to plead or demur. Any defendant entering his appearance without service will be required to plead or demur to the declaration at such time as he would be so required if he had been served with process on the day of the entry of his appearance.

Setting Aside Default.

Rule 3. When either party neglects to file the proper pleadings, within the time fixed by law or the rule of the Court, such party shall be in default and may be proceeded against accordingly. Defaults will not be set aside except upon affidavit of the party, agent or attorney filed, setting forth a meritorious cause of action or defense, in which case the default may be set aside on such terms as the Court may deem just, and the pleading, for want of which such default existed, shall be filed forthwith, unless the Court shall otherwise direct.

Appeal Suits.

Rule 4. No orders will be entered in an appeal suit from a Justice of the Peace if a transcript has not been filed ten days before the term at which the application is made.

Rule 5. The appellee in any appeal suit from a Justice of the Peace, which has been perfected ten days before the commencement of any trial term, may enter his appearance in writing and have the same filed among the papers in the suit, and if such appearance is so entered ten days before the commencement of the term, the suit shall stand for trial in its order.

Rule 6. In appeals from judgments of Justices of the Peace to this Court

appellant or appellants shall file with the Clerk a transcript of the proceedings before the Justice of the Peace within ten days after filing the appeal bond.

Rule 7. Appeal suits, when reached on calendar, will be disposed of either by trial, continuance, dismissal of case or appeal, or by striking the same from the docket, and in case the same are stricken from the docket, they will not be again placed on any trial calendar unless all parties not in default are notified, transcripts and paper filed, and the suits ready in every respect for trial.

Rule 8. The Clerk shall place all appeal cases upon a separate calendar, which shall be assigned by the Chief Justice to one or more of the Judges for trial.

Contested Motions.

Rule 9. Motions not of course or contested motions will be heard on each Saturday of the term, after disposition of motions for new trial on that day, one day's notice in writing having been previously given. The Clerk will from time to time prepare a calendar of contested motions upon which such motions will be placed in the order in which notice thereof is given to him. A peremptory call of such motions will be made when ordered by the Court, of which three days' notice will be given in the Law Bulletin.

Motions for Rules on Sureties in Appeal Bonds to Justify.

Rule 10. Motions may be made to require a surety on an appeal bond to justify, after the bond has been approved and the appeal perfected. They must be supported by affidavit showing that affiant has made inquiry as to the responsibility of such surety and the nature of such inquiry, and, if the surety has scheduled any real estate, as to the title and value of such real estate, and that from such inquiry affiant believes that such surety is irresponsible, and stating the facts tending to show that such belief is well founded. If such affidavit is deemed sufficient, a rule will be entered requiring the surety to justify or the appellant to give a new bond by a certain day; and in default, that the appeal be dismissed. The same motions in like manner may be made in all cases of bonds given ex parte in any proceeding.

The Clerk shall spread of record, on a book or books kept for that purpose, bonds filed in any cause in this Court.

Short Cause Calendar.

Rule 11. Monday of each week is set apart and assigned as the day for the trial of actions upon the "Short Cause Calendar." No suit shall be noticed for trial on such calendar until the same is at issue. All notices to place a suit on such calendar must be filed with the Clerk within two days after service of the same, and not later than on Thursday eleven days before the Monday on which the case is set for trial. Suits placed upon this calendar shall be assigned for trial in the order in which said notices are filed with the Clerk, in the same manner as other common law suits, and all suits not reached for trial on the Mon-

day designated shall stand continued until the following Monday. A suit upon the "Short Cause Calendar" may be passed or continued for good cause shown, the same as other suits, and if so passed or continued it shall lose its place upon such calendar, but may be again placed thereon by either party giving ten days' notice.

Instructions.

Rule 12. All instructions or propositions of law must be presented to the Court at the conclusion of the taking of the evidence.

Motions for New Trial.

Rule 13. Motions for new trial must be filed in writing, and such motions will be heard on Saturday of the week following the week in which the verdict is rendered, unless the Judge presiding at the trial shall otherwise direct, and it shall be the duty of the Clerk to make up each Saturday a calendar of such motions for new trial, in the order in which the suits were tried, placing thereon without notice, all pending motions. This calendar will be called and motions disposed of without notice, and in case the hearing of any motion is continued it will be placed at the foot of the next new trial motion calendar, unless the Court shall otherwise order.

New Trial.

Rule 14. Whenever a jury shall report its inability to agree upon a verdict in any case the trial judge shall direct a new trial to proceed forthwith, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

Opening Statement.

Rule 15. As soon as the jury has been selected and sworn to try the issues in any case, the court shall call upon the counsel for the plaintiff to make the opening statement to the jury, and immediately thereafter, the court shall call upon the counsel for the defendant to make an opening statement in behalf of the defendant, unless counsel for the defendant elects to waive the making of his opening statement.

Instructions.

Rule 16. Each party shall upon the conclusion of every case tried by jury, and before the beginning of the arguments, submit to the trial judge the instructions which he intends to ask the court to give to the jury, and shall at the same time deliver a copy thereof to counsel for the opposite party.

Thereupon the judge shall give each party an opportunity, out of the presence of the jury and before the beginning of the arguments, to state his objections to the instructions requested by the other party and to reply to the objections of the opposite party to the instructions requested by him.

If the judge modifies the instructions requested by the parties he shall give counsel an opportunity before the same are read to the jury to state his objections to the instructions as modified.

Counsel will be expected as officers of the court, in good faith, to assist the judge in settling the instructions

before the beginning of the arguments to the jury, so that the jury may be correctly charged as to the law of the case, and inadvertent and preventable error may not enter into the record to the manifest prejudice of the cause of justice.

The trial judge will, as far as practicable, arrange the order of the instructions which he intends to give, so as to present the law of the case to the jury in the form of a connected charge. If the judge shall elect to give of his own motion any additional instructions for the purpose of more fully presenting to the jury the law of the case as applicable to the issues of fact, such additional instructions shall also be submitted to counsel as above provided, in regard to modifications of requested instructions.

CHANCERY RULES.**Appearance of Parties.**

1. When any defendant who shall be summoned, served with a copy of the bill or petition, or notified of the beginning of the suit as required by law, shall enter and file an appearance in writing before default taken, the party entering such appearance shall thereby, without any order, have twenty days from the first day of the appearance term within which to except, plead, answer or demur. By appearance term is meant the term at which the party might be defaulted for failure to appear.

When any defendant, who has not been summoned, etc., as required by law, shall enter an appearance, he shall give the complainant's solicitor immediate written notice of the fact, and shall except, plead, answer or demur within twenty days after the first day of the term next succeeding that in which his appearance has been entered.

Defaults.

2. On and after the third day of each term defaults may be entered as to such defendants as have been served in due time, and have filed no appearance in writing.

What May be Considered as Motions of Course.

3. Motions for default, default decrees, for appointment of commissioners in partition; for confirmation of reports of commissioners and of Masters where no exceptions are filed, motions for rules to plead, answer or demur; concerning amendments of pleadings or for leave to file any pleading or paper; to set aside defaults, for new bonds; that sureties justify; concerning re-exeats; for ex parte injunction orders; touching the custody of children; motions for reference to a Master and for contempts of Court may, among others, be considered motions of course.

Calling and Hearing of Motions.

4. If no one appears for or against a motion when called, it will be stricken from the "contested motion

calendar" or the "motion book" upon which it may be pending.

Motions, whether "contested" or "of course," if not supported by the moving solicitor when called, will be overruled, as, of course, on the suggestion of opposing solicitor, who, in response to notice thereof is in attendance, and no renewal thereof will be permitted except for cause shown, upon service of notice of motion therefor with copy of affidavit, etc., upon the opposite solicitor and upon reasonable terms in the discretion of the Court, or upon consent thereto in writing of the opposing solicitor.

In all cases where a motion is made before default day and there is no appearance of defendant by solicitor, the defendant shall be personally served with at least one day's notice thereof, and with copies as hereinbefore directed, if practicable, and not otherwise determined by the Court because of the emergency thereof; all motions except in default cases shall be reduced to writing and filed in the cause before action of the Court is moved thereon.

Contested Motions.

Contested motions shall be deemed to include all motions pertaining to the settling of pleadings; for alimony and solicitor's fees; for injunctions upon notice; to dissolve injunctions; for the appointment or removal of receivers; the hearing of exceptions to Masters or receiver's reports, and all other opposed motions the hearing of which will operate unduly to delay the Court in its other duties.

A calendar of such motions will be made up on Friday of each week for hearing on the following Monday, in the order of filing notices thereof, with the Minute Clerk, and will be posted in the Court room. The Court may, in its discretion, continue the call of said calendar from day to day, or upon a particular day to be specified without notice except as may be announced during the call thereof, and may, whenever, in its opinion, the exigency of the case requires it, hear particular motions at any time.

Motions passed under the rule relating to the engagement or other disability of a solicitor shall be placed at the head of the next succeeding calendar in the relative order they occupied on the pending calendar.

Motions continued by order or consent, will be placed in their relative order at the foot of the next calendar unless otherwise ordered.

To entitle a motion to be placed and heard on the contested motion calendar, notice thereof, together with a copy of all affidavits and other pertinent and competent papers relied upon and to be read in support thereof, except the records, files, pleadings, depositions, reports of Masters and Receivers, and other proceedings in the cause, or in other causes, must be served on the solicitor of the opposing party before four o'clock in the afternoon of the preceding Thursday, and a copy of all counter-affidavits, etc. (with the like exceptions), must be served on the solicitor of the moving party before twelve o'clock noon of Saturday succeeding. Said notice with proof, or acceptance, of service there-

of, must be delivered to the Minute Clerk before two o'clock p. m. of the Friday before the Monday on which the motion is to be heard.

To entitle records or other proceedings in the same cause or in other causes than the one in which the motion is made, to be read either in support of or in opposition to a motion of any kind, brief designation thereof shall be made by notice to the solicitor of the opposite party within the times mentioned for the service of affidavits.

Affidavits and matters of record, strictly in rebuttal, may be read without notice, or the service of a copy thereof.

Motions in cases where the emergency thereof will not admit of the delay incident to the contested motion calendar, may be taken up and heard at any time, upon such notice as the Court may, in its discretion, direct, or without notice, if the Court shall so determine.

Except by permission of the Court, but one solicitor on each side shall be heard on any motion, demurrer, or any interlocutory matter.

Default Divorces and Other Default Suits.

5. All default divorce suits as well as all other default suits, in which notice shall be given the Clerk to place the same upon the default calendar will be heard upon Saturday of each week, unless otherwise determined by the Judge before whom such cause is pending. No references shall be allowed in default divorce suits, except as to questions of alimony and property, and all testimony must be taken by deposition or in open Court. When taken in open Court it must be taken in shorthand, written out and sworn to be a correct transcript by the stenographer and solicitor in the suit and presented to the Court, and filed before a decree will be entered. No decree of divorce will be granted upon the unsupported testimony of the complainant.

Within ten days after the hearing of any default or uncontested divorce suit, the complainant shall hand to the Minute Clerk a draft of the decree and certificate of evidence; in default whereof, unless for good cause shown the time be extended, the bill shall be dismissed.

Withdrawal of Solicitors.

6. No solicitor will be permitted to withdraw his appearance for any party unless the Court shall be satisfied by affidavit or otherwise, that such party has had reasonable notice of the solicitor's intention to withdraw his appearance in the cause.

Abstract of Pleadings and Evidence.

7. In all cases heard in this Court, except where otherwise determined by the Court, the parties shall prepare an abstract or abridgement of their respective pleadings, and of the evidence when the same shall have been taken by deposition or before a Master in Chancery, and such abstract of the pleadings and evidence shall be read on the hearing in lieu of the original pleadings and depositions.

Decrees, Etc., as to Sale of Real Estate.

8. All decrees and orders of this Court directing the public sale of any real estate or an interest therein, shall provide that such sale shall be made at the rooms of the Chicago Real Estate Board or of the Cook County Real Estate Board in the City of Chicago unless the Court for cause shown shall otherwise order.

Changing Final Decree as to Alimony or Custody of Children.

9. All applications for changing a final order or decree concerning alimony or the custody of children shall be by petition in writing verified by affidavit. Upon the filing thereof a rule on the respondent to plead, answer or demur in ten days after service of the copy thereof on such respondent, may be obtained. Issues joined therein may be heard at such time as the Court may order. The Court may, in its discretion, upon motion, refer the same to a Master, as in other cases.

Bonds.

10. Upon the motion of any party in interest, the bond of any receiver, injunction or other bond may be ordered spread of record in the cause in which it is filed.

Complete Record, Etc.

11. A complete record may be made of all pleadings, files, etc., in any cause upon the motion of any party in interest, upon such terms as to the costs thereof as the Court may order.

Any pleading or file may be ordered spread of record in any cause before final decree, upon such terms and in such manner as the Court may order.

Receivers.

12. Notice of the filing of reports by receivers, and of all orders asked for or by any receivers, and of all orders to be made on such receiver shall be given to each and all the solicitors or firms of solicitors of record in the cause.

Rules Governing Masters in Chancery.

1. Whenever a reference shall be made to a Master in Chancery of this Court, to take testimony and report the same, or to take testimony and report the same with his conclusions thereon to the Court, the Master to whom such reference is made shall, as soon as practicable, fix a day to proceed with the taking of testimony or evidence, on such reference, and on the day so fixed he shall proceed with the taking of such testimony or evidence, and may, in his discretion, fix a day within which the complainant shall close his proofs, which time he may, in his discretion, for good cause shown, extend for such reasonable time as justice may require; and as soon as the complainant has closed his proofs, shall fix a time within which the defendant shall close his proofs, and the complainant his proofs in rebuttal; and in his discretion for good cause may extend the time for such reasonable time as justice may require; and in case the parties shall not close their proofs within the time limited by the Master, he shall proceed to make up his report upon the testimony and evidence that may have been submitted to

him without waiting for further evidence or testimony from the party so failing to close his proofs within the time limited.

2. Whenever such reference is made to a Master in Chancery of this Court, to take testimony and report the same, or to take testimony and report the same with his conclusions thereon to the Court, the Master shall have full power and discretion to pass upon all questions of competency of witnesses, and the propriety and relevancy of all questions or interrogatories put by counsel, and the Master shall note his ruling upon each objection in the minutes of the proceedings before him, and when the Master has ruled that a party or witness shall answer a given interrogatory, it shall be the duty of such witness or party to answer in the same manner as if such witness or party had been so directed by the Court; and in case the Master shall hold that any question is irrelevant or incompetent, the same shall not be answered. If either party shall object to the ruling of the Master upon the admissibility of testimony or evidence, they shall, after the testimony and evidence before the Master is closed, and before he makes his report thereon, bring such objections and exceptions to the Master's ruling upon the testimony before the Court, and if the Court shall sustain the ruling of the Master, he shall immediately proceed to make his report upon the testimony and evidence submitted to him, and if such objections and exceptions to the rulings of the Master shall be sustained, the Master shall proceed to take such further testimony as the Court may direct, and shall disregard, in making up his report, such testimony as the Court may rule to be incompetent or irrelevant.

3. All parties accounting before a Master shall bring in their respective accounts in the form of debtor and creditor, and any of the other parties who shall not be satisfied with the accounts so brought in, shall be at liberty to examine the accounting party viva voce or upon oral or written interrogatories, in the Master's office, as the Master may direct.

4. The Master shall be at liberty to examine any creditor or other person coming in to make a claim before him, either upon written interrogatories or viva voce, or in both modes, as the nature of the case may appear to him to require. The evidence upon such examination shall be taken down by the Master, or by some other person by his order and in his presence, if either party requires it, in order that the same may be used by the Court, if necessary.

5. All affidavits, depositions and documents which have been previously made, read or used in the Court upon any proceeding in any cause or matter may be used before the Master.

6. Every bill or petition upon which an ex parte preliminary injunction, or order for the appointment of a receiver, or for a writ of ne exeat republica is desired, shall be filed with the Clerk of the Court before the same is presented to a Judge for an order or to a Master for a recommendation as to such injunction, receiver or writ of ne exeat. For such purpose the Clerk may deliver such bill or petition to the

solicitor or person filing such bill upon his receipting therefor to such Clerk, but the same must be returned to the custody of such Clerk immediately after such Judge or Master shall have passed upon such application.

No Master shall examine any such bill or petition presented to him until the same shall have been filed as aforesaid and the Master's fee paid to such Master.

The Master shall indorse upon or at the foot of every such bill or petition so presented and examined by him his conclusion or recommendation as to whether the prayer of such bill or petition as to such injunction, receiver, or ne exeat, should be granted.

No Master shall examine or make any recommendation upon any such bill or petition which shall contain the indorsement of any other Master as aforesaid, except upon a special order of the Court to that effect.

7. The attendance of solicitors shall not be compulsory before Masters in Chancery in any matter on Saturday after 12 o'clock noon.

Rules Governing Proceedings Before Examiners of Titles Under the Land Registration Act.

1. All rules of this Court now existing or hereafter entered with relation to the practice and proceeding before Masters in Chancery, on orders of reference, shall apply to and govern all proceedings before Examiners of Titles, in case of proceedings under the Land Registration Act, except so far as the same may be in conflict with the Act concerning Land Titles, or Registration of Titles in which case the Act itself shall govern.

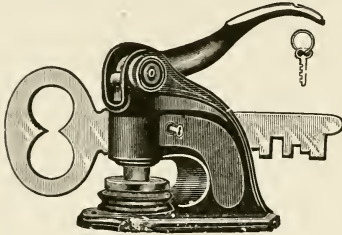
2. All orders to be entered in Land Registration cases shall be drafted and the draft presented to one of the Examiners of Titles, or Registrar of Titles, for approval as to form before being presented to the Court, and motions for the entry of such orders will not be considered unless approved as to form by the Examiner of Titles or by the Registrar of Titles as aforesaid unless proper showing is made why such motions should be heard without such approval.

3. The printed forms prescribed and prepared by the Registrar of Titles, including forms for applications, decrees, orders of reference, etc., shall so far as possible be used by solicitors in proceedings under the Land Registration Act.

4. Appearances of defendants in Land Registration cases shall be filed at or before the return day of the summons, and where such appearances shall be entered in writing before default taken, such defendant shall be entitled to twenty days from the return day of the summons within which to except, plead or answer to the application.

All foregoing rules shall go into effect and be in force from and after the twenty-first day of March, 1910, and on and from that date shall supersede all prior rules adopted by this Court. The rules adopted shall be spread of record in "record en banc," and the Clerk shall order five thousand copies of them printed for the use of the Court.

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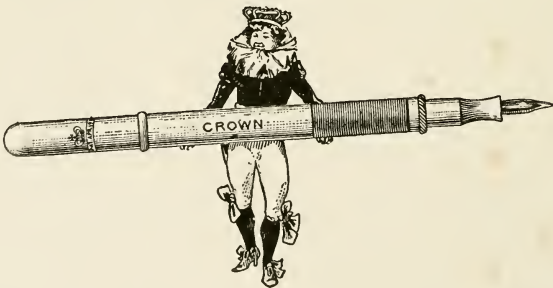
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COMMON LAW RULES

OF THE

SUPERIOR COURT of COOK COUNTY

Numbering of Cases.

Rule 1. Cases brought in this court are at once given two numbers, the general number and the term number. The first is never changed, and in this numbering no distinction is made between cases at law and in chancery.

Cases brought during the year are numbered in the series of term numbers to which they belong.

In calling the attention of the court to any pending case the term number must be used. When a cause is finally disposed of, the files are arranged in the vault according to the general numbers.

Clerk's Register.

Rule 2. The clerk shall keep a register, in which shall be noted:

1. The number and title of all causes, petitions or proceedings commenced in this court.

2. The names of the respective attorneys therein.

3. The date and time of day of filing each paper filed in such cause, describing the same as briefly as may be necessary for identification.

4. The date when any paper shall be taken from the files, to whom delivered and when returned.

Files—Removal of Papers.

Rule 3. Copies of all pleadings must be filed with the clerk at the time originals are filed, and unless such copies are furnished at that time the clerk will refuse to file the originals.

The files in pending causes shall be kept in the law file room.

No paper filed shall be delivered to any person other than an attorney or counsel in the case, or his clerk, known to be such; nor shall the entire files or any bond, writ or other process be delivered to any other person than a bailiff or deputy clerk of this court.

Copies of pleadings and papers may be withdrawn to be returned within three days upon leaving receipt for the same.

The clerk of the court will not permit the originals of pleadings and papers in any case to be withdrawn without an order of the court.

On good cause shown, the motion judge or the trial judge to whom the case is assigned, may, on application, permit the original files to be withdrawn.

Any person withdrawing without leave of court the original of any paper filed with the clerk in any case will be deemed in contempt of court.

Any person withdrawing without leave of court or permission of the clerk, and in either case without leaving with the clerk in charge a receipt signed by an attorney of this court, or a firm of such attorneys, the original or any paper filed with the clerk in any case, will be deemed in contempt of court.

Opening of Depositions.

Rule 4. The following order shall be entered on the first day of each term:

"1. Ordered, That leave be, and is hereby given the clerk of this court to open and file all depositions returned and to be returned during the present term of this court."

Affidavit for Capias.

Rule 5. When an affidavit for a capias is presented to a judge he shall indorse thereon a minute of the order refusing or granting the writ.

Default.

Rule 6. In all cases made returnable to any term of the court where process has been duly served and declaration filed ten days before the first day of the term, the defendant shall plead by the morning of the third day, by the opening of the court, and the plaintiff shall be entitled to judgment by default in all cases where the plea is not so fixed, unless the party has obtained an extension of the rule so to plead. Any defendant entering his appearance without service will be required to plead or demur to the declaration at such time as he would be so required if he had been served with process on the day of the entry of his appearance.

Setting Aside Default.

Rule 7. When either party neglects to file the proper pleadings, within the time fixed by law or the rule of the court, such party shall be considered in default and may be proceeded against accordingly. Defaults will not be set aside except upon affidavit of the party, agent or attorney filed, setting forth that there is a meritorious cause of action, or defense, and the nature of it, in which case the default may be set aside on such terms as the court may deem just, and the pleading, for want of which such default existed, shall be filed forthwith, unless the court shall otherwise direct.

Appeal Cases.

Rule 8. No orders will be entered in an appeal case from a justice of the peace if a transcript has not been filed ten days before the term at which the application is made.

Law Rules of Superior Court of Cook County.

Rule 9. The appellee in any appeal case from a justice of the peace, which has been perfected ten days before the commencement of any trial term, may enter his appearance in writing and have the same filed among the papers in the case, and if such appearance is so entered ten days before the commencement of the term, the case shall stand for trial in its order.

Rule 10. In appeals from judgments of justices of the peace to this court appellant or appellants shall file with the clerk a transcript of the proceedings before the justice of the peace within ten days after filing the appeal bond; in default thereof the court shall dismiss said appeal unless good cause be shown why such order should not be entered.

If a defendant in an action of forcible detainer desires to appeal to this court no appeal bond shall be approved or filed unless it shall appear from a transcript that the defendant prayed an appeal before the justice, and that the justice fixed the amount of the appeal bond, or that a judge of this court has fixed the amount of such bond.

Rule 11. Appeal cases, when reached on calendar, will be disposed of either by trial, continuance, dismissal of case or appeal, or by striking the same from the docket, and in case the same are stricken from the docket, they will not be again placed on any trial calendar unless all parties are in court, transcripts and papers filed, and the cases ready in every respect for trial.

Notice—When Required.

Rule 12. Parties shall take notice of all calls of the calendar.

No motion will be heard or order made in any cause without notice to the opposite party, when an appearance of such party has been entered, except where a party is in default or when a cause is reached on the call of the trial calendar.

Notice—How Given.

Rule 13. Notice to the opposite party must be in writing, state the motion, designate the judge before whom the same is to be made, and the place of hearing, and be served by delivering a copy to such party or his attorney of record before four P. M. of the day preceding the day mentioned in the notice for calling up such motion.

The service of a motion upon an attorney by leaving a copy thereof at his office, in his absence, with a clerk or other person in charge of such office, shall be regarded as service upon such attorney; provided, however, if the attorney has no office in the city, then the service shall be as the court may direct.

Service of Rule.

Rule 14. The service of rules or orders made by the court, or by the judges during summer recess, shall be by delivering a certified copy. When neither the party nor his attorney resides in or has an office in the City of Chicago, all notices may be served by mail, and when either party has appeared by attorney, service of any rule, order or notice made on such attorney shall be deemed sufficient, unless where the object is to bring a party into contempt for disobeying any rule or order, in which case the services shall be upon the party personally.

Motions and Demurrers.

Rule 15. All motions, of course and contested, excepting motions for new trial and motions subsequent thereto, and motions arising during the actual trial of a case, shall be determined and disposed of by one or more judges designated for that purpose.

All such motions shall be placed upon a motion calendar and will be called and disposed of in their order upon such calendar. All motions not of course shall be made in writing, and when founded on matters of fact not otherwise appearing by the pleadings, or other proceeding by the pleadings in the cause, such facts must be presented by affidavit, which shall be filed with the motion, and a copy thereof served with the notice of the motion. Counter affidavits may ordinarily be filed in opposition to such motion; but counter or supplementary affidavits will not be allowed on application for continuances, or in applications for security for costs, or for sureties in appeal bonds to justify.

All matters requiring immediate action or attention and not affecting or pertaining to any case then on a trial call shall be presented to and heard by the motion judge. Confessions of judgment, petitions for *mandamus* or *quo warranto* for leave to sue in *forma pauperis*, applications for naturalization, the assessment of damages in noncontested or settled cases, and similar matters are included in this rule. The motion judge shall also hear the cases placed upon the short cause calendar.

Rule 16. Whenever the motion judge shall have entered default in any case and it is necessary for a jury to assess plaintiff's damages, if there be no jury sitting in his room the clerk in the motion room shall notify the assignment clerk that default has been entered, and the assignment clerk will thereupon assign the cause to some one of the trial judges for final disposition.

Rule 17. No demurrer shall be allowed to be filed to any declaration unless upon a certificate of counsel that in his opinion it is well founded in point of law, and unless supported by the affidavit of the defendant, or by his agent duly authorized, or attorney, that it is not interposed for delay.

Rule 18. Whenever a default is set aside or a demurrer is overruled or sustained, and leave to plead or leave to amend is prayed for, the court may, in granting such motion, impose as terms costs not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$10.00, to be paid by the losing to the successful party on the motion, or his or their attorney.

Motions for Rules on Sureties in Appeal Bonds to Justify.

Rule 19. Motions may be made to require a surety on an appeal bond to justify, after the bond has been approved and the appeal perfected. They must be supported by affidavit showing that affiant has made inquiry as to the responsibility of such surety and the nature of such inquiry, and, if the surety has scheduled any real estate, as to the title and value of such real estate, and that such surety is irresponsible, and stating the facts tending to show that such belief is

well founded. If such affidavit is deemed sufficient a rule will be entered requiring the surety to justify or the appellant to give a new bond by a certain day; and in default, that the appeal be dismissed. "The same motions in like manner may be made in all cases of bonds given ex parte in any proceeding."

The clerk shall spread of record on a book or books kept for that purpose, bonds filed in any cause in this court.

Formation of Calendars.

Rule 20. The cases shall be divided, in rotation, in seven (7) calendars, each calendar having an equal number of cases. Thereafter, at convenient intervals, as may be necessary, calendars for individual judges, consisting of two hundred (200) cases, shall be made up. All cases on each calendar which shall not be finally disposed of during the call of such calendar (including all reinstated cases), shall be included in and placed at the head of the next calendar of two hundred (200) cases of the same judge when such new calendar shall be made up. Every such case, unless otherwise specially so ordered, shall remain on the calendar of such judge until finally disposed of.

All the foregoing matter shall be under the special supervision of the motion judge.

Passing and Continuing Cases.

Rule 22. When the principal attorney of record, or the attorney specially charged with the trial of the case of a party is sick or actually engaged in the trial of a cause in some other court at the time the cause is called for trial, and the other party is ready, the court will pass the cause for the time without prejudice, where it appears by affidavit or otherwise that the party seeking the delay has used due diligence to be ready for trial, and would have been ready but for the sickness or engagement of his attorney. Provided, that a sound discretion will be exercised by the court in the enforcement of this rule in extreme cases, in favor of plaintiffs in attachments and suits on demands which would be barred by the statutes of limitations if dismissed; and also in all cases where any substantial injury might result.

No case will be passed the second time for either of the causes above mentioned, and any case so passed shall be held for trial upon the trial call until the cause for which the same was passed shall have ceased, when it shall be the next case tried.

Upon good cause shown, any judge may order a case assigned in his room to be assigned for trial before another trial judge. Stipulations to pass, for continuances and also for the assignment of cases for trial at a date which will not advance such case from its regular order, will be recognized when in writing and signed by counsel for all of the parties in the case and filed with the assignment clerk.

Short Cause Calendar.

Rule 23. Monday of each week is set apart and assigned as the day for the trial of actions upon the "Short Cause Calendar." No case shall be noticed for trial on such calendar until the same is at issue. All notices to place a case on such calendar must be filed with the

clerk within two days after service of the same, and not later than on Thursday, eleven days before the Monday on which the case is set for trial. Cases placed upon this calendar shall be assigned for trial in the order in which said notices are filed with the clerk, in the same manner as other common law cases, and all cases not reached for trial on the Monday designated shall stand continued until the following Monday.

Change of Venue.

Rule 24. Whenever counsel shall notify the judge to whom a case is assigned that he intends to ask for a change of venue, he must present his petition to that judge on the next court day after the case has been assigned. Whenever a change of venue shall be granted from one or more judges the case shall be immediately reassigned by the assignment clerk to one of the other judges having no case on trial, in the manner hereinabove provided.

Instructions.

Rule 25. All instructions must be presented to the court at the conclusion of the taking of the evidence.

Motions for New Trial.

Rule 26. Motions for new trial must be filed in writing, and such motions will be heard on the Saturday of the week following the week in which the verdict is rendered, unless the judge presiding at the trial shall otherwise direct, and it shall be the duty of the clerk to make up each Saturday a calendar of such motions for new trial, placing thereon, without notice, and according to their numbers, all pending motions. This calendar will be called and motions disposed of without notice, and in case the hearing of any motion is continued it will be placed at the foot of the next new trial calendar, unless the court shall otherwise order.

Costs.

Rule 27. When there are several defendants, if a single appearance is filed for all but one appearance, fee of three dollars (\$3.00) is required to be paid, but if several appearances are filed for different parties, either by different attorneys or by the same attorney at different times, an appearance fee must be paid for each appearance.

Suits in Forma Pauperis.

Rule 28. When an attorney has a pauper for a client, for whom he brings suit in this court as such, the attorney shall before bringing such suit by personal investigation satisfy himself that such person actually is a pauper unable to procure the money with which to pay the costs of bringing the suit, and, further, that such person has a meritorious cause of action. All applications for leave to sue in forma pauperis shall be made by a petition subscribed and sworn to by the applicant, and such petition shall contain a detailed statement of the cause or grounds for the action. It shall show the address, trade, if any, and occupation, income and means of subsistence of the applicant then and during the year past and that such person has no money or property of any kind and no means

from which to raise money for such costs. Such person shall appear personally in court, unless physically incapacitated, in which event the petition shall state how incapacitated and where the applicant is. At the foot of such petition there shall be added an agreement that such person will pay all costs due to the clerk of this court out of any money obtained through the suit or compromise.

The petition shall also be accompanied by an affidavit of the attorney for such pauper, stating the length of time he has been personally acquainted with said pauper, that he has personally investigated by enquiring of such pauper, unless prevented by physical incapacity of the pauper, and otherwise as well, and from such investigation he believes the facts stated in the petition to be true; that he believes the applicant has a meritorious cause of action and has sufficient evidence to make recovery or the obtaining of a decree reasonably certain; and that neither the attorney nor his firm, if he is a member of one, has received any money or other compensation in connection with the cause of action, for the bringing of the suit or to prosecute the same. In the event the suit is for a minor it shall also be stated that there is no one, capable of doing so, legally obliged to pay for the necessities of such minor.

There shall also be added an agreement by such attorney and his firm, if any, that as an officer of the court he undertakes to see and agrees that the costs of the court shall be paid out of the first money recovered through the litigation or obtained by any compromise made, and, if the cause is a divorce suit, also that he will prosecute proceedings for the recovery of the costs from the defendant if the defendant has employment or means of any kind wherefrom costs might be recovered.

Unless the attorney has known the pauper for one year or more, the application shall also be accompanied by an affidavit of a reputable citizen of some standing (known to and represented as such to the court by the attorney) that he has known the pauper applicant for one year, and knows from personal investigation that the applicant is a pauper who has no money or property of any kind and has no means wherewith to pay the costs of suit; and also that he believes such person to be honest and that the costs will be paid out of any money recovered by suit or obtained by compromise.

Every application to sue in forma pauperis shall first be presented to the chief deputy clerk, or in his absence to the one acting as such, who shall ascertain that this rule is complied with and mark the application "O. K.," with his initials, and thereafter the same shall be presented to the motion judge, who shall act upon all such applications.

The court regards it as the duty to the court of every attorney in anywise connected with a pauper suit for either side, as an officer of the court to see that the court's costs are paid out of any money obtained thereby. No suit will be dismissed or decree entered nor other final disposition made of any cause where anything has been ob-

tained by the litigation or by a compromise until the costs of the court are paid.

The clerk shall once a year report to the judges the number of pauper suits instituted during the preceding three years wherein costs remain unpaid, together with the names of the attorneys therein.

This rule shall take the place of chancery rule 17 and common law rule 28 heretofore in force.

The following amendment to the pauper rule was passed April 20, 1911.

"Any person who is not a resident of Cook County may be permitted to begin, prosecute or defend a suit in law or chancery as a poor person on making the affidavit required by the statute and rules of court, and it shall be unnecessary for such non-resident to make application in person for leave to commence or defend an action in forma pauperis."

Instructions.

Rule 29. Each party shall upon the conclusion of every case tried by jury, and before the beginning of the arguments, submit to the trial judge the instructions which he intends to ask the court to give to the jury, and shall at the same time deliver a copy thereof to counsel for the opposite party.

Thereupon the judge shall give each party an opportunity, out of the presence of the jury and before the beginning of the arguments, to state his objections to the instructions requested by the other party and to reply to the objections of the opposite party to the instructions requested by him.

If the judge modifies the instructions requested by the parties he shall give counsel an opportunity before the same are read to the jury to state his objection to the instructions as modified.

Counsel will be expected as officers of the court, in good faith, to assist the judge in settling the instructions before the beginning of the arguments to the jury, so that the jury may be correctly charged as to the law of the case, and inadvertent and preventible error may not enter into the record to the manifest prejudice of the cause of justice.

The trial judge will, as far as practicable arrange the order of the instructions which he intends to give, so as to present the law of the case to the jury in the form of a connected charge. If the judge shall elect to give of his own motion any additional instructions for the purpose of more fully presenting to the jury the law of the case as applicable to the issues of fact, such additional instructions shall also be submitted to counsel as above provided, in regard to modifications of requested instructions.

Opening Statement.

Rule 30. Each party before any evidence is heard on either side, shall make an opening statement, and unless made at that time the right thereto shall be deemed waived, provided, however, that the trial judge, in his discretion may permit the defendant, upon good cause shown, to reserve his opening statement until after the close of the plaintiff's case.

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CHANCERY RULES

OF THE

SUPERIOR COURT OF COOK COUNTY.

IN FORCE MARCH 20, 1892.

Appearance of Parties.

1. When any defendant who shall be summoned, served with a copy of the bill or petition, or notified of the commencement of the suit, as required by law, shall enter and file an appearance in writing, before default taken, the party entering such appearance shall thereby, without any order, have twenty days from the first day of the appearance term within which to except, plead, answer or demur. By appearance term is meant the term at which the party might be defaulted for failure to appear.

When any defendant who has not been summoned, etc., as required by law, shall enter an appearance, he shall give the complainant's solicitor immediate notice of the fact, and shall except, plead, answer or demur, within 20 days after entering such appearance.

Defaults.

2. On and after the third day of each term defaults may be entered as to such defendants as have been served in due time, and have filed no appearance in writing.

Motions of Course.

4. Motions of Course will be heard at the opening of Court at ten o'clock each day (and the time occupied therein shall be known as "motion hour"), and notice thereof, except in default cases, of at least one day shall be given to the solicitor of record of the opposite party, if there be such solicitor, and be supported by affidavit whenever based on matters of fact not appearing of record or by files in the case, but all notices served on Saturday shall be served before 12 o'clock noon of that day.

What May be Considered as Motions of Course.

Motions for default; default decrees, for appointment of commissioners in partition, for confirmation of reports of commissioners and of Masters where no exceptions are filed; motions for rules to plead, answer or demur concerning amendments of pleadings or for leave to file any pleading or paper; to set aside defaults, for new bonds; that sureties justify; concerning ne-exeats; for ex parte injunction orders; touching the custody of children; motions for reference to a Master and for contempts of court may, among others, be considered motions of course.

How Made.

A note of such motions shall be made by the solicitor of the moving party in a "motion book" to be provided by the Clerk, or by a memorandum thereof delivered to the minute clerk (whose duty it shall be to enter the same in the "motion book" in the order of the receipt thereof) before the opening of Court. The note, or memorandum, shall designate the term number and title of the cause, with a brief statement of the nature of the motion, the name of the moving solicitor, and, except in default cases or where no appearance has been entered, the name of the solicitor of the opposite party.

Such motions will be called in their order in the "motion book," and solicitors will not rise to address the Court upon a motion until it has been called.

Motions.

If no one appears for or against a motion when called it will be stricken from the "contested motion calendar" or the "motion book" upon which it may be pending.

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Chancery Rules of the Superior Court.

Motions whether "contested" or "of course," if not supported by the moving solicitor when called, will be overruled, as of course, on the suggestion of opposing solicitor who in response to notice thereof is in attendance, and no renewal thereof will be permitted except for cause shown, upon service of notice of motion therefor with copy of affidavit, etc., upon the opposite solicitor and upon reasonable terms in the discretion of the Court, or upon consent thereto in writing of the opposing solicitor.

In all cases where a motion is made before default day and there is no appearance of defendant by solicitor, the defendant shall be personally served with at least one day's notice thereof, and with copies as hereinbefore directed, if practicable, and not otherwise determined by the Court because of the emergency thereof. All motions except in default cases shall be reduced to writing and filed in the cause before action of the Court is moved thereon.

Contested Motions.

Contested motions shall be deemed to include all motions pertaining to the settling of pleadings, for alimony and solicitors' fees, for injunctions upon notice; to dissolve injunctions, for the appointment and removal of Receivers, the hearing of exceptions to Masters' and Receivers' reports, and all other opposed motions, the hearing of which will operate to unduly delay the Court in its other duties.

A calendar of such motions will be made up on Friday of each week for hearing on the following Monday, in the order of filing notices thereof, with the minute clerk, and will be posted in the court room. The Court may in its discretion, continue the call of said calendar from day to day, or on a particular day to be specified, without notice except as may be announced during the call thereof, and may, whenever in its opinion the exigency of the case requires it, hear particular motions at any time.

Motions passed under the rule relating to the engagement or other disability of a solicitor shall be placed at the head of the next succeeding calendar in the relative order they occupied on the pending calendar.

Motions continued by order or consent, will be placed in their relative order at the foot of the next calendar unless otherwise ordered.

To entitle a motion to be placed and heard on the contested motion calendar, notice thereof, together with a copy of all affidavits and other pertinent and competent papers relied upon and to be read in support thereof (except the records, files, pleadings, depositions, reports of Masters and Receivers, and other proceedings in the cause, or in other causes), must be served on the solicitor of the opposing party before four o'clock in the afternoon of the preceding Thursday, and a copy of all counter-affidavits, etc. (with the

like exceptions), must be served on the solicitor of the moving party before twelve o'clock noon of Saturday succeeding. Said notice, with proof, or acceptance, of service thereof, must be delivered to minute clerk before two o'clock p. m. of Friday.

To entitle records or other proceedings in the same cause or in other causes than the one in which the motion is made, to be read either in support of or in opposition to a motion of any kind, brief designation thereof shall be made by notice to the solicitor of the opposite party within the times mentioned for the service of affidavits.

Affidavits, and matters of record, strictly in rebuttal, may be read without notice, or the service of a copy thereof.

Motions in cases where the emergency thereof will not admit of the delay incident to the contested motion calendar, may be taken up and heard at any time, upon such notice as the Court may in its discretion direct, or without notice if the Court shall so determine.

Except by permission of the Court, but one solicitor on each side shall be heard on any motion, demurrer, or any interlocutory matter.

Trial Calendar.

5. When any Chancery cause is at issue, upon notice and motion of either party, the cause at any time within ten days of the commencement of the term for which a trial calendar may be ordered made, may be ordered placed on the trial calendar, and any cause before issues joined may be ordered placed upon the trial calendar by consent of the parties, or by order of the Court, but issues must be joined therein before the cause is reached for final hearing.

The cases on such calendar shall be called and tried on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of each week, and also on Mondays and Saturdays when so directed by the Court. No more than five cases shall be fixed for trial upon the same day; but if the Court is behind in the call of the calendar, not exceeding six cases may be called for trial on any one day. All cases remaining undisposed of upon any calendar, shall, without further order, be placed at the head of the next (new) calendar. (See rule 7.)

Sickness, Etc., of Solicitor.

6. When the principal solicitor of a party is sick, or actually engaged in the trial of a cause in some other court of record in this county (or in the Supreme Court) at the time the cause is called for trial, and the adverse party is ready, the Court, if satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that the party seeking the delay would have been ready for trial but for the sickness or engagement of his solicitor, may order said cause passed or continued upon such terms as the Court may direct; provided, however, the Court may on passing such cause set the same for hearing peremptorily at some future day.

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Chancery Rules of the Superior Court.

Passed Cases.

7. No case will be passed a second time for either of the causes mentioned in the preceding rule; any case so passed shall be in order to be called up for trial at any time after the cause for which the same was passed shall cease, but notice shall be given to the opposite party or his solicitor. Which notice shall be at least one day's notice, unless the case is to be called up for trial upon the same day that it was passed.

If no such notice shall be given during the term or terms the trial calendar shall be called, the case shall be placed by the Clerk, without further order, at the foot of the next trial calendar.

Divorces and Default Cases.

8. All divorces and other default cases, in which notice shall be given the Clerk to place the same upon the default calendar, will be heard upon Saturday of each week, unless otherwise determined by the Judge before whom such cause is pending. No references shall be allowed in default divorce cases, except as to question of alimony and property, and all testimony must be taken by deposition or in open court. When taken in open court, it must be taken in shorthand, written out and presented to the Court, and filed before a decree will be entered. No decree of divorce will be granted upon the unsupported testimony of the complainant.

When an answer is filed the case may be placed on the trial calendar upon notice and motion thereof, and heard in its order.

Within ten days after the hearing of any default or uncontested divorce suit, the complainant shall hand to the minute Clerk a draft of the decree and certificate of evidence; in default whereof, unless for good cause shown the time be extended, the bill shall be dismissed.

Withdrawal of Solicitors.

9. No solicitor will be permitted to withdraw his appearance for any party, unless the Court shall be satisfied, by affidavit or otherwise, that such party has had reasonable notice of the solicitor's intention to withdraw his appearance in the cause.

Abstract of Pleadings and Evidence.

10. In all cases heard in this Court, except where otherwise determined by the Court, the parties shall prepare an abstract or abridgement of their respective pleadings, and of the evidence, when the same shall have been taken by deposition or before a Master in Chancery, and such abstract of the pleadings and evidence shall be read on the hearing in lieu of the original pleadings and depositions.

Decrees, Etc., as to Sale of Real Estate.

10½. All decrees and orders of this Court directing the public sale of any real estate, or an interest therein, shall provide that such sale shall be made at the rooms of the Chicago Real Estate Board or of the Cook County Real Estate Board in the City of Chicago, unless the Court—for cause shown—shall otherwise order.

Changing Final Decree as to Alimony or Custody of Children.

11. All applications for changing a final order or decree concerning alimony or the custody of children shall be by petition in writing verified by affidavit. Upon the filing thereof a rule on the respondent to plead, answer or demur in ten days after service of the copy thereof on such respondent, may be obtained. Issues joined therein may be heard at such time as the Court may order. The Court may, in its discretion, upon motion, refer the same to the Master, as in other cases.

Bonds.

12. Upon the motion of any party in interest, the bond of any receiver, injunction or other bond may be ordered spread of record in the cause in which it is filed.

Complete Record, Etc.

13. A complete record may be made of all pleadings, files, etc., in any cause upon the motion of any party in interest, upon such terms as to the costs thereof as the Court may order.

Any pleading or file may be ordered spread of record in any cause before final decree, upon such terms and in such manner as the Court may order.

Receivers.

14. Notice of the filing of reports by receivers, and of all orders asked for by any receiver, and of all orders to be made on such receiver, shall be given to each and all the solicitors, or firm of solicitors of record in the cause.

Pleadings and Copies Thereof.

15. Upon the filing of every bill or petition (or within 24 hours thereafter) a copy of the same and of all exhibits accompanying the same shall be filed with the Clerk of the Court, marked "copy." And upon the filing of any other pleading, a copy thereof, and of the exhibits accompanying the same shall also be filed with the Clerk.

Any such copy may be taken by the solicitor of any party to the cause upon his receipting therefor to the Clerk, as hereinafter provided, but in no case shall the original of any such bill, petition, pleading or exhibit or file be taken from the custody of the Clerk, except upon special order of the Court, entered of record in the cause.

Chancery Register.

That the Clerk procure and keep a suitable book to be known as "The Clerk's Chancery Register," in which shall be noted:

Chancery Rules of the Superior Court.

First. The number and title of all Chancery causes, petitions, or proceedings commenced upon the Chancery side of this Court.

Second. The names of the respective solicitors and counsel therein.

Third. The date of filing the bill, petition, demurrer, answer or other pleading therein, and of all affidavits, exhibits, or other papers therein, describing the same as briefly as may be necessary for identification.

Fourth. The date when any such bill, petition, demurrer, answer, pleading, etc., or filed copy thereof, shall be taken from the files, to whom delivered, and when returned. But no such delivery shall be made to any person other than a solicitor or counsel in the cause or his or their clerk, known to be such, nor shall the entire files or any injunction, receiver's or other bonds, writ or other process be delivered to any other person than a bailiff or deputy clerk of this Court.

It is also ordered, that no such bill, petition, demurrer, answer, pleading, etc., or filed copy thereof shall be permitted to be taken from the files except upon leaving with the Clerk a receipt therefor upon the receipt book provided for that purpose, nor shall the same be retained for a longer time than three days (the date when taken shall be counted as one day), and if the same is not returned within such three days, it shall be the duty of the clerk in charge of such Register to forthwith make a report to the Court, to the end that a rule may be made to return the same to the files in-stater.

For any violation of this rule, or for any cause, the Court may direct the Clerk to refuse to allow any specified solicitor or counsel to take any pleading, etc., or filed copy thereof from any of the files of the Court.

Costs.

16. When there are several defendants, if a single appearance is filed for all, but one appearance fee of three dollars (\$3.00) is required to be paid; but if several appearances are filed for different parties, either by different solicitors or by the same solicitor at different times, an appearance fee must be paid for each appearance.

When the appearance fee has been paid no costs are required upon filing a cross-bill.

17. In view of the large number of applications for leave to sue as a poor person, in divorce and other cases, and for the protection of the Clerk's office against imposition, it is ordered that hereafter, all such applications made upon the Chancery side of the Court must be accompanied by a detailed sworn statement by the appli-

cant, containing occupation, means of subsistence, income during the year preceding the application and sources and amount of expected income, if any, of the applicant.

Affidavits also of two disinterested persons must accompany the application, which must show affirmatively that the applicant is not able to pay the usual Court costs.

There must also be filed an agreement on part of the applicant to pay the Court costs out of the first payments of alimony or other funds if any, realized out of the litigation.

No final decree will be entered, nor suit dismissed or otherwise disposed of, in cases where the complainant receives from the litigation any funds whatever until the Clerk's costs are fully paid.

Rules Governing Masters in Chancery.

1. Whenever a reference shall be made to a Master in Chancery of this Court, to take testimony and report the same, or to take testimony and report the same with his conclusions thereon to the Court, the Master to whom such reference is made shall, as soon as practicable, fix a day to proceed with the taking of testimony or evidence on such reference, and on the day so fixed he shall proceed with the taking of such testimony or evidence, and may, in his discretion, fix a day within which the complainant shall close his proofs, which time he may, in his discretion, for good cause shown, extend for such reasonable time as justice may require; and, as soon as the complainant has closed his proofs, shall fix a time within which the defendant shall close his proofs, and the complainant his proofs in rebuttal; and in his discretion for good cause may extend the time for such reasonable time as justice may require; and in case the parties shall not close their proofs within the time limited by the Master, he shall proceed to make up his report upon the testimony and evidence that may have been submitted to him without waiting for further evidence or testimony from the party so failing to close his proofs within the time limited.

2. Whenever such reference is made to a Master in Chancery of this Court, to take testimony and report the same, or to take testimony and report the same with his conclusion thereon to the Court, the Master shall have full power and discretion to pass upon all questions of competency of witnesses, and the propriety and relevancy of all questions or interrogatories put by counsel, and the Master shall note his ruling upon each objection in the minutes of the proceedings before him, and when the Master has ruled that a party or witness shall answer a given interrogatory, it shall be the duty of such

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Chancery Rules of the Superior Court.

witness or party to answer in the same manner as if such witness or party had been so directed by the Court; and in case the Master shall hold that any question is irrelevant or incompetent, the same shall not be answered. If either party shall except to the ruling of the Master upon the admissibility of testimony or evidence, they shall, after the testimony and evidence before the Master is closed, and before he makes his report thereon, bring such objections and exceptions to the Master's ruling upon the testimony before the Court, and if the Court shall sustain the ruling of the Master, he shall immediately proceed to make his report upon the testimony and evidence submitted to him, and if such objections and exceptions to the rulings of the Master shall be sustained, the Master shall proceed to take such further testimony as the Court may direct, and shall disregard, in making up his report, such testimony as the Court may rule to be incompetent or irrelevant.

3. All parties accounting before a Master shall bring in their respective accounts in the form of debtor and creditor, and any of the other parties who shall not be satisfied with the accounts so brought in, shall be at liberty to examine the accounting party viva voce or upon oral or written interrogatories, in the Master's office, as the Master may direct.

4. The Master shall be at liberty to examine any creditor or other person coming in to make a claim before him, either upon written interrogatories or viva voce, or in both modes, as the nature of the case may appear to him to require. The evidence upon such examination shall be taken down by the Master, or by some other person by his order and in his presence, if either party requires it, in order that the same may be used by the Court, if necessary.

5. All affidavits, depositions, and documents which have been previously made, read, or used in the Court upon any proceeding in any cause or matter, may be used before the Master.

6. Every bill or petition upon which an ex parte preliminary injunction—order for the appointment of a receiver—or for a writ of ne exeat publica is desired, shall be filed with the Clerk of the Court before the same is presented to a Judge for an order, or to a Master for a recommendation as to such injunction, receiver or writ of ne exeat. For such purpose the Clerk may deliver such bill or petition to the solicitor or person filing such bill, upon his receiving therefor to such Clerk, but the same must be returned to the custody of such Clerk immediately after such Judge or Master shall have passed upon such application.

No Master shall examine any such bill or petition presented to him until the same shall have been filed as aforesaid, and the Master's fee paid to such Master.

The Judge or Master shall indorse upon or at the foot of every such bill or petition so presented and examined by him, his conclusion, or recommendation as to whether the prayer of such bill or petition as to such injunction, receiver, or ne exeat, should be granted.

No Master shall examine or make any recommendation upon any such bill or petition which shall contain the indorsement of any Judge or Master as aforesaid, except upon a special order of the Court to that effect.

7. The attendance of solicitors (Superior Court) shall not be compulsory before Masters in Chancery in any matter on Saturday after 1 o'clock p. m.

7. That attendance before the Masters in Chancery during the vacation of the Courts shall not be compulsory, except upon special order made in the particular case, nor shall attendance upon any Saturday be compulsory except upon like special order. (Circuit Court.)

Rules—When to Go Into Effect.

The foregoing rules shall go into effect and be in force from and after the 15th day of October, 1897, and on and from that date shall supersede all prior rules adopted by this Court.

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RULES OF PRACTICE

OF THE

COUNTY COURT of COOK COUNTY.

ENTERED OF RECORD JANUARY 10, 1898.

IN GENERAL.

Numbering Cases.

Rule 1. Suits brought in this Court are at once given a general number, which is never changed; and in the numbering of cases no distinction is made between suits at law, insolvent debtor's, actions for support, voluntary assignments, exceptions to claims and condemnation cases.

Special assessment cases are numbered separately in the name of the city, town or village filing the petition. Objections to application for judgment on delinquent general taxes and special assessments are numbered "general" or "special," as the case may be, in the order filed. Insane cases are numbered separately and in the order filed.

Motions.

Rule 2. Motions of course in all proceedings in the County Court will be heard every day Court is in session at 9:30 o'clock in the morning, in room County Building, provided notice of said motion has been given the opposite party before 4:00 p. m. of the preceding court day; provided, further, that when calendars in common law, special assessment or other County Court matters are being heard, all motions referring to cases on such calendars must be noticed for and will be heard by the Judge who is trying any such calendar. Motions of course must be placed on the motion of course calendar found on the clerk's desk, and will be called in their order, and the parties interested in such motion will not arise or address the Court until such motion is called.

All contested motions or matters pertaining to cases not on the regular calendars can be called up on the motions of course calendar for the purpose of setting the matter down for hearing at some day fixed by the Court.

Continuance of Motions.

Rule 3. Motions entered or record and not disposed of during the term when made will stand continued without formal motion until final disposition.

Appeal.

Rule 4. In case of appeal from a decis-

ion or judgment of this Court, no appeal bond will be approved without notice of the application for such approval being given to the appellee or his attorney, as provided by Rule 2.

VOLUNTARY ASSIGNMENTS.

Reports.

Rule 1. Within ten days after filing the deed of assignment, unless further time is granted by the Court, the assignee shall file with the Clerk of this Court a true and full inventory and valuation of the insolvent estate, and every three months thereafter a true and full report of the condition of the estate; provided, that where the assignee, by permission of the Court, continues and directs the business of said estate in the usual course of business, he shall file every thirty days a true and full report of his acts and doings, showing a true condition of said estate.

Continuing Business.

Rule 2. The assignee must not carry on the business of the insolvent, unless permitted to do so by an order of Court, and then only for such time and expense as may be fixed by said order.

Selling Assets.

Rule 3. The assignee of the insolvent estate must not sell any of the assets of said estate without an order of Court first had and obtained.

Funds.

Rule 4. It shall be the duty of the assignee, who may have funds in his hands, to deposit immediately the same, in his name as assignee, in some bank of good standing, and in no case shall said funds be loaned, pledged, invested or used by said assignee, except on the order of the Court.

Fees.

Rule 5. No assignee shall be permitted to employ an attorney or counsel, nor to use any of the funds of the said estate to pay said attorneys or counsel, or use or apply any of the funds of the said estate in payment for his commission, expenses, or services, except upon the order of the Court first had and obtained. All

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such fees or commissions allowed to the attorney or assignee before final settlement will be credited on account and a full hearing as to amount of such fees or commission will not be had until final settlement of the estate, provided if at any time a party ceases to act as assignee or attorney for an estate, his fees or commission may then be fixed.

Examination of Books, Papers, Etc.

Rule 6. Immediately upon the assignee of an insolvent estate qualifying, it shall be the duty of the insolvent to deliver and turn over to him all the books, papers, records of every kind, which in any way appertain to the subject matter of the assignment and the assigned property. Thereupon such books, papers and records shall be, at all reasonable times, subject to inspection and examination by any creditor or interested party, or their respective attorneys or representatives, at the office of the assignee. The Court may direct a special examination of any of the books, papers, or documents, at any special place or time, when proper cause therefor is made to appear.

Notice.

Rule 7. The assignee, or his attorney, must be served with a copy of all petitions filed in the assignment matters, on or before 4:00 o'clock of the Court day next preceding the day upon which leave is to be asked of the County Court to file such petition, except in emergency matters, and then only in case where the petition discloses such a state of facts as warrants the Court in believing that serious loss or damage might result, if such notice was required to be given. Upon application of a creditor the assignee may be ruled to give five or ten of the principal creditors notice of all proceedings, but he will not be required to give such notice to any one creditor.

Appearance.

Rule 8. Any creditor of the estate, who has not filed his claim with the assignee, as provided by law, must file his appearance in writing before he can be heard in Court or in an examination on citation with reference to matters pertaining to the estate.

A petition, pleading, or written motion filed in said estate, will be considered a general appearance, unless in such petition, pleading, or motion the appearance is limited for a specific purpose.

Citation.

Rule 9. When a citation in an insolvency proceeding has been issued by the County Court, and placed in the hands of the Sheriff for service, the Court will not issue another citation directed against the same person until said person has been examined on the first citation; provided that said sheriff must serve said citation first issued as soon as it is placed in his hands and make a return of said service at once, and shall not follow the

direction of the petitioner in said citation, as to the time he shall serve and return said citation, and the examination on said citation shall not be continued by agreement of the petitioner and the person cited, unless by consent of the assignee and all creditors of said estate, who may have made known to the Court a desire to examine said person on said citation; provided further, that all creditors and the assignee may have the right to examine under said citation, and the manner and place of conducting said examination to be under the direction of the County Court.

Expense of Citation.

Rule 10. Any expense incurred in conducting an examination under a citation in an estate will not be allowed against, or paid by the assignee of said estate without a specific order of the County Court to that effect.

Debtor's Exemptions.

Rule 11. An insolvent, in order to obtain any exemptions allowed to him by law, should file his petition immediately after the assignment, and before the assets are transferred, sold or disposed of by the assignee, asking in said petition that the Court appoint three disinterested persons to appraise said property fairly and impartially. If the Court decides on said petition that said insolvent is entitled to exemptions, he shall appoint said appraisers, who shall forthwith fairly and impartially appraise said estate, and report in writing, under oath, said appraisement to said Court, and thereupon said insolvent shall select such articles belonging to said estate at the value placed thereon by said appraisers, as said insolvent may desire to retain, provided that the aggregate value of all said articles shall not exceed the amount the Court may decide said insolvent is entitled to, provided the court may, if deemed advisable, allow said exemptions in money.

Exceptions to Claims.

Rule 12. A printed calendar of all undisposed of exceptions to claims will be made and set for hearing from time to time as occasion may require. When any such calendar is not on hearing any exception to claim in any estate may be called up as a motion of course and set for hearing at some convenient day.

Contested Matters.

Rule 13. When any matter, whether it be exception to claim or otherwise, in any estate, is called up as a motion of course to be set for hearing, the assignee should have all contested matters at issue in said estate called up and set for hearing on the same day.

Dividends.

Rule 14. Four months after the date of the assignment, or as soon thereafter as the condition of the estate permits and the cash on hand warrants, the assignee

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shall under the direction of the Court declare and pay a dividend to the creditors of said estate, and further dividends from time to time as the condition of the estate warrants.

Discontinuance.

Rule 15. Proceedings under the Voluntary Assignment Act will not be discontinued as provided for in said Act unless on a verified petition, and any additional proof the Court may desire showing that the majority of creditors in number and amount have assented thereto in writing, and that all other provisions required by law have been complied with, and written notice of all applications of this character shall be given to all parties who have filed claims with the assignee, and have not joined in said application, by mailing to said parties, at least three days before the application is made, a notice stating the time and place at which said application will be made, and also giving the number and amount represented by such petition.

Files.

Rule 16. No paper or instrument filed with the Clerk of the Court shall be taken from his office without an order of Court permitting such paper or instrument to be taken, and any paper or instrument taken by order of the Court shall be returned to the clerk within three days thereafter.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT CASES.**Default.**

Rule 1. Orders of default and confirmation will not be entered against any property or person in any special assessment proceeding until the third day after the time fixed in the notice for filing objections.

Calendars—"City."

Rule 2. Printed calendars of objections in special assessment proceedings in which the City of Chicago is a petitioner will be made from time to time and the calendars will be called upon reasonable notice being given to the objectors, as fixed by the Court.

Calendars—"County."

Rule 3. All other special assessment cases in the County Court, including special assessment proceedings for the various villages, towns and Park Boards in Cook County in which objections have been filed, shall be grouped together and called on reasonable notice being given to said objectors, as fixed by the Court.

Objections—Bona Fide.

Rule 4. All objections filed shall be bona fide, and shall relate to the legality of the proceedings, or merits of the case.

Altering Objections.

Rule 5. Where objections are filed they shall not be altered or changed in any manner without an order of the Court.

Vacating Default and Confirmation.

Rule 6. Default and confirmation orders shall not be set aside in any case except for good cause shown upon oath or affidavit. Default or confirmation orders shall not be set aside for any cause after a jury has been called and voir dire examination begun, without consent of the petitioner.

Files.

Rule 7. The assessment roll shall not be taken from the Clerk's office except during the trial of the case, and then only by order of the Court. The petition and other files may be taken from the Clerk's office by parties to the proceedings not to exceed one day.

APPLICATION FOR JUDGMENT IN TAX MATTERS.**Appearance Fee—"General."**

Rule 1. A separate appearance fee shall be paid by every property owner objecting to the sale of his property on application for judgment by the County Collector for delinquent general taxes.

Appearance Fee—"Special."

Rule 2. In applications for judgment in special assessment proceedings a separate appearance fee shall be paid in each warrant issued in a special assessment proceeding, provided that the same attorney representing more than one property owner in a given warrant in a special assessment proceeding shall not be required to pay more than one appearance fee.

Calendar.

Rule 3. When application is made in the County Court by the County Collector for the sale of property for failure to pay taxes, a calendar shall be made up by the Clerk of the County Court of all objections in general taxes and a separate calendar for all objections in special assessment proceedings.

COMMON LAW RULES.**Files—Removal of Papers.**

Rule 1. The files in pending causes shall be kept in the clerk's office, and attorneys may take papers from the files to be returned within three days, upon leaving a receipt for the same.

No such paper shall be delivered to any person other than attorney or counsel in the cause, or his or their clerk, known to be such, nor shall the entire files, or any bond, writ or other process be delivered to any other person than a Bailiff or Clerk of this Court.

Default.

Rule 2. In all cases made returnable to

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any term of the Court where process has been duly served and declaration filed ten days before the first day of the term, the defendant shall plead by the morning of the third day, by the opening of the Court, and the plaintiff shall be entitled to judgment by default in all cases where the plea is not so filed, unless the party has obtained an extension of the rule to plead.

Setting Aside Default.

Rule 3. When either party neglects to file the proper pleading within the time fixed by law or the rule of the Court, such party shall be considered in default and may be proceeded against accordingly. Defaults will not be set aside except upon affidavit of the party, agent or attorney of record, setting forth that there is a meritorious cause of action or defense, and the nature of it, in which case the default may be set aside on such terms as the Court may deem just, and the pleading, for want of which such default existed, shall be filed forthwith, unless the Court shall otherwise direct.

Depositions.

Rule 4. On the first day of each term, an order will be entered directing the clerk to open all depositions when filed.

Appeal Suits.

Rule 5. No orders will be entered in an appeal suit from a Justice of the Peace if a transcript has not been filed ten days before the term at which the application is made.

Rule 6. The appellee in any appeal suit from a Justice of the Peace, which has been perfected ten days before the commencement of any trial term, may enter his appearance in writing and have the same filed among the papers in the case; and if such appearance is so entered ten days before the commencement of the term, and the cause is placed on the calendar, it shall stand for trial in its order.

Rule 7. Appeal cases, when reached on calendar, will be disposed of either by trial, continuance, dismissal of suit or appeal, or by striking the same from the Docket, and in case the same are stricken from the Docket, then they will not be again placed on any Trial Calendar unless all parties are in Court, transcripts and papers filed, and the cases ready in every respect for trial.

Notice—When Required.

Rule 8. Parties shall take notice of all calls of the calendar.

No motion will be heard or order made in any cause without notice to the opposite party when an appearance of such party has been entered, except where a party is in default or when a case is reached on the call of the calendar.

Notice—How Given.

Rule 9. Notice to the opposite party must be in writing, state the motion, designate the time and place of hearing, and be served by delivering a copy to such party or his attorney of record before 4 o'clock p. m. of the day preceding the day mentioned in the notice for calling up such motion.

The service of a motion upon an attorney by leaving a copy thereof at his office, in his absence, with a clerk or other

person in charge of such office, shall be regarded as a service upon such attorney.

Service of Rule.

Rule 10. The service of rules or orders made by the court, or by the judge during summer recess, shall be by delivering a certified copy. When neither the party nor his attorney reside in or has an office in the city of Chicago, all notices may be served by mail, and when either party has appeared by attorney, service of any rule, order or notice made on such attorney shall be deemed sufficient, unless where the object is to bring a party into contempt for disobeying any rule or order, in which case the service shall be upon the party personally.

Motions and Demurrers.

Rule 11. Motions of course are heard on the opening of court and before the call of the docket by the judge. All such motions shall be placed upon a motion calendar and will be called and disposed of in their order upon such calendar. All motions not of course shall be made in writing, and when founded upon matters of fact not otherwise appearing by the pleadings, or other proceedings in the cause, such facts must be presented by affidavit, which shall be filed with the motion, and a copy thereof served with the notice of the motion.

Counter affidavits may ordinarily be filed in opposition to such motion; but counter or supplementary affidavits will not be allowed on applications for continuances, or in applications for security for costs, or for sureties on appeal bonds to justify or set aside defaults.

Rule 12. Motions not of course or contested motions will be heard on each Saturday of the term, after disposition of motions for new trial on that day, one day's notice in writing having been previously given. The clerk will from time to time prepare a calendar of contested motions upon which such motions will be placed in the order in which notice thereof is given to him. A preperemptory call of such motions will be made when ordered by the court, of which three days' notice will be given in the Law Bulletin.

Motions for Rules on Sureties in Appeal Bonds to Justify.

Rule 13. Motions may be made to require a surety on an appeal bond to justify, after the bond has been approved and the appeal perfected. They must be supported by affidavit showing that affiant has made inquiry as to the responsibility of such surety and the nature of such inquiry, and, if the surety has scheduled any real estate, as to the title and value of such real estate, and that from such inquiry affiant believes that such surety is irresponsible, and stating the facts tending to show that such belief is well founded. If such affidavit is deemed sufficient, a rule will be entered requiring the surety to justify or the appellant to give a new bond by a certain day, and in default, that the appeal be dismissed. (Vide Rule 5.)

Trial Calendars.

Rule 14. Printed trial calendars will be made up from time to time, as may be necessary. Notice of the preparation of

Rules of County Court.

new calendars will be given in the Law Bulletin ten days or more before the first day of the term for which such calendars are prepared.

Short Cause Calendar.

Rule 15. Monday of each week is set apart and assigned as the day for the trial of suits upon the Short Cause Calendar, but the county judge may postpone the call of the Short Cause Calendar. No cause shall be noticed for trial on such calendar until the same is at issue. All notices to place a cause on such calendar must be filed with the clerk within two days after service of the same, and not later than on Thursday, eleven days before the Monday on which the cause is set for trial.

Setting Cause for Trial.

Rule 16. No cause will be allowed to be set down for trial by the parties upon any day of the term out of its regular order, unless where there are a number of witnesses from other counties whose attendance will be required, except as provided for in Rule 19.

First Call.

Rule 17. On the call of the trial calendar of common law causes there will from time to time be a first call of not exceeding one hundred causes, at 9:30 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of ascertaining what causes are ready for trial on which call causes will be marked for trial, dismissed or continued, as suggested by counsel or for cause shown; and when neither party to the suit answers, original suits may be dismissed for want of prosecution, and appeals will be dismissed with procedendo.

Call of Calendars.

Rule 18. Causes are called for trial in their order upon the calendars. The call for each day is announced before the adjournment on the preceding day.

There will be no call of the jury trial calendar on Saturday.

Passing Causes.

Rule 19. When the principal attorney of record, or the attorney specially looked to to try the case of a party, is sick or actually engaged in the trial of a cause in some other court of record at the time the cause is called for trial, and the other party is ready, the court will pass the cause for the time without prejudice, where it appears by affidavit or otherwise that the party seeking the delay has used due diligence to be ready for trial and would have been ready but for the sickness or engagement of his attorney. But where the delay is at the instance of the defendant, it shall also appear by affidavit that there is a meritorious defense to the suit, and setting forth in what it consists. Provided, that a sound discretion will be exercised by the court in the enforcement of this rule in extreme

cases in favor of plaintiffs in attachments and suits on demands which would be barred by the statutes of limitations if dismissed; and also in all cases where any substantial injury might result.

No cause will be passed a second time for either of the causes above mentioned, and any cause so passed shall be in order to be called for trial at any time after the cause for which the same was passed shall cease, on notice to the opposite party or his attorney, and the court shall fix the day of trial, or replace it on the calendar, so as to be reached in a short time.

No judgment will be set aside or appeal or suit reinstated in cases where the engagement of counsel in a cause in another court, at the time of the entering of the order, is for the first time disclosed to the court on the hearing of a motion to set aside or reinstate.

Continuance.

Rule 20. A cause placed upon a calendar shall stand for trial in its order upon said calendar, and no cause shall be continued except upon affidavit, unless by consent of both parties, or as provided in Rule 19.

Instructions.

Rule 21. All instructions must be presented to the court at the conclusion of the taking of evidence.

Motions for New Trial.

Rule 22. Motions for new trial must be filed in writing and such motions will be heard on the Saturday of the week in which the verdict is rendered, unless the judge shall otherwise direct, and it shall be the duty of the clerk to make up for each Saturday a calendar of such motions for new trial, placing thereon without notice and according to their numbers, all pending motions. This calendar will be called and motions disposed of without notice, and in case the hearing of any motion is continued it will be placed at the foot of the next new trial calendar, unless the court shall otherwise order.

Costs.

Rule 23. Where there are several defendants, if a single appearance is filed for all, but one appearance fee of three dollars (\$3.00) is required to be paid, but if several appearances are filed for different parties, either by different attorneys or by the same attorney at different times, an appearance fee must be paid for each appearance.

Forcible Detainer.

Rule 24. In case when a defendant in an action of forcible detainer desires to appeal to this court no appeal bond shall be approved or filed unless it shall appear from the transcript that before the justice the defendant prayed an appeal and the justice fixed the amount of the appeal bond.

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RULES OF PRACTICE

OF THE

PROBATE COURT of COOK COUNTY

Adopted February 1, 1911.

Ordered: That all rules of practice heretofore adopted in this court be and the same are hereby rescinded, and the following rules of practice be and they are hereby adopted; and it is further ordered that said rules be entered at large in the general records of this court.

Motions.

Rule 1. Motions and uncontested matters will be heard upon the coming in of court in the forenoon until 10:30 o'clock, and in the afternoon until a quarter after two o'clock of each day (except Saturday and except on the forenoon of the days of the call of the claim docket and in the forenoon of the first Wednesday of each term, which is reserved for jury trials in insanity matters).

The docket shall be prepared daily by the clerk at the rear of the court room and called by the sheriff in the order in which the motions are docketed. Whenever a motion has been called and not responded to, it shall not be called again until it has been redocketed by the clerk.

Contested matters shall be docketed by the sheriff and heard at 10:30 o'clock in the forenoon and fifteen minutes after two o'clock in the afternoon of each day, except as aforesaid, and shall be called promptly at the hour fixed, and in the order in which the same are docketed.

Petitions for Letters.

Rule 2. All petitions for letters testamentary of administration, or guardianship, or of conservatorship, shall state briefly the nature of the personal estate, and shall also state whether the real estate, or any part thereof, is registered under "The Torrens Act," and if so shall state the value of same.

Proof of Will.

Rule 3. The testimony taken in the matter of the proof of any last will and testament, or the contest thereof, shall be reduced to writing and filed with the clerk of the court.

Order of Inventory—Widow's Selection and Sales Bill.

Rule 4. The inventory, widow's selection and sales bill shall follow the order in which the articles are set down in the bill of appraisement, if the goods and chattels are inventoried by items; but the goods and chattels may be inventoried briefly as follows: "Goods and chattels as per appraisement bill herewith presented, appraised at _____," giving amount of appraisement bill. The inventory shall set out the condition of the

real estate and the source of decedent's title. The inventory, appraisement and award shall be presented together and not separately for approval.

Adjustment of Claims.

Rule 5. The proof of posting and publishing notices for the adjustment of claims shall be attached one to the other and filed with the clerk, on or before the first day of the term to which claimants are notified and requested to appear. The clerk shall keep a docket of all such proofs of posting and publishing adjustment notices each term, in the order filed, and the court will take up and dispose of the same in the order of such docket on the first day of the term fixed for adjustment. No order for adjustment of claims will be entered on any notice the proof of which is filed after the term for which notice was given has passed.

Manner of Presenting Claims.

Rule 6. Claims against estates shall be presented as follows: If at or before the regular adjustment term, by filing a bill of items of the claim with the clerk. If after the adjournment term, by filing a copy of the claim, together with a præcipe for a summons, to the executor or administrator, or by filing with such claim the appearance, in writing, of the executor or administrator.

The heir, or any other person interested in the estate, wishing to contest any claim filed, must enter an appearance, in writing, in the matter of such claim, briefly stating his interest in the claim or estate in which it is filed.

Claim Docket and Trial of Claims.

Rule 7. The clerk shall prepare a claim docket each term, and the court will commence the call of such docket for the trial of claims on the fourth Monday of each term, and continue such call from day to day until concluded. But no claim docket will be made or called for the July or August term. Litigated matters will not be heard on the call, but will be set down for hearing.

On the call of the claim calendar claims appearing thereon for the first time will not be heard nor set for trial when objection is made by either party; but if there be no objection, such claim will be set for trial on motion. If neither party appear, such claims will be continued. Claims appearing for the second time on the calendar will be set for trial on motion of either party, or be continued where no objection is made. Claims appearing for the third time on the calendar will be set for trial, continued by agreement, or dismissed.

Rules of Probate Court.

Default or Neglect of Executor or Administrator.

Rule 8. Upon the failure of any executor or administrator to present his inventory and appraisement to the court within three months, or cause an order of adjustment of claims to be entered within six months, or to present his account within thirteen months from the date of his letters, and every year thereafter, until the estate of his decedent is fully administered and settled, the court will order a citation to issue, and if the executor or administrator fail to appear as required by the citation, the court will order an attachment against the executor or administrator and enforce the performance of such neglected duty.

Executor's and Administrator's Report.

Rule 9. Every executor's and administrator's account shall be accompanied by a written report, signed by the executor or administrator, and verified by his affidavit, briefly stating the condition of the estate, the amount of receipts and expenditures, and the balance, if any; and such report (except in case of final account where the estate is fully administered) shall state whether the sureties on the bond of such executor or administrator are all living and residents of the State of Illinois; that such executor or administrator knows the financial condition of all such sureties, and whether they are ample security for the penalty of such bond; and if in any case any such executor or administrator, from want of knowledge concerning his sureties, or from any other cause, is unable to make a full report concerning his sureties, he shall produce them in open court at the time of rendering any such account, when they will be examined upon oath by the court.

Proof of Heirship.

Rule 10. In estates where letters have been granted, proof of heirship shall be made by the testimony of witnesses examined in open court, reduced to writing and filed with the Clerk of the Court, or by testimony taken in pursuance of a *dedimus potestatem* issued for that purpose, or by a duly authenticated copy of a decree of a court of record, finding the heirs at law of the decedent.

Whenever, in accordance with an Act entitled "An Act to render valid the ascertainment heretofore made by any of the Probate Courts of this state and declaring the heirship of deceased persons, and authorizing such courts hereafter to ascertain and declare such heirship and for other purposes relating thereto, approved June 10, 1909," it is desired to make proof of heirship in the matter of a deceased person whose estate has not been probated in this state, the procedure shall be as follows, to-wit:

First. The person desiring to prove such heirship shall file a petition in this court setting up the name, age, and last residence of the deceased; date of his death and the name and addresses so far as known to the petitioner, of his heirs at law.

Second. After filing such petition the petitioner shall publish a notice

at least once in some newspaper of general circulation in Cook County, Illinois, which notice shall be addressed to "all whom it may concern" and shall state briefly the object of the petition, the name of the deceased, the names of his heirs as shown by the petition, the date of his death, and his last place of residence, and shall name a date not less than thirty days after the date of the publication when proof will be offered. There shall be mailed by the Clerk of this Court to each person named a copy of such printed notice at least twenty days before the day set in said notice for the hearing on such question of heirship and certificate of such mailing shall be filed.

Third. The hearing may, for good cause shown, be continued from time to time, and when complete a decree shall be entered finding who are heirs at law and next of kin of such deceased, as shown by the evidence.

Notice of Resignation of Executor or Administrator.

Rule 11. Upon the petition of any executor or administrator to resign his trust such notice thereof, and of the time of hearing, shall be given to the legatees, devisees, or distributees, and to his co-executor or co-administrator, and the sureties on his bond, if any, as the court shall approve or direct, in the same manner as notice is required to be given to the heirs at law, residuary and unpaid legatees, in case of final account as provided by Rule 15, unless such legatees, devisees or distributees, and co-executor or co-administrator, and the sureties on his bond enter their appearance in writing in such matter.

Accounting of Executor or Administrator Who Has Resigned or Whose Letters Have Been Revoked.

Rule 12. The final account of any executor or administrator who has resigned his office, or whose letters have been revoked, will not be heard and passed upon by the court until such account has been submitted to and carefully examined by his successor, and the result of such examination, with the recommendation of such successor, indorsed in writing upon such account and signed by such successor, unless for good cause shown the court shall otherwise order.

Sale of Real Estate to Pay Debts by Foreign Executors and Administrators.

Rule 13. No petition for the sale of real estate to pay debts, by any foreign executor or administrator, will be heard unless the same be accompanied by a duly certified and properly authenticated copy of a just and true account of the personal estate and debts of the decedent, made to and approved by the court granting the letters testamentary or of administration, showing explicitly the amount of the personal estate, the amount of the debts allowed by such court, and the amount of the deficiency of personal estate, and also a duly certified and properly authenticated copy of an order of the court granting such letters, authorizing or directing such executor or admin-

istrator to apply to this court to obtain an order for such sale.

Report of Sale of Real Estate by Executors and Administrators.

Rule 14. Every report of sale of real estate made by an executor or administrator shall be accompanied with and have securely attached to it the publisher's certificate of publication of notice, and the affidavit of the person posting the notices, showing when and where posted, and that the places where the notices were posted are four of the most public places in the county where such real estate was sold.

Every such report shall also contain a statement by the executor or the administrator that the real estate was sold for a fair cash value, or shall state the fair cash value, and a recommendation that such report be approved and the sale confirmed, or that the sale be disapproved; and if the executor or administrator recommends that the sale be disapproved, he shall state briefly his reasons therefor, and such report shall be signed by the executor or administrator and verified by affidavit.

All such reports will be taken up by the court at any motion hour on or after the second day of the term of court succeeding the sale, and not sooner, unless on the written application of all parties interested, including the purchaser at said sale.

Notice to Heirs of Final Account.

Rule 15. No executor or administrator shall be discharged from the duties and responsibilities of his appointment, or have his final account approved (where the heirs at law, residuary and unpaid legatees, if any, do not enter their appearance in writing in such final accounting) unless he shall give notice to the heirs at law, residuary and unpaid legatees of the decedent, if any, of the time of his intended application to the court for the approval of such final account, as follows:

When the heirs at law, residuary or unpaid legatees, if any, are residents of Cook County, personal service of a copy of such notice shall be made, and in the event of the temporary absence from Cook County of such resident heirs at law, residuary or unpaid legatees, if any, a copy of such notice shall be left at the usual place of abode of such heirs, residuary or unpaid legatees, if any, with some person of the family of the age of ten years or upwards, informing such person of the contents thereof, such service to be at least ten days before such application.

When such heirs at law, residuary or unpaid legatees, if any, reside without the limits of Cook County, and in any of the United States or territories, a copy of such notice shall be published at least once in some newspaper published in the City of Chicago, at least thirty days before such application. When such heirs at law, residuary or unpaid legatees, if any, reside without the limits of the United States and territories or whose names and places of residence, either or both, are unknown to such executor or administrator, such notice shall be published at least once in some newspaper published in the City of Chicago at least sixty days before such application; and where the heirs at law, residuary or unpaid legatees, if any, or any of them, are

not residents of Cook County, such executor or administrator shall make and file with the clerk of the court his, her or their affidavit, or the affidavit of some one of them, setting forth the names and postoffice address of such heirs at law, residuary or unpaid legatees, if any, or if the same be unknown, thus stating the fact; and where the names and postoffice address are set forth in such affidavit, such executor or administrator shall cause a copy of such notice to be mailed, postage paid, to such heirs at law, residuary or unpaid legatees, to such address by the clerk of this court, within five days after such publication, and a certificate of such mailing shall be made by the clerk and filed in the proper estate. No executor or administrator shall be discharged until the final costs shall have been paid.

The court may, when the circumstances seem to require it, make special orders in estates prescribing other or different notice to the parties in interest.

GUARDIANSHIP.

Appointment of Guardian.

Rule 16. No application for the appointment of a guardian will be entertained when the infant has parents living in this State, unless upon written notice of such intended application to such parents, or if either be dead, to the survivor, setting forth the time when the same shall be heard, which notice shall be given not less than three days prior to such application, if the parent or parents reside in Cook County, and not less than ten days if non-residents of Cook County; provided, that no such notice shall be required when such parent or parents enter their appearance and consent to an immediate hearing. Special orders providing for different or other notice may be made in exceptional cases.

Guardian's Inventories and Accounts

Rule 17. Every guardian shall return to the court, verified by his affidavit, a true and perfect inventory of the real and personal estate of the ward, including therein a description of the real estate, its probable value and rental, and whether incumbered, and if so incumbered how, and for how much, what amount of money is on hand, all personal property, including annuities and credits of the ward, designating them as good, doubtful or desperate, as the case may be, within sixty days after appointment. At the expiration of one year from his or her appointment, and at least once every three years thereafter, and as much oftener as the court may require, he shall settle his accounts with the court. Upon failure to perform any of the duties required by this rule such guardian will be cited by the court and the performance of such delinquent duty enforced.

Notice of Resignation of Guardian.

Rule 18. Upon the petition of any guardian to resign his trust, such notice thereof, and of the time of hearing, shall be given as the court shall approve or direct. The final account of any guardian who has resigned or whose letters have been revoked will not be heard and passed upon by the court until such account has been submitted to and carefully examined by his successor and the result of such examination, with the rec-

ommendation of such successor, indorsed in writing upon such account and signed by such successor, unless for good cause shown the court shall otherwise order.

Leasing Ward's Real Estate.

Rule 19. The court will upon petition of the guardian, verified by his affidavit, order that the guardian lease all the ward's real estate; but before delivering any lease or possession to the lessee the guardian shall obtain the written approval of the judge of this court, indorsed on the lease, but no such approval will be given until the testimony has been taken in open court showing the rental value of the real estate.

Report of Sale of Real Estate by Guardian.

Rule 20. Every report of sale of real estate made by a guardian shall be accompanied with, and have securely attached to it, the publisher's certificate of publication of notice or an affidavit of posting of notices, as the case may be, and if the notice is by posting, showing when and where posted, and that the places where the notices were posted are three of the most public places in the county where such real estate was sold. Every such report shall also contain a statement by the guardian that the real estate was sold for a fair cash value, or shall state the fair cash value, and a recommendation that such report be approved and the sale confirmed, or that the sale be disapproved; and if the guardian recommends that the sale be disapproved, he shall state briefly the reason therefor, and such report shall be signed by the guardian and verified by his affidavit.

Final Settlement of Guardian with Ward.

Rule 21. No guardian shall be discharged from the duties of his appointment on final settlement with his ward, unless such ward appears before the court and acknowledges such settlement in full in open court; provided, where such facts are disclosed by affidavit filed with the clerk as render the personal attendance of the ward impracticable, and the court shall be satisfied, from the evidence produced in open court, that such final settlement is just and equitable, and that the ward is in possession of all his or her estate, such personal attendance of the ward may be waived by the court.

Guardian's Report.

Rule 22. Every guardian's account shall be accompanied by a written report, signed by the guardian and verified by his affidavit, briefly stating the condition of the estate, the amount of receipts and disbursements, and the balance, if any; and if the guardianship be of the custody and tuition of the minor, shall state the length of time and where the minor has attended school since the guardian's appointment or last report; and such report (except in case of final account where the estate is fully administered and delivered to the ward) shall state whether the sureties on the bond of the guardian are all living and residents of the State of Illinois, that such guardian knows the financial condition of all sureties, and whether they are ample security for the penalty of such bond; and if in any case any guardian, from want of knowledge concerning his sureties, or

from any other cause, is unable to make a full report concerning his sureties, he shall produce them in open court at the time of rendering his account, when they will be examined upon oath by the court.

Authority to Remove Personal Estate of Minor from This State by Non-Resident Guardian.

Rule 23. No authority will be given to remove personal estate of a minor from this state by a non-resident guardian, unless the application is accompanied by a duly authenticated copy of an order of the court which appointed the non-resident guardian, authorizing or directing such non-resident guardian to apply to this court for such authority.

CONSERVATORS.**Default or Neglect of Conservator.**

Rule 24. Every conservator shall return to the court, verified by his affidavit, a true and perfect inventory of the real and personal estate of his ward, with a description of the real estate, its probable value and rental, and stating whether the same is incumbered, and if incumbered, how, and for how much, what amount of money is on hand, and also containing a list of all personal property, including annuities and credits of the ward, designating them as good, doubtful or desperate, as the case may be, within sixty days after his appointment. At the expiration of one year from his appointment, and at least once every year thereafter, and as much oftener as the court may require, he shall settle his accounts as conservator with the court. Upon failure to do so, a citation will be issued and the performance of such delinquent duly enforced.

Notice of Resignation of Conservator.

Rule 25. Upon the petition of any conservator to resign his trust, such notice thereof and of the time of hearing shall be given as the court shall approve or direct. The final account of any conservator who has resigned or whose letters have been revoked will not be heard and passed upon by the court until such account has been submitted to and carefully examined by his successor; and the result of such examination, with the recommendation of such successor, indorsed in writing upon such account and signed by such successor, unless for good cause shown the court shall otherwise order.

Leasing by Conservator.

Rule 26. The court will, upon the petition of the conservator, order that the conservator lease all his ward's real estate; but before delivering any lease or possession to the lessee, that the conservator obtain the written approval of the judge of this court indorsed on the lease, but no such approval will be given until testimony has been taken in open court showing the rental value of the real estate.

Conservator's Report.

Rule 27. Every conservator's account shall be accompanied by a written report, signed by the conservator and verified by his affidavit, briefly stating the condition of the estate, the amount of receipts and disbursements, and the balance, if any, the place of residence of the ward and his physical condition, and

such report (except in case of final account where the estate is fully administered) shall state whether the sureties on the bond of the conservator are all living and residents of the State of Illinois; that such conservator knows the financial condition of all such sureties, and whether they are ample security for the penalty in such bond; and if, in any case, any conservator, from want of knowledge or from any other cause, is unable to make a full report concerning his sureties, he shall produce them in open court, at the time of rendering his account, when they will be examined upon oath by the court.

MISCELLANEOUS.**Rule to Plead.**

Rule 28. In all cases, matters and proceedings (except citations, adjustment of claims and summons to executor, administrator, guardian or conservator for revocation of letters and removal from office, and except in proceedings for the appointment of a conservator where the return day of the summons is not the first day of the term) commenced by summons, the defendant, if served with the summons ten days before the return day thereof, shall plead on or before the opening of court on the third day of the term of court to which summons is returnable.

Appearance.

Rule 29. Whenever any heir at law, devisee, legatee, creditor or other person not a party to the record, desires to contest or be heard in any matter or proceeding before the court, such heir at law, devisee, legatee, creditor or other person shall first enter an appearance in writing, briefly stating his interest in the matter or proceeding, and file the same with the clerk of the court.

Form of Papers to be Filled and Indorsement Thereon.

Rule 30. No petition, inventory, appraisalment, account, report of sale, or other document or paper necessary to be filed shall be written on less than one-half sheet of foolscap or legal cap paper, nor upon any paper which varies materially in size from such paper, and when covering more than one sheet the whole shall be fastened securely at the top, and upon the folded outside bear legibly the name of the estate to which it belongs and the name of the document, together with the number of the page and docket, showing said estate and the number of case and box.

Bond of Executors, Administrators, Guardians and Conservators with Surety.

Rule 31. No bond with surety of any executor, administrator, guardian or conservator will be approved by the court unless such bond have at least two sureties, have no interlineation or erasure, have the first name of the principal and sureties written in full in the body and signatures of the bond, and when the signature is by mark be witnessed by some person not a party to the bond. All sureties on bonds except corporations duly authorized to act as surety on bonds shall appear in person before the clerk of this court and make schedule under oath showing the property owned by them respectively.

Files.

Rule 32. No instrument duly filed shall be taken from the office of the clerk without the consent of the clerk, and then only upon receipt duly given. No paper so taken shall be kept out of the clerk's office more than two days. In no case shall any original will, bond or letters or file wrappers be taken from the clerk's office, except when taken to the court room.

Place of Sale of Real Estate.

Rule 33. All decrees and orders of this court directing the public sale of any real estate, or an interest therein, shall provide that such sale be made at the rooms of the Chicago Real Estate Board, or at the rooms of the Cook County Real Estate Board, in the City of Chicago, unless the court for cause shown shall otherwise order.

Undisposed of Papers to be Distributed.

Rule 34. Ordered, that hereafter the clerk distribute, as soon as he conveniently can, and within two days after the filing thereof, all undisposed-of papers in any matter pending in this court, except claims and proofs of publication for adjudication of claims, to the several general files of such several estates, the same as though such papers were disposed of.

Settlement of Rights of Action for Causing Death.

Rule 35. All petitions for settlements of rights of action for causing the death of any person shall be verified by the affidavit of the administrator or executor and certified to as being just and proper by the attorney of the administrator or executor, and when practicable such settlement shall be recommended by the distributees.

Attorney's Fees in Personal Injury Cases.

Rule 36. In the matter of personal injury cases which may be all or part of the assets of estates in course of administration in this court, and which are compromised or settled previous to trial, and in which counsel has been engaged on a contingent fee, executors, administrators, guardians and conservators will be allowed to pay as attorney's fees a sum not exceeding twenty-five per cent. of the amount recovered, and in all such cases where the case has been tried before a jury executors, administrators, guardians and conservators may be allowed to pay as attorney's fees a sum not exceeding one-third of the amount recovered. Said allowance to include in deceased estates the settlement of such estates in this court.

Production of Estate on Giving of New Bond.

Rule 37. Whenever an executor, administrator, guardian or conservator shall file his "New Bond" and account, and an order is sought releasing the former bondsmen from liability, such executor, administrator, guardian or conservator, shall bring into court the moneys or securities shown to be on hand and exhibit them to the court before his bondsmen are discharged.

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MUNICIPAL COURT RULES

The following rules were adopted March 31, 1910:

RULE 1. **Cases Numbered.**

All cases brought in this court shall be given a number. In filing any papers or calling the attention of the court to any case the number must be given.

RULE 2. **Service of Copy of Statement of Claim.**

In all cases of the fourth class which are to be commenced by the filing with the Clerk of a Praecepte and Statement of Claim, it shall be the duty of the plaintiff, or his attorney, to file with such Statement of Claim as many copies of the same and of the affidavit of plaintiff's claim, if there be one, as there are defendants to be served, and it shall then be the duty of the Clerk to attach to each of the copies of the summons to be served upon the defendants a copy of said Statement of Claim and affidavit, if any, and it shall be the duty of the Bailiff in serving the summons in every case to deliver to each defendant a copy of said Statement of Claim and of such affidavit at the same time that a copy of the summons is served upon him, and in making his return upon the original summons, the Bailiff shall state whether or not he has so delivered to each of the defendants a copy of such Statement of Claim and affidavit.

RULE 3. **Return Day Call of Fourth and Fifth Class Cases.**

The clerk shall make summonses returnable to such of the court rooms as may be designated by the Chief Justice. Every case in which a defendant appears in person or has filed his appearance in writing shall, if there has been no demand for a jury, be set for trial at some fixed time, and every case in which a jury trial has been demanded by either party (except attachment, replevin, garnishment, forcible detainer, distress for rent, quasi-criminal and wage claim cases) shall thereupon be placed on the next jury trial calendar and be subject to call for trial as soon as it may be reached upon the call of said calendar. Attachment, replevin, garnishment, forcible detainer, distress for rent and wage claim cases, shall, if a demand for a jury has been made, and quasi-criminal cases if no waiver in writing of a trial by jury has been filed, be immediately set down before the judge calling the same or assigned to a branch court having a jury and tried as soon as the business of the court and the rights of the litigants will permit.

RULE 4. **Call of First Class Cases.**

Every Tuesday, at 9:30 o'clock a. m., the Judge assigned to that duty shall call the cases of the first class, in which service either by publication or summons has been made in due time for default. When the cases are called, defaults may be taken and judgments entered where parties are entitled thereto. All such cases as are then at issue may be placed upon the trial calendar.

RULE 5.

Motions.

One or more Judges shall be designated by the Chief Justice to hear Motions in the First District, and all Motions in civil cases pending in the said district, whether of course or contested, except motions for new trial and motions subsequent thereto, or motions arising during the actual trial of a case, and except motions to vacate or set aside any order or finding made by some other judge, shall be heard and disposed of by such motion Judge or Judges. These last mentioned motions shall be heard only by the Judge who made the order or finding sought to be set aside, if such Judge is hearing civil cases in the district; otherwise the motion Judge may hear such motions.

RULE 6.

Approval of Bonds.

No approval of a bond given by a party to procure the discharge of a levy under an attachment, or in an appeal or stay of execution, shall be granted except. The party applying for such approval shall give reasonable notice of justification to the other party.

RULE 7.

Writ of Restitution.

No writ of restitution in forcible entry and detainer cases shall be issued until after the expiration of five days from the rendition of the judgment.

RULE 8.

Objections to Instructions.

Objections to the giving or refusing of oral instructions to the jury must be specific and must be made immediately upon the conclusion of the charge and before the jury retire.

RULE 9.

Interrogatories.

At least one day's notice in writing of an application for leave to file Interrogatories, together with a copy of said Interrogatories, must be served on the opposite side.

No Interrogatories shall be allowed to be filed calling for the production of written instruments or copies thereof, or the names of any witnesses, or for information or facts relating to the case of the opposite party solely. Interrogatories filed by the plaintiff must only call for such evidence or facts as would be necessary or proper to sustain the plaintiff's case, and when filed by the defendant for such evidence or facts as would be necessary or proper to sustain his defense.

RULE 9½.

If the plaintiff or plaintiffs fail or refuse to properly answer interrogatories propounded to them by the defendant or defendants when so ordered to do by the court, the court may dismiss the suit; and if the defendant or defendants have pleaded a set-off the court may enter judgment against the plaintiffs upon the affidavits of the defendants to their set-off. If the defendant or defendants fail or refuse to

properly answer interrogatories propounded to them by the plaintiff or plaintiffs when ordered so to do by the court, the court may strike their pleadings from the files and enter judgment as in case of default upon the plaintiff's affidavit of claim. Or the court may proceed by contempt proceedings against either such party refusing to answer.

RULE 10.
Garnishment in Attachment or on Prior Judgment.

(a) In First Class Cases:

The plaintiff shall, at the time of the issuance of a summons or writ, file written interrogatories and a copy thereof for service on each garnishee, and the Bailiff shall in serving the summons or writ deliver a copy of such interrogatories to the garnishee and the Bailiff's return shall state such delivery. If the garnishee fails to answer such interrogatories on or before the return day of such summons, the plaintiff shall be entitled to a conditional judgment and a *scire facias* against said garnishee, if service of such summons and interrogatories shall have been had at least ten days prior to such return day. If interrogatories are by leave of court filed after issuance of summons or writ, the plaintiff shall serve notice on said garnishee or garnishees of the filing of the same, together with copies of said interrogatories; service of said notice and interrogatories attached shall be verified by affidavit and filed in court. If a garnishee fails to answer such interrogatories on or before ten days from the date of the service of such notice, together with a copy of said interrogatories, the plaintiff shall be entitled to a conditional judgment and a *scire facias* against said garnishee.

(b) In Fourth Class Cases:

In garnishment cases in the fourth class the practice and proceedings shall be, as near as may be, the same as that required by law in similar cases before Justices of the Peace.

RULE 11.
Denial of Corporate Existence or Name.

In any action by or against a corporation, it shall not be necessary to prove the existence of such corporation, or that it sues or is sued by its corporate name, unless previous to the commencement of the trial, the corporate existence of such plaintiff or defendant, or that its name is correctly stated is denied by affidavit, signed by the party making such denial or by his agent or attorney.

RULE 12.

Abatement.

The defendant shall by motion to dismiss supported by affidavit set up such matters in abatement as would be set up in the Circuit Court by plea in abatement supported by affidavit.

RULE 13.

Passing and Continuing Cases.

When the principal attorney of record, or the attorney specially charged with the trial of the case of a party, is sick or actually engaged in the trial of a cause in some other court at the time the cause is called for trial, and the other party is ready, the Court shall pass the

cause for the time without prejudice where it appears by affidavit or otherwise, that the party seeking the delay has used due diligence to be ready for trial, and would have been ready but for the sickness or engagement of his attorney. Provided, that a sound discretion will be exercised by the court in the enforcement of this rule in extreme cases, in favor of plaintiffs in attachments and suits on demands which would be barred by the statutes of limitations if dismissed; and also in all cases where any substantial injury might result. No case shall be passed the second time for either of the causes above mentioned.

RULE 14.

First Class Same as Fourth.

In all cases of the first class instituted in this court on and after April 1, 1910, the pleadings shall be the same as in cases of the fourth class and they may be amended in the same manner.

RULE 15.

Plaintiff's Statement of Claim.

In first class cases the plaintiff shall file, in lieu of the declaration now provided for in the act and within the time allowed for the filing of such declaration, a statement of claim, which shall consist of a statement of the account or of the nature of the demand, and shall contain such further information as shall reasonably inform the defendant of the nature of the case he is called upon to defend.

RULE 16.

Plaintiff's Affidavit of Claim.

In first class and fourth class cases for the recovery of money only the plaintiff shall file with his statement of claim an affidavit, sworn to by the plaintiff, or by his agent or attorney, showing the nature of his demand and the amount due from the defendant after allowing the defendant all his just credits, deductions and set-offs, if any, provided that in cases for unliquidated damages the plaintiff need not state in his affidavit the amount of damages claimed.

RULE 17.

Defendant's Affidavit of Defense.

In first and fourth class cases for the recovery of money only the defendant shall file an affidavit sworn to by himself, his agent or attorney, stating that he verily believes the defendant has a good defense to said suit upon the merits to the whole or a portion of the plaintiff's demand, and specifying the nature of such defense, whether by way of denial or by way of confession and avoidance, in such a manner as to reasonably inform the plaintiff of the defense which will be interposed at the trial, and evidence of only such defenses as are set out in said affidavit shall be admitted on the trial. If the defense is to only a portion of the plaintiff's claim the affidavit shall specify the amount of such portion according to the best of the affiant's judgment and belief. Provided, however, that any defendant may, in the discretion of the court, by order duly entered, be permitted to make his defense without filing any such affidavit of merits.

The affidavit of merits required to be filed under this rule shall be filed

in first class cases in lieu of pleas now provided for in the Municipal Court act and within the time allowed for the filing of such pleas and in fourth class cases shall be filed with the defendant's appearance; provided that upon good cause shown the time for filing such affidavit may be extended for such reasonable time as the court shall order. This rule shall not apply to any case where an executor or an administrator shall defend in behalf of an estate.

If the defendant fails to file an affidavit of merits, such as is required by the rules of this court, the plaintiff shall be entitled to default and judgment upon the plaintiff's affidavit of claim on file in said cause or upon such further evidence as the court may require. If the affidavit of merits is to only a portion of the plaintiff's demand, the plaintiff shall be entitled to a judgment for the balance of his demand and the suit shall thereafter proceed as to the portion of the plaintiff's demand in dispute as if the suit has been brought therefor, but in such case the court may make such order as to the costs of suit as may be equitable. Where the defendant files an appearance, either with or without a demand for a jury trial, and fails to file with it, at that time or at such further time as the Court may allow, an affidavit of merits, or where the defendant's affidavit of merits is stricken from the files for insufficiency, the Court may then and there enter judgment as in case of default for the plaintiff upon the plaintiff's affidavit of claim in said cause, or such further evidence as the Court may require.

RULE 18.**Defendant's Affidavit of Set-Off.**

In first class and fourth class cases for the recovery of money only the defendant may file a statement of set-off or counterclaim, which shall be accompanied by an affidavit, which statement and affidavit shall comply in all respects with the rules for the plaintiff's statement of claim and affidavit, and shall have the same force and effect. Such statement of set-off or counterclaim shall in first class cases be filed within the time allowed under the Municipal Court act for the filing of pleas, and in fourth class cases shall be filed with the defendant's appearance; provided, however, the court may in its discretion extend the time for filing such statement and affidavit. The plaintiff shall be required to file an affidavit of merits of defense thereto within such time as the court may order in the same manner and to the same extent and with the same effect that a defendant is required under the last rule to file an affidavit of merits of defense to the plaintiff's statement of claims.

RULE 19.**Specific Denial Required.**

Every allegation of fact in any statement of claim or of counterclaim or set-off, if not denied specifically or by necessary implication in the affidavit of defense filed in reply by the opposite party, shall be taken to be admitted, except as against an infant or a lunatic.

RULE 20.**No General or Evasive Denial Allowed.**

It shall not be sufficient or a defendant in his affidavit of merits to deny generally the facts alleged by the

statement of claim, or for a plaintiff in his affidavit to deny generally the facts alleged by the defendant in his statement of counterclaim or set-off, but each party shall deal specifically with each allegation of which he does not admit the truth, except allegations of damages. Any denial of any allegation of fact made by the opposite party must not be evasive, but must answer the point of substance; provided that either party may, upon motion, be excused by the court from specifically answering any particular allegation upon showing to the court that such party cannot so answer such allegation because he does not have the necessary knowledge as to the fact alleged or for other good cause.

RULE 21.**Plaintiff's Affidavit of Reply.**

If the plaintiff does not file any affidavit in reply to the defendant's affidavit of merits of defense, he shall be considered to have joined issue thereon, and such joinder of issue shall operate as a denial of every material allegation of fact in the defendant's affidavit of merits upon which issue is so joined, but the plaintiff may file an affidavit in reply, setting up special facts, and in that event his reply will operate as a denial of the facts not admitted. Any subsequent affidavit (if any) filed by the defendant by way of rejoinder, or by the plaintiff by way of surrejoinder, shall be subject to the same rules as the plaintiff's affidavit in reply. No affidavit shall materially change the nature of the cause of action or defense as set forth in the prior statement of claim or affidavit in that line of pleading of the same party, but may set up new matter by way of confession and avoidance. Any departure in an affidavit in violation of this rule shall be ground for sustaining a motion to strike it from the record. This provision has no application to any departure of an amended statement of claim or affidavit from the one amended.

RULE 22.**Demurrers Abolished.**

No demurrer shall be allowed, but the court may, on motion, order any statement of claim or affidavit of merits of defense to be stricken out on the ground that such statement of claim or affidavit does not reasonably inform the defendant or the plaintiff, as the case may be, of the cause of action or defense relied upon by the party filing the same, or the court may order a more specific or amended statement or affidavit to be filed.

If it appears that the party filing a statement of claim or affidavit is relying on a cause of action or defense that is clearly unfounded in law, the court may order the same stricken out and the action to be dismissed or judgment to be entered accordingly as may be just.

RULE 23.**Practice Act Provisions.**

Sections 13, 14, 17, 18, 24, 25, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 41, 42, 43, 45, 48, 49, 52, 53, 54, 58, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 76, 77, 79, 80, 81, 85, 88, 89, 95, 97, 98, 103, 104, 105 and 126 of the Practice Act entitled "An Act in relation to the practice and procedure in courts of record," approved June 3, 1907, in force July 1, 1907, shall be held to apply to and govern all civil proceedings (quasi-criminal proceedings only excepted) in the Municipal Court as near as may be consistently

with the provisions of the Municipal Court Act approved May 18, 1905, as amended by the Act approved June 3, 1907.

Sections 74 and 75 of said Practice Act shall be held to apply to and govern all cases, civil or criminal, in the Municipal Court when the trial judge shall elect to charge the jury in writing, and only then, and

Sections 65, 76, 77, 81, 85, 89, 95, 96 and 97 shall be held to apply to and govern all criminal and quasi-criminal cases in the Municipal Court.

CRIMINAL AND QUASI-CRIMINAL CASES.

RULE 24.

No Chief of Police, Captain of Police, Lieutenant of Police or Sergeant of Police shall admit to bail any person charged with any criminal offense while a Judge of the Municipal Court is in attendance at a branch court in the police district where such bail is offered.

RULE 25.

Any Chief of Police, Captain of Police, Lieutenant of Police or Sergeant of Police taking bail from any person or persons before accepting the surety offered as a bondsman shall cause such surety to fill out in writing and under oath the following blank:

State of Illinois, County of Cook, City of Chicago—ss. In the Municipal Court of Chicago. The People of the State of Illinois, Plaintiff, v. _____, Defendant. Charge _____ being first duly sworn as to his sufficiency as bail in the above entitled proceeding, says, in answer to the following questions, as follows:

Q.—What is your name? Ans.—

Q.—Where do you reside? Ans.—

Q.—What is your business? Ans.—

Q.—Do you own any real estate? If so, where situated, and of what does it consist, giving both the legal description and street number of said real estate? Ans.—, all in the County of Cook and State of Illinois.

Q.—What is it worth? Ans.—

Q.—How is it improved? Ans.—

Q.—Is it your homestead? Ans.—

Q.—When did you purchase, of whom, and what did you pay? Ans.—

Q.—Are there any mortgages, trust deeds or incumbrances upon same, and, if so, to what amount, and when due? Ans.—

Q.—Is the property in your name alone? Ans.—

Q.—Is the deed or deeds on record? Ans.—

Q.—Are you surety for any one else, and if so, to what amount, and for what? Ans.—

Q.—Are there any judgments against you? Ans.—

Q.—Are there any proceedings in foreclosure now pending against you on any property in which you are interested? Ans.—

Q.—What are you worth over and above your indebtedness? Ans.—

Q.—On whose request do you offer yourself as ballor? Ans.—

Q.—Are you surety on any forfeited bonds? Ans.—

Subscribed and sworn to before me, this _____ day of _____ A. D., 190—.

Provided no schedule shall be required from any surety company authorized to become surety on bonds in the court pursuant to order of the court.

RULE 26.

Any defendant arrested in any criminal case in which the Municipal Court has original jurisdiction, or in any quasi-criminal case may, in lieu of giving bail for his appearance, deposit with the Clerk or with any chief of police, captain of police, lieutenant of police or desk sergeant of police a sum of money as follows:

For a violation of Section 1454 of the Revised Municipal Code of Chicago of 1905, \$25 to \$100.

For a violation of Section 2454 of the Revised Municipal Code of Chicago of 1905, \$200.

For a violation of Section 1772 of the Revised Municipal Code of Chicago of 1905, \$50 to \$200.

For a violation of Section 154 of the Revised Municipal Code of Chicago of 1905, \$25 to \$75.

For a violation of Section 1465 of the Revised Municipal Code of Chicago of 1905, \$50 to \$200.

For assault and battery, \$25 to \$100.

In bastardy cases, \$550.

In all other cases a sum equivalent to the maximum fine provided as a punishment for the offense.

RULE 27.

No bond shall be taken from a person charged with misdemeanor by any Chief of Police, Captain of Police, Lieutenant of Police or Sergeant of Police, unless the value of the real estate scheduled and offered by the person proposing to become surety shall be worth double the amount of the bond required after deducting from the fair value of the property offered all incumbrances on said property, the value of the homestead, dower rights and all other indebtedness of said surety.

RULE 28.

No such Chief of Police, Captain of Police, Lieutenant of Police or Sergeant of Police shall accept any surety or take any bond unless he, from the above questions and answers, is satisfied that the person so offering himself as surety is financially responsible and that a judgment on a forfeiture, in case the bond be forfeited, can be collected from such person offering himself as surety.

RULE 29.

All of the above blanks shall be attached to the bail bond and kept as a part of the record and filed in the office of the Clerk of the Municipal Court.

RULE 30.

All suits for violation of the City Ordinances commenced by summons in the First District shall be filed in the main office of the Clerk of Court, No. 148 Michigan avenue, but any Judge sitting in any Branch Court in the First District may, in his discretion, order a summons issued in such a case and made returnable before him. Every case for violation of City Ordinances in which a warrant shall issue in the first instance may be begun in the Branch Court in the First District nearest the residence of the defendant in said cases.

RULE 31.

All warrants, capias, writs of attachment and other process commanding the arrest of persons mentioned therein shall, in case of arrest, be returnable forthwith, and in case of non-arrest shall be returnable thirty (30) days after issuance, unless otherwise ordered by the court. Alias warrants, capias, writs of attachment and other process commanding the arrest of persons mentioned therein may be issued upon the order of the court.

Rules of the Municipal Court of Chicago

RULE 32.

The Chief Justice of this Court shall have power and authority to prescribe abbreviated and amplified forms of entries of orders, judgments and decrees in this court, which abbreviated forms shall stand for and represent the respective amplified forms thereof. The entry by any branch court of any order, judgment or decree in such prescribed abbreviated form shall to all intents and purposes and legal effect be the adoption by the Court so directing such order, judgment or proceeding to be entered of the amplified form or part thereof used, data supplied in the blanks in said abbreviated form being otherwise supplied in said amplified form, the Court having regard for and contemplating said amplified form with said data as the true order, judgment or proceeding of the court, when so directing the same to be entered in such abbreviated form. And in such case any names, dates, amounts, or other words and figures that may accompany or be entered with such abbreviated form shall be deemed to be, in legal effect, and to all intents and purposes, incorporated with said amplified form in the blank spaces therein as the context may require, and said amplified form, together with said names, dates, amounts and other words and figures as aforesaid, shall constitute the true proceedings and record thereof of the Court, without any further elaboration or expansion of such abbreviated form. Upon the preparation by the Clerk of a certified transcript in amplified form of any proceedings in any cause that have been entered only in abbreviated form, or upon the request of any person for the extension in amplified form of any such proceedings and the payment to the Clerk of the same fees as are required for a certified transcript, the Clerk shall extend said proceedings in amplified form. Said proceedings so extended shall be accompanied by proper placita and preambles and shall be certified under the hand of the Clerk and the seal of the Court to be a true extended record of certain proceedings in such cause, which extended record, when so certified, shall have placed thereon the file mark of the Clerk and shall be preserved as a permanent record among the files of the cause. (Added Nov. 10, 1911, by General Order No. 181.)

RULE 33.

In all suits for the violation of municipal ordinances of the City of Chicago, or any municipal corporation situated in whole or in part within the limits of said city, a complaint sworn to by some person, setting forth that an ordinance has been violated, shall, before any process be issued, be filed in said suit, whereupon a summons or a warrant shall be issued against the defendant as the court, after examination under oath of the party making such complaint, shall direct. If a summons be issued it shall be made returnable to the branch court from which it issued at 9:30 a. m. on a day certain, not less than five days from the filing

of such complaint, and shall be served by delivering a copy thereof to the party named therein as defendant, and informing him of the contents thereof. There shall be attached to the summons thus served a copy of the complaint. Provided, however, it shall not be required that such complaint be sworn in suits prosecuted by and in the name of the city attorney; said city attorney may prosecute his suits with or without the sworn complaint. But in cases in which no sworn complaint is filed summons only shall issue in such suit.

All summons issued in such suits shall be directed to any police officer of the City of Chicago or to the bailiff of the Municipal Court, and shall have printed or stamped thereon in large red letters the following words:

"If you fail to obey this summons, a warrant will issue for your arrest."

In making up the call sheet for the day, the cases shall be classified as "warrant cases" and "summons cases," and as far as practicable all warrant cases shall be called for trial first. (Added Nov. 15, 1911, by General Order No. 183.)

RULE 34.

In all cases of arrest upon view without a warrant by an officer for the violation of a municipal ordinance, of a teamster, or owner of a vehicle, charged with operating the same without a license, or without having paid the vehicle tax, or with blocking traffic; and in all cases of peddlers upon wagons charged with peddling without a license or with crying their wares; and in all cases of arrest on view of the owners or drivers of automobiles, automobile trucks or motorcycles for failure to comply with the State law or Municipal Code, or with the ordinances of any park board within said city, requiring a license or the payment of a wheel tax, or for the manner of lighting or attaching numbers to such vehicle, or for violation of any smoke or noise ordinance; or the owner or driver of an automobile, automobile truck or motorcycle charged with violating the speed laws of the State of Illinois or the City of Chicago, or of any park board within said city, where no personal injury has resulted to anyone on account of such driving, the person so arrested shall at once be taken to the police station and immediately released upon signing his individual bond in the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00), requiring him to appear upon the following court day for trial, upon the person arrested making and delivering to the desk sergeant or other officer in charge of the station an affidavit setting forth his name, that he is a resident of the City of Chicago, his place of residence and his place of business, with whom residing, occupation, by whom employed and the place of business of his employment, and in the case of the arrest of the driver of a vehicle or automobile, the correct name and home and business address of the owner thereof.

Provided, however, that in all cases of arrest for speeding where personal injury has resulted to anyone, or when the driver of the vehicle or automom-

bile is intoxicated, a bond with proper surety shall be required; and provided, further, that this order shall not be construed to apply to arrests for keeping a gambling house or for being an inmate thereof, or for street walking, or for keeping a house of prostitution or being an inmate thereof, or for drunkenness where the party is in a helpless or a semi-helpless condition, or for being a pickpocket or confidence man, or for carrying concealed weapons, or for violating any ordinance against public decency. (Added Nov. 15, 1911, by General Order No. 183.)

RULE 35.

All applications for certificates of good moral character shall be filed in the office of the Clerk of this Court, together with the recommendations in writing of two or more sponsors, at least ten days before being presented to the Court on motion.

If objections have been filed to any such application, same shall not be presented to the Court except upon notice to the objector. (Added Jan. 15, 1912, by General Order No. 190.)

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RULES OF PRACTICE
OF THE
Criminal Court of Cook County

IN FORCE JUNE 1, 1913

Holding Court.

Rule 1. Ten o'clock in the forenoon shall be the hour for opening court.

Removal of Papers.

Rule 2. No papers filed shall be delivered and taken away to any other person than an attorney in the case or his clerk, known to be such; nor shall the entire files or any bond, writ or other process be delivered to any other person than a bailiff or deputy clerk of this court.

The clerk of the court will not permit any pleading or papers in case be withdrawn without an order of court.

On good cause shown any judge holding Criminal Court, may on application permit the original files to be withdrawn, the same to be returned within three days.

Any person withdrawing without leave of court, any papers filed with the clerk in a case will be deemed in contempt of court.

Motions.

Rule 3. Motions of course shall be heard and disposed of in order on the opening of court, and before the trial call for the day, by the judge on whose trial call the case has been placed, or to whom said case has been assigned. A memorandum of all such notices stating the number, the title of the case, the nature of the motion briefly, together with the name of the attorney or party making the motion, shall be placed upon a motion book provided by the clerk of the court, by the attorney in the case or the moving party before the opening of court. No attorney shall rise to address the court upon a motion until it has been called in its regular order from the motion book by the clerk.

All motions not of course and to quash indictments shall be made in

writing and filed with the clerk by or before 4 p. m. of the day before the motion will be called, stating the grounds of the motion specifically, and when founded on matters of fact not shown by the files of the case or other proceedings of record therein, such facts must be presented by affidavit which shall be filed with the motion with the minute clerk of the judge before whom the motion is to be made and a copy thereof served with the notice of the motion.

Counter affidavits may be filed in opposition to such motions, except that counter or supplementary affidavits will not be allowed on a motion for continuance.

Notice of Motions.

Rule 4. No motion shall be heard or order made in any case without notice to the defendant, when made by the state's attorney, or to the state's attorney when made by the defendant, except when a case is reached on the regular trial call. Notice of motions must be in writing, state in substance the motion, designate the judge before whom the same is to be made, and the time and place of hearing, and shall be served by delivering a copy to the opposite party or his attorney of record before 4 p. m. of the business day next preceding the day mentioned in the notice, either personally or by leaving a copy thereof at his office with some person in charge thereof on his behalf, and it shall be supported by affidavit whenever based on matters of fact not appearing of record or by the files in the case, but all notices served on Saturday, shall be served before 12 o'clock noon of that day.

Continuing Cases and Setting Same for Trial.

Rule 5. When the state's attorney or his assistant in charge of the trial of

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Rules of Criminal Court.

the case or the defendant or his attorney of record on his behalf is ill or actually engaged in the trial of a case in some other court, or the assistant state's attorney assigned to the case is necessarily engaged in preparing for the trial of another case, at the time the case is called for trial, and the opposing party is ready, the court shall pass the case for the time without prejudice where it appears by affidavit or otherwise to the satisfaction of the court, that the party securing a delay in the trial of the case has used due diligence to be ready for trial and would have been ready but for such illness or engagement; provided a sound discretion will be exercised by the court in the enforcement of this rule in certain cases in favor of the prosecution or defense.

Any such case so passed shall be in order to be called for trial upon one day's notice at any time after the cause for which the same is passed shall cease.

Service of Rules and Orders.

Rule 6. The service of rules or orders made by the court shall be made by delivering a verified copy thereof. When neither the defendant nor his attorney resides in or has an office in the City of Chicago all notices may be served by mail and when the defendant has appeared by his attorney, service of any rule, order or notice made on such attorney shall be sufficient unless the object to bring the defendant into contempt for disobeying a rule or order in which case service shall be made upon the defendant personally or by registered letter.

Habeas Corpus.

Rule 7. When a petition for habeas corpus is presented to a judge there shall be endorsed thereon a minute of the order, refusing or granting the writ.

Contested Motions and Motions for New Trial.

Rule 8. Motions not of course or contested motions, except motions for a continuance, shall be heard on each Saturday after disposition of motions for new trial which shall also be heard on Saturday unless the court may see fit to hear them when made.

The clerk will, from time to time, prepare a calendar of contested motions. Such motions will be placed in the order of which notice thereof is given to him.

A peremptory call of such motions will be made on Saturday of each week unless otherwise ordered by the court.

Instructions and Forms of Verdict.

Rule 9. All instructions and forms of verdict must be presented to the court at the conclusion of the evidence in the trial of the case and copies thereof delivered by the state's attorney to the defendant's attorney and by the defendant's attorney to the state's attorney, and attorneys shall, as far as possible, avoid repeating the same proposition of law in said instructions.

Upon request of either the state's attorney or the defendant's attorney and before commencement of argument in the case, the court should hear, away from the presence of the jury, objections to any requested instructions or forms of verdict.

Appearance and Withdrawal of Attorney.

Rule 10. Each attorney for a defendant shall enter his appearance in writing both with the clerk and state's attorney, giving his office address, and no attorney will be permitted to withdraw his appearance for a defendant unless the court shall be satisfied by affidavit or otherwise, to-wit, that such defendant has had reasonable notice of the attorney's intention to withdraw his appearance from the case.

Before appointing an attorney for a defendant, the judge should make inquiry as to whether or not the defendant is able to hire counsel, and when an attorney is appointed the clerk of this court shall, unless the attorney so appointed is in open court at the time of his appointment, notify said attorney personally or by mail and the attorney shall within five days after receiving the notice enter his appearance as required by this rule, and if said attorney discovers at any time prior to the trial that the defendant is able to employ counsel, it shall be the duty of said attorney to bring the facts to the attention of the court.

RULES OF THE United States Circuit Court of Appeals

FOR THE SEVENTH CIRCUIT

AND THE

ACT OF CONGRESS CREATING THE COURT

With Amendments to February 21, 1910

1. Name.

The title of the court shall be "United States Circuit Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit."

2. Seal.

The seal shall contain the words "United States" on the upper part of the outer edge, and the words "Circuit Court of Appeals," on the lower part of the outer edge, running from left to right, and the words "Seventh Circuit" in two lines, in the center with a dash beneath.

3. Terms.

A term of this court shall be held annually at the City of Chicago on the first Tuesday in October, and continue until the first Tuesday in October of the succeeding year. Every term shall be adjourned to such time and places as the Court may from time to time designate. Unless otherwise specially ordered, the court will hold at Chicago three sessions for the hearing of causes during each term, beginning on the first Tuesdays in October and January, respectively, and the second Tuesday in April.

4. Quorum.

1. If, at any term or session, a quorum does not attend on any day appointed for holding it, any judge who does attend may adjourn the court from time to time, or, in the absence of any judge, the clerk may adjourn the court from day to day. If, during a term or session, after a quorum has assembled, less than that number attend on any day, any judge attending may adjourn the court from day to day until there is a quorum or may adjourn without a day.

2. Any judge attending when less than a quorum is present may make all necessary orders touching any suit, proceeding, or process depending in or returned to the court preparatory to hearing, trial or decision thereof.

5. Clerk.

1. The clerk's office shall be kept in Chicago.

2. The clerk shall not practice either as attorney or counsellor, in this court or in any other court.

3. He shall, before he enters on the execution of his office, take an oath in the form prescribed by Section 794 of the Revised Statutes, and shall give bond in a sum to be fixed and with sureties to be approved by the court, faithfully to discharge the duties of his office and seasonably to record the decrees, judgments and determinations of the court. A copy of such bond

shall be entered on the journal of the court, and the bond shall be deposited for safe keeping as the court shall direct.

4. He shall not permit any original record or paper to be taken from the court room or from the office without an order from the court.

5. All fees collected by the clerk which are not properly taxable as costs in any case and which are not by law required to be by him deposited in the Treasury of the United States, shall constitute a fund to be expended by the clerk under the direction of the court in the purchase of law books for the library of the court.

6. The clerk shall keep an accurate and itemized account of all moneys received by him officially, including costs and fees in cases in the court and fees and moneys collected on any account whatever, and shall deposit the same as received daily to his credit as clerk and separately from all individual accounts in a national bank designated by the senior judge; and at the end of each month and whenever required by the court or senior judge shall submit to the senior judge a detailed report showing by items all moneys received and all paid out during the month and the total balances on hand from each and all sources of receipt. Each report shall be accompanied by a statement over the signature of the cashier or other officer of the bank in which the deposit is kept of the amount in the bank to the credit of the clerk at the close of the last day included in the report.

6. Marshal, Crier and Other Officers.

1. The crier and bailiffs of the court, before entering upon their duties, shall take an oath in the form prescribed by Section 782 of the Revised Statutes.

2. The marshal and crier shall be in attendance during the sessions of the court, with such number of bailiffs and messengers as the court may from time to time order.

7. Attorneys and Counsellors.

All attorneys and counsellors admitted to practice in the Supreme Court of the United States or in any Circuit Court of the United States, or in the Supreme Court of a state in this circuit, may become attorneys and counsellors in this court on taking an oath or affirmation in the form prescribed by rule 2 of the Supreme Court of the United States, and on subscribing the roll.

8. Practice.

The practice, so far as may be, shall

Rules of United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

be the same as in the Supreme Court of the United States.

9. Process.

All process of this court shall be in the name of the President of the United States, and shall be in like form and tested in the same manner as process of the Supreme Court.

10. Bill of Exceptions and Transcript.

1. The judges of the Circuit and District courts shall not allow any bill of exceptions which shall contain the charge of the court at large to the jury in trials at common law, and upon any general exception to the whole of said charge. But the party excepting shall be required to state distinctly the several matters of law in the charge to which he excepts, and those matters of law, and those only, shall be inserted in the bill of exceptions and allowed by the court.

2. A bill of exceptions shall contain of the evidence only such a statement as is necessary for the presentation and decision of questions saved for review, and unless there be saved a question which requires the consideration of all the evidence, a bill of exceptions containing all the evidence shall not be allowed.

3. No document shall be copied more than once in a bill of exceptions or in a transcript of the record of the case, but instead there shall be inserted a reference to the one copy set out. A motion for a new trial and orders and entries relating thereto shall not be set out in the transcript unless required by written praecipe, of which a copy shall also be set out.

4. The cost of unnecessary matter in the bill of exceptions or transcript or in the printed record shall not be recovered of the appellee or defendant in error, and in its discretion the court will in case of dispute appoint a referee to determine and report what was necessary therein, and will tax the cost of the reference as shall seem just.

11. Assignment of Errors.

The plaintiff in error, or appellant, shall file with the clerk of the court below, with his petition for the writ of error or appeal, an assignment of errors which shall specify separately and particularly each error asserted and intended to be urged. No writ of error or appeal shall be allowed until such assignment of errors shall have been filed. When the error alleged is to the admission or to the rejection of evidence, the specification of the error shall quote the full substance of the evidence admitted or rejected. When the evidence rejected is oral testimony a written statement of the substance of what the witness was expected to testify shall be filed and brought to the attention of the court before the retirement of the jury. When the error alleged is to the charge of the court, each specification of error shall set out the part referred to *totidem verbis*, whether it be instructions given or in instructions refused, and shall state distinctly the grounds of objection to an instruction given. Such assignment of errors shall form part of the transcript of the record and be printed with it. When this is not done counsel will not be heard, except at the request of

the court, and errors not assigned according to this rule will be disregarded, but the court at its option may notice a plain error not assigned. (See Rule 24, post.)

12. Objections to Evidence in the Record.

In all cases of equity or admiralty jurisdiction, heard in this court, no objection shall be allowed to be taken to the admissibility of any deposition, deed, grant or exhibit or translation found in the record as evidence, unless objection was taken thereto in the court below and entered of record; but the same shall be otherwise deemed to have been admitted by consent.

13. Supersedeas and Cost Bonds.

1. Supersedeas bonds in the Circuit and District courts must be taken with good and sufficient security, that the plaintiff in error or appellant will prosecute his writ or appeal to effect, and answer all damages and costs if he fail to make his plea good. Such indemnity, where the judgment or decree is for the recovery of money not otherwise secured, must be for the whole amount of the judgment or decree, including just damages for delay, and interest and costs on the appeal; but in all suits where the property in controversy necessarily follows the suit, as in real actions and replevin, and in suits on mortgages, or where the property is in the custody of the marshal under admiralty process, or where the proceeds thereof, or a bond for the value thereof, is in the custody of the court, indemnity in all such cases will be required only in an amount sufficient to secure the sum recovered for the use and detention of the property, and the costs of the suit and damages for delay and interest and costs on the appeal.

2. On all appeals from any interlocutory order or decree granting or continuing an injunction in a Circuit or District court, the appellant shall, at the time of the allowance of said appeal, file with the clerk of such Circuit or District court a bond to the opposite party in such sum as such court shall direct, to answer all costs if he shall fail to sustain his appeal.

14. Writs of Error, Appeals, Return and Record.

1. The clerk of the court, to which any writ of error may be directed, shall make a return of the same by transmitting a true copy of the record, bill of exceptions, assignment of errors, and all proceedings in the case necessary to the hearing in this court, under his hand and seal of the court. The clerk may require of the appellant or plaintiff in error a written praecipe stating in detail what the transcript shall contain, and when a praecipe is filed shall insert a copy thereof in the transcript.

2. In all cases brought to this court, by writ of error or appeal, to review any judgment or decree, the clerk of the court by which such judgment or decree was rendered shall annex to and transmit with the record a copy of the opinion or opinions filed in the case.

3. No case will be heard until a complete record shall have been filed,

Rules of United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

containing in itself, and not by reference, all the papers, exhibits, depositions, and other proceedings necessary to the hearing in this court.

4. Whenever it shall be necessary or proper in the opinion of the presiding judge in any Circuit or District court, that original papers of any kind should be inspected in this court upon writ of error or appeal, such presiding judge may make such rule or order for the safe-keeping, transporting and return of such original papers as to him may seem proper, and this court will receive and consider such original papers in connection with the transcript of the proceeding.

5. All appeals, writs of error and citations must be made returnable not exceeding thirty days from the date on which the appeal is allowed, or the writ of error issued, whether the return fall in vacation or in term time, and be served before the return day. If a party be non-resident the citation and any other writ or notice necessary in the prosecution of the appeal or writ of error may be served upon such party's counsel or attorney of record, who for such purpose may not be discharged unless another resident be designated of record in the case upon whom service may be made.

6. The record in cases of admiralty and maritime jurisdiction shall be made up as provided in General Admiralty Rule No. 52 of the Supreme Court.

15. Translations.

Whenever any record transmitted to this court upon a writ of error or appeal shall contain any document, paper, testimony, or other proceeding in a foreign language, and the record does not also contain a translation of such document, paper, testimony or other proceeding, made under the authority of the inferior court, or admitted to be correct, the record shall not be printed, but the case shall be reported to this court by the clerk, and the court will thereupon remand it back to the inferior court, in order that a translation may be there supplied and inserted in the record.

16. Docketing Cases.

1. It shall be the duty of the plaintiff in error or appellant to docket the case and file the record thereof with the clerk of this court by or before the return day, whether in vacation or in term time. But for good cause shown the justice or judge who signed the citation, or any judge of this court, may enlarge the time by or before its expiration, the order of enlargement to be filed with the clerk of this court. If the plaintiff in error or appellant shall fail to comply with this rule, the defendant in error or appellee may have the cause docketed and dismissed upon producing a certificate, whether in term or vacation, from the clerk of the court wherein the judgment or decree was rendered, stating the case and certifying that such writ of error or appeal had been duly sued out or allowed. And in no case shall the plaintiff in error or appellant be entitled to docket the case and file the record after the same shall have been

docketed and dismissed under this rule, unless by order of the court.

2. But the defendant in error or appellee may, at his option, docket the case and file a copy of the record with the clerk of this court, and if the case is docketed and a copy of the record filed with the clerk of this court by the plaintiff in error or appellant within the period of time above limited and prescribed by this rule, or by the defendant in error or appellee at any time thereafter, the case shall stand for argument in due course.

3. Upon the filing of the transcript of a record brought up by writ of error or appeal, the appearance of the counsel for the party docketing the case shall be entered.

17. Docket.

The clerk shall prepare calendars of causes for the regular terms of this court, to be held on the first Tuesday of October in each year, and for each adjourned session; placing thereon in proper chronological order only cases in which the record having been printed, briefs upon both sides have been filed seven days before the beginning of the term or session.

18. Certiorari.

No certiorari for diminution of the record will be hereafter awarded in any case, unless a motion therefor shall be made in writing, and the facts on which the same is founded shall, if not admitted by the other party, be verified by affidavit. And any motion for such certiorari must be made at the first term of the entry of the case, otherwise the same will not be granted, unless upon special cause shown to the court, accounting satisfactorily for the delay.

19. Death of a Party.

1. Whenever, pending a writ of error or appeal in this court, either party shall die, the proper representatives in the personalty or realty of the deceased party, according to the nature of the case, may voluntarily come in, and be admitted parties to the suit, and thereupon the case shall be heard and determined as other cases, and if such representatives shall not voluntarily become parties, then the other party may suggest the death on the record, and thereupon, on motion, obtain an order that unless such representatives shall become parties within sixty days, the party moving for such order, if defendant in error, shall be entitled to have the writ of error or appeal dismissed, and if the party so moving shall be plaintiff in error, he shall be entitled to open the record, and, on hearing, have the judgment or decree reversed, if it be erroneous. Provided, however, that a copy of every such order shall be personally served on such representatives at least thirty days before the expiration of such sixty days.

2. When the death of a party is suggested and the representatives of the deceased do not appear within ten days after the expiration of such sixty days, and no measure shall have been taken by the opposite party within that time to compel their appearance, the writ of error or appeal shall abate.

Rules of United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

3. When either party to a suit in a Circuit or District Court of the United States shall desire to prosecute a writ of error or appeal to this court from any final judgment or decree rendered in the Circuit or District Court, and at the time of suing out such writ of error or appeal, the other party to the suit shall be dead and have no proper representative within the jurisdiction of the court which rendered such final judgment or decree, so that the suit cannot be revived in that court, but shall have a proper representative in some State or Territory in the United States, or in the District of Columbia, the party desiring such writ of error or appeal may procure the same, and may have proceedings on such judgment or decree superseded or stayed in the same manner as is now allowed by law in other cases, and shall, thereupon, proceed with such writ of error or appeal as in other cases. And within thirty days after the filing of the record in this court, the plaintiff in error or appellant shall make a suggestion to the court supported by affidavit, that the said party was dead when the writ of error or appeal was taken or sued out, and had no proper representative within the jurisdiction of the court which rendered such judgment or decree so that the suit could not be revived in that court, and that said party had a proper representative in some State or Territory of the United States, or in the District of Columbia, and stating therein the name and character of such representative, and the State or Territory or District in which such representative resides, and upon such suggestion, he may on motion obtain an order that unless such representative shall make himself a party within ninety days, the plaintiff in error or appellant shall be entitled to open the record, and, on hearing, have the judgment or decree reversed if the same be erroneous:

Provided, however, that a proper citation reciting the substance of such order shall be served upon such representative, either personally or by being left at his residence, at least thirty days before the expiration of such ninety days:

Provided, also, that in every such case, if the representative of the deceased party does not appear within ten days after the expiration of such ninety days, and the measures above provided to compel the appearance of such representative have not been taken within the time as above required, by the opposite party, the case shall abate; and provided, also, that the said representative may at any time, before or after said suggestion, come in and be made a party to the suit, and thereupon the case shall proceed and be heard and determined as other cases. (See Sec. 9, Act of March 3, 1875. Sup. Rev. Stat., p. 177.)

20. Dismissing Cases.

Whenever the parties to a writ of error or an appeal shall, by their attorneys of record, sign and file with the clerk an agreement in writing directing the case to be dismissed, and specifying the terms on which it is to be dismissed, in respect to costs, and shall pay to the clerk any fees that

may be due to him, the clerk shall enter the case dismissed, and shall give to either party requesting it a copy of the agreement filed, but no mandate or other process shall issue without an order of the court

21. Motions.

1. All motions to the court shall be reduced to writing and shall contain a brief statement of the facts and the object of the motion.

2. One-half hour on each side shall be allowed for the argument of a motion, and no more, without special leave of the court, granted before the argument begins.

3. No motion to dismiss, except on special assignment by the court, shall be heard, unless previous notice has been given to the adverse party, or the counsel or attorney of such party.

22. Parties not Ready.

1. Where no counsel appears, and no brief has been filed for the plaintiff in error or appellant, when the case is called for trial the other party may have the writ of error or appeal dismissed.

2. If the appellee or defendant in error fails to appear when the case is called, the court may proceed to hear argument on the part of the plaintiff in error or appellant and to give judgment according to the right of the case.

3. When a case is reached in the regular call of the docket, and there is no appearance for either party, and no brief on file for the appellant or plaintiff in error, the case shall be dismissed at the cost of the appellant or plaintiff in error.

23. Printing the Record.

1. In all cases the plaintiff in error or appellant on docketing a case and filing the record shall enter into an undertaking to the clerk with surety to be approved by the clerk for the payment of all costs which shall be incurred in the cause, shall deposit with the clerk twenty-five dollars to be applied to the payment of costs and fees, and from time to time when necessary shall, on the demand of the clerk, make further deposits for that use.

2. The clerk, upon the docketing of a case, shall forthwith cause an estimate to be made of the cost of printing the record and of his fees for preparing it for the printer and for supervising the printing thereof, and shall at once notify the attorney for the plaintiff in error, or appellant, of the amount of such estimate, which shall be paid to the clerk within ten days after such notice. If not so paid, the writ of error or appeal may be dismissed upon the motion of the opposite party, or by the court of its own motion.

3. The clerk shall cause the record in each case to be printed forthwith after the payment of such estimate, and shall immediately thereafter furnish to each of the respective parties at least three copies of the printed record, taking a receipt therefor. The parties may, by written stipulation filed with or prior to the filing of the record, agree that only parts of the record shall be printed, and the case

Rules of United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

will be heard on the parts so printed only, unless the court shall direct the printing of other parts.

4. The clerk shall cause at least twenty-five copies of the record to be printed and may print a larger number on the request of either party on the payment of the amount necessary for the printing of such extra copies.

5. The clerk shall supervise the printing and see that the printed record is indexed properly, and in a manner to indicate briefly the character of each document and exhibit referred to. He shall distribute the printed copies to the judges of the court from time to time as required. If the cost of printing the record, together with the clerk's fee for supervising the same, shall be less than the amount estimated and paid, the difference shall be refunded by the clerk to the party paying the same. If the actual cost and the clerk's fee shall exceed the estimate, the amount of the excess shall be paid to the clerk before he shall deliver or file the printed record or copies thereof.

6. In case of reversal, affirmance or dismissal with costs, the amount of the cost of the printing of the record and of the clerk's fee for supervising the same, shall be taxed against the party against whom costs are given, and shall be inserted in the body of the mandate or other proper process.

7. Upon the clerk's producing satisfactory evidence by affidavit, or by the acknowledgment of the parties or their sureties or attorneys, of having served a copy of the bill of fees due from them respectively in this court on such parties, their sureties or attorneys, an attachment shall issue against such parties or their sureties, respectively, to compel the payment of said fees.

8. The clerk shall adopt a uniform size for the printing of all records, shall have them printed in small pica type, on clear white paper, with a margin of not less than an inch and a half, shall show by note or memorandum on the margin the time when each pleading or document was filed, and at the top of the pages shall insert running titles of their contents.

9. The briefs of attorneys shall be printed, and shall conform as nearly as practicable to the size of the printed record.

10. The clerk shall, on or before the conclusion of each case, collect and file or otherwise preserve together one copy of the printed record and of each brief, printed motion and argument submitted therein.

11. In any case where the record shall have been printed in the court below, in substantial conformity to these rules, the presiding judge may on the application of the plaintiff in error or appellant order that such printed record be used in place of the printing hereinbefore provided for. But the clerk shall prepare and cause to be printed and attached to such record an index, and shall be paid the same fees for the indexing and supervising thereof as if printed under his supervision.

12. The clerk of this court shall obtain sealed proposals for the printing hereinbefore provided for, which proposals shall be submitted to the senior

circuit judge of the court, who may award such printing to the lowest and best bidder, and all such printing shall be done by the person to whom the same is so awarded, except in emergencies when printing may be done by another at the same or less price. And when a case shall be heard upon the record printed below, the costs for printing shall be taxed on the basis of actual cost not exceeding the rate of the accepted bid.

13. The fees of the clerk of this court, as prescribed by order of the Supreme Court, made February 28, 1898, are as follows:

24. Briefs.

1. The counsel for the plaintiff in error or appellant shall file with the clerk of this court, within twenty days after the date of the delivery by the clerk of the printed record, twenty copies of a printed brief, one of which shall, on application, be furnished to each of the counsel engaged upon the opposite side.

2. This brief shall contain, in the order here stated, and under the respective titles, "Statement of Case," "Errors Relied Upon," and "Brief of Argument":

(1) A concise abstract, or statement of the case, presenting succinctly the questions involved, in the manner in which they are raised.

(2) A specification of the errors relied upon, which, in cases brought up by writ of error, shall set out

Rules of United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

separately and particularly each error asserted and intended to be urged, and in cases brought up by appeal the specification shall state, as particularly as may be, in what the decree is alleged to be erroneous. When the error alleged is to the admission or to the rejection of evidence, the specification shall quote the full substance of the evidence admitted or rejected. When the error alleged is to the charge of the court, the specifications shall set out the part referred to *totidem verbis*, whether it be in an instruction given or in one refused. When the error alleged is to a ruling upon the report of a master the specifications shall state the exception to the report and the action of the court upon it. Following each specification there shall be a reference by page to the portion of the printed record on which the question arises.

(3) A brief of the argument exhibiting a clear statement of the points of law or fact to be discussed, with a reference to the pages of the record and the authorities relied upon in support of each point. When a statute of a state is cited, so much thereof as may be deemed necessary to the decision of the case shall be printed at length.

3. The counsel for the defendant in error or the appellee shall file with the clerk twenty printed copies of his brief within twenty days after the filing of the brief of the plaintiff in error or appellant. His brief shall conform to the requirements of this rule except that no specification of errors shall be required, and no statement of the case, unless that presented by the plaintiff in error or appellant is controverted. Either party, at or before the argument of the case, may file a supplemental brief strictly confined to matter in reply to the brief of the opposite party.

4. When there is no assignment of errors, as required by section 997 of the Revised Statutes, counsel will not be heard, except at the request of the court, and errors not specified according to this rule, and rule 11, ante, will be disregarded; but the court at its option may notice a plain error involving the merits of the case, though not assigned or specified, and though the question be not saved according to the strict rules of practice, if it be apparent of record that the point was contested and not waived in the court below.

5. When, according to this rule, a plaintiff in error or appellant is in default, the case may be dismissed on motion, and when a defendant in error or appellee is in default, he will not be heard except on consent of his adversary, or by request of the court.

6. When no counsel appears for one of the parties, and no printed brief or argument has been filed, only one counsel will be heard for the adverse party, but if a printed brief or argument has been filed, the adverse party will be entitled to be heard by two counsel.

25. Oral Arguments.

1. The plaintiff in error or appellant in this court shall be entitled to open and conclude the argument of the case. But when there are cross-

appeals they shall be argued together as one case, and the plaintiff in the court below shall be entitled to open and conclude the argument.

2. Only two counsel will be heard for each party on the argument of a case.

3. Two hours on each side will be allowed for the argument and no more, without special leave of the court granted before the argument begins. The time thus allowed may be apportioned between the counsel on the same side at their discretion; provided, always, that a fair opening of the case shall be made by the party having the opening and closing arguments.

4. Reading at length from briefs or reported cases shall not be indulged.

26. Opinions of the Court.

1. All opinions delivered by the court shall, immediately upon the delivery thereof, be handed to the clerk to be recorded.

2. The original opinions of the court shall be filed with the clerk of this court for preservation.

3. Opinions printed under the supervision of the judge delivering the same need not be copied by the clerk into a book of records, but, at the end of each term, the clerk shall cause such printed opinions to be bound in a substantial manner into one or more volumes, and when so bound they shall be deemed to have been recorded within the meaning of this rule.

27. Rehearing.

A petition for rehearing must be filed within thirty days after entry of judgment or decree, or after filing of the opinion, shall be in print, and be served forthwith by copy upon the opposing party, who, within twenty days from such service, may file a printed answer, and the petition shall be determined without oral arguments, unless otherwise ordered. If a petition be not filed within the time allowed, and upon the overruling of a petition, the clerk shall, without special order, issue the mandate of the court to the court below. Twenty copies of such petition or answer shall be filed with the clerk of this court.

28. Interest.

1. When a judgment for the payment of money is affirmed by this court, the interest thereon shall be calculated and levied from the date of the judgment below until the same is paid, and at the same rate that similar judgments bear interest in the courts of the State where such judgment was rendered.

2. In all cases where a writ of error shall delay the proceedings on the judgment of the inferior court, and shall appear to have been sued out merely for delay, damages at a rate not exceeding ten per cent., in addition to interest, shall be awarded on the amount of the judgment.

3. The same rule shall be applied to decrees for the payment of money in cases in equity, unless otherwise ordered by this court.

4. In cases in admiralty, damages and interest may be allowed, if specially directed by the court.

5. In cases where money is paid into court, any party interested may move

Rules of United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

for an order that the clerk deposit the same under the direction of the court. On deposits so made, the clerk shall account for such interest as he may have collected on the fund. But without such order he shall not be required to account for interest.

29. Costs.

1. When any suit shall be dismissed in this court, except for want of jurisdiction, costs shall be allowed to the defendant in error or appellee, unless otherwise agreed by the parties.

2. In every case of a judgment or decree affirmed in this court costs shall be allowed to the defendant in error or appellee unless otherwise ordered by the court.

3. In every case of reversal of a judgment or decree in this court costs shall be allowed to the plaintiff in error or appellant unless otherwise ordered by the court. The costs of the transcript of the record from the court below shall be taxable in that court as costs in the case.

4. No costs shall be allowed in this court for or against the United States.

5. When costs are allowed in this court, it shall be the duty of the clerk to insert the amount thereof in the body of the mandate, or other proper process, sent to the court below, directing to award execution thereupon and to annex to the same the bill of items taxed in detail.

6. In all cases certified to the Supreme Court or removed thereto by certiorari or otherwise, the fees of the clerk of this court shall be paid before a transcript of the record shall be transmitted to the Supreme Court.

30. Mandate.

In all cases finally determined in this court, a mandate or other proper process in the nature of a procedendo shall be issued, on the order or by the rule of this court, to the court below, for the purpose of informing such court of the proceedings in this court, so that further proceedings may be had in such court as to law and justice may appertain.

31. Custody of Prisoners on Habeas Corpus.

1. Pending an appeal from the final decision of any court or judge declining to grant the writ of habeas corpus, the custody of the prisoner shall not be disturbed.

2. Pending an appeal from the final decision of any court or judge discharging the writ after it has been issued, the prisoner shall be remanded to the custody from which he was taken by the writ, or shall, for good cause shown, be detained in the custody of the court or judge, or be enlarged upon recognizance, as herein after provided.

3. Pending an appeal from the final decision of any court or judge discharging the prisoner, he shall be enlarged upon recognizance, with surety for appearance to answer the judgment of the Appellate Court except where, for special reasons, sureties ought not to be required.

32. Models, Diagrams and Exhibits.

Models, diagrams and exhibits of ma-

terial forming part of the evidence taken in the court below, and in any case pending in this court on writ of error or appeal, shall be placed in the custody of the marshal for the use of this court at least ten days before the case is heard or submitted; and shall be taken away by the parties within one month after the case is decided. When this is not done, it shall be the duty of the marshal to notify the counsel in the case, by mail or otherwise, of the requirements of this rule, and, if the articles are not removed within a reasonable time after the notice is given, he shall destroy or make such other disposition of them as to him may seem best.

33. Law Library.

1. The library of the court shall be under the general supervision and custody of the clerk of the court.

2. No book shall be removed from the library except upon a written order of a judge of this court, except that during the sessions of the court any lawyer who has a case upon the docket, upon written application to the clerk and upon the clerk's written order, may take from the library not exceeding three volumes at a time, being responsible for the return thereof within twenty-four hours, and in default of return shall pay to the clerk for the library fund twice the value thereof, but if returned in good condition one dollar for each day's detention beyond the limited time.

34. Writs of Error in Criminal Cases.

1. Writs of error from this court to review criminal cases tried in any district or circuit court of the United States within this circuit, may be allowed in term time or in vacation by the circuit justice assigned to this circuit, or by any of the circuit judges within the circuit, or by any district judge within his district, and the proper security be taken, and the citation signed by him, and he may also grant a supersedeas and stay of execution or proceedings, pending the determination of such writ of error.

2. Where such writ of error is allowed in the criminal cases aforesaid, the circuit court or the district court before which the accused was tried, or the district judge of the district wherein he was tried, within his district, or the circuit justice assigned to this circuit, or any of the circuit judges within the circuit, shall have the power, after the citation has been duly served, to admit the accused to bail and to fix the amount of such bail.

Approved March 3, 1891.

Chap. 517. An act to establish circuit courts of appeals and to define and regulate in certain cases the jurisdiction of the courts of the United States, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That there shall be appointed by the President of the United States, by

and with the advice and consent of the Senate, in each circuit an additional circuit judge, who shall have the same qualifications, and shall have the same power and jurisdiction therein that the circuit judges of the United States, within their respective circuits, now have under existing laws, and who shall be entitled to the same compensation as the circuit judges of the United States in their respective circuits now have.

Sec. 2. That there is hereby created in each circuit a circuit court of appeals, which shall consist of three judges, of whom two shall constitute a quorum, and which shall be a court of record with appellate jurisdiction, as is hereafter limited and established. Such court shall prescribe the form and style of its seal and the form of writs and other process and procedure as may be conformable to the exercise of its jurisdiction as shall be conferred by law. It shall have the appointment of the marshal of the court with the same duties and powers under the regulations of the court as are now provided for the marshal of the Supreme Court of the United States, so far as the same may be applicable. The court shall also appoint a clerk, who shall perform and exercise the same duties and powers in regard to all matters within its jurisdiction as are now exercised and performed by the clerk of the Supreme Court of the United States, so far as the same may be applicable. The salary of the marshal of the court shall be twenty-five hundred dollars a year, and the salary of the clerk of the court shall be three thousand dollars a year, to be paid in equal proportions quarterly. The costs and fees in the Supreme Court now provided for by law shall be costs and fees in the circuit courts of appeals; and the same shall be expended, accounted for, and paid for, and paid over to the Treasury Department of the United States in the same manner as is provided in respect to the costs and fees in the Supreme Court.

The court shall have power to establish all rules and regulations for the conduct of the business of the court within its jurisdiction as conferred by law.

Sec. 3. That the Chief-Justice and the associate justices of the Supreme Court assigned to each circuit, and the circuit judges within each circuit, and the several district judges within each circuit, shall be competent to sit as judges of the circuit court of appeals within their respective circuits in the manner hereinafter provided. In case the Chief-Justice or an associate justice of the Supreme Court should attend at any session of the circuit court of appeals, he shall preside, and the circuit judges in attendance upon the court in the absence of the Chief-Justice or associate justice of the Supreme Court shall preside in the order of the seniority of their respective commissions.

In case the full court at any time shall not be made up by the attendance of the Chief-Justice or an associate justice of the Supreme Court and circuit judges, one or more district judges within the circuit shall be competent to sit in the court according to

such order or provision among the district judges as either by general or particular assignment shall be designated by the court: Provided, That no justice or judge before whom a cause or question may have been tried or heard in a district court, or existing court, shall sit on the trial or hearing of such cause or question in the circuit court of appeals. A term shall be held annually by the circuit court of appeals in the several judicial circuits, at the following places: In the first circuit, in the city of Boston; in the second circuit, in the city of New York; in the third circuit, in the city of Philadelphia; in the fourth circuit, in the city of Richmond; in the fifth circuit, in the city of New Orleans; in the sixth circuit, in the city of Cincinnati; in the seventh circuit, in the city of Chicago; in the eighth circuit, in the city of Saint Louis; in the ninth circuit, in the city of San Francisco; and in such other places in each of the above circuits as said court may from time to time designate. The first terms of said courts shall be held on the second Monday in January, eighteen hundred and ninety-one, and thereafter at such times as may be fixed by said courts.

Sec. 4. That no appeal, whether by writ of error or otherwise, shall hereafter be taken or allowed from any district court to the existing circuit courts, and no appellate jurisdiction shall hereafter be exercised or allowed by said existing circuit courts, but all appeals by writ of error or otherwise, from said district courts, shall only be subject to review in the Supreme Court of the United States or in the circuit court of appeals hereby established, as is hereinafter provided, and the review by appeal, by writ of error, or otherwise, from the existing circuit courts shall be had only in the Supreme Court of the United States or in the circuit courts of appeals hereby established according to the provisions of this act regulating the same.

Sec. 5. That appeals or writs of error may be taken from the district courts or from the existing circuit courts, direct to the Supreme Court, in the following cases:

In any case in which the jurisdiction of the court is in issue; in such cases the question of jurisdiction alone shall be certified to the Supreme Court from the court below for decision.

From the final sentences and decrees in prize causes.

In cases of a conviction of a capital or otherwise infamous crime.

(See amendment, page 27.)

In any case that involves the construction or application of the Constitution of the United States.

In any case in which the constitutionality of any law of the United States, or the validity or construction of any treaty made under its authority, is drawn in question.

In any case in which the constitution or law of a State is claimed to be in contravention of the Constitution of the United States.

Nothing in this act shall affect the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court in cases appealed from the highest court of a State, nor the construction of the

statute providing for a review of such cases.

Sec. 6. That the circuit court of appeals established by this act shall exercise appellate jurisdiction to review by appeal or by writ of error final decisions in the district court and the existing circuit courts in all cases other than those provided for in the preceding section of this act, unless otherwise provided by law, and the judgments or decrees of the circuit courts of appeals shall be final in all cases in which the jurisdiction is dependent entirely upon the opposite parties to the suit or controversy, being aliens and citizens of the United States or citizens of different States; also in all cases arising under the patent laws, under the revenue laws, and under the criminal laws, and in admiralty cases, excepting that in every such subject within its appellate jurisdiction the circuit court of appeals at any time may certify to the Supreme Court of the United States any questions or propositions of law concerning which it desires the instruction of that court for its proper decision. And thereupon the Supreme Court may either give its instruction on the questions and propositions certified to it, which shall be binding upon the circuit courts of appeals in such case, or it may require that the whole record and cause may be sent up to it for its consideration, and thereupon shall decide the whole matter in controversy in the same manner as if it had been brought there for review by writ of error or appeal.

And excepting also that in any such case as is hereinbefore made final in the circuit courts of appeals it shall be competent for the Supreme Court to require, by certiorari or otherwise, any such case to be certified to the Supreme Court for its review and determination with the same power and authority in the case as if it had been carried by appeal or writ of error to the Supreme Court.

In all cases not hereinbefore in this section made final there shall be of right an appeal or writ of error or review of the case by the Supreme Court of the United States where the matter in controversy shall exceed one thousand dollars besides costs. But no such appeal shall be taken or writ of error sued out unless within one year after the entry of the order, judgment or decree sought to be reviewed.

An Act to amend the seventh section of the Act entitled "An Act to establish circuit courts of appeals and to define and regulate in certain cases the jurisdiction of the courts of the United States, and for other purposes," approved March third, eighteen hundred and ninety-one, and the several Acts amendatory thereto.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the seventh section of the Act of Congress entitled "An Act to establish circuit courts of appeals and to define and regulate in certain cases the jurisdiction of the courts of the United States, and for other purposes," approved March third, eighteen hundred and ninety-one, as amended by Act approved June sixth, nineteen hun-

dred, be, and it is hereby, amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 7. That where, upon a hearing in equity in a district or in a circuit court, or by a judge thereof in vacation, an injunction shall be granted or continued, or a receiver appointed by an interlocutory order or decree, in any cause an appeal may be taken from such interlocutory order or decree granting or continuing such injunction, or appointing such receiver, to the circuit court of appeals: Provided, That the appeal must be taken within thirty days from entry of such order or decree, and it shall take precedence in the appellate court; and the proceedings in other respects in the court below shall not be stayed unless otherwise ordered by that court, or by the appellate court, or a judge thereof, during the pendency of such appeal: Provided further, That the court below may, in its discretion, require as a condition of the appeal an additional bond."

Approved, April 14, 1906.

Sec. 8. That any justice or judge, who, in pursuance of the provisions of this act, shall attend the circuit court of appeals held at any place other than where he resides shall, upon his written certificate, be paid by the marshal of the district in which the court shall be held his reasonable expenses for travel and attendance, not to exceed ten dollars per day, and such payment shall be allowed the marshal in the settlement of his accounts with the United States.

Sec. 9. That the marshals of the several districts in which said circuit court of appeals may be held shall, under the direction of the Attorney-General of the United States, and with his approval, provide such rooms in the public buildings of the United States as may be necessary, and pay all incidental expenses of said court, including criers, bailiffs and messengers: Provided, however, That in case proper rooms cannot be provided in such buildings, then the said marshals, with the approval of the Attorney-General of the United States, may, from time to time, lease such rooms as may be necessary for such courts. That the marshals, criers, clerks, bailiff and messengers shall be allowed the same compensation for their respective services as are allowed for similar services in the existing circuit courts.

Sec. 10. That whenever on appeal or writ of error or otherwise a case coming directly from the district court or existing circuit court shall be reviewed and determined in the Supreme Court the cause shall be remanded to the proper district or circuit court for further proceedings to be taken in pursuance of such determination. And whenever on appeal or writ of error or otherwise a case coming from a circuit court of appeals shall be reviewed and determined in the Supreme Court the cause shall be remanded by the Supreme Court to the proper district or circuit court for further proceedings in pursuance of such determination. Whenever on appeal or writ of error or otherwise a case coming from a district or circuit court shall be reviewed and determined in the circuit

court of appeals in a case in which the decision in the circuit court of appeals is final such cause shall be remanded to the said district or circuit court for further proceedings to be there taken in pursuance of such determination.

Sec. 11. That no appeal or writ of error by which any order, judgment, or decree may be reviewed in the circuit courts of appeals under the provisions of this act shall be taken or sued out except within six months after the entry of the order, judgment, or decree sought to be reviewed: Provided, however, That in all cases in which a lesser time is now by law limited for appeals or writs of error such limits of time shall apply to appeals or writs of error in such cases taken to or sued out from the circuit courts of appeals. And all provisions of law now in force regulating the methods and system of review, through appeals or writs of error, shall regulate the methods and system of appeals and writs of error provided for in this act in respect of the circuit courts of appeals, including all provisions for bonds or other securities to be required and taken on such appeals and writs of error, and any judge of the circuit courts of appeals, in respect to cases brought or to be brought to that court, shall have the same powers and duties as to the allowance of appeals or writs of error, and the conditions of such allowance, as now by law belong to the justices or judges in respect of the existing courts of the United States, respectively.

Sec. 12. That the circuit court of appeals shall have the powers specified in section seven hundred and sixteen of the Revised Statutes of the United States.

Sec. 13. Appeals and writs of error may be taken and prosecuted from the decisions of the United States court in the Indian Territory to the Supreme Court of the United States, or to the circuit court of appeals in the eighth circuit, in the same manner and under the same regulations as from the circuit or district courts of the United States, under this act.

Sec. 14. That section six hundred and ninety-one of the Revised Statutes of the United States and section three of an act entitled "An act to facilitate the disposition of cases in the Supreme Court, and for other purposes," approved February sixteenth, eighteen hundred and seventy-five, be, and the same are hereby repealed. And all acts and parts of acts relating to appeals or writs of error inconsistent with the provisions for review by appeals or writs of error in the preceding sections five and six of this act are hereby repealed.

Sec. 15. That the circuit court of appeal in cases in which the judgments of the circuit courts of appeal are made final by this act shall have the same appellate jurisdiction, by writ of error or appeal, to review the judgments, orders, and decrees of the supreme courts of the several Territories as by this act they may have to review the judgments, orders, and decrees of the district court, and circuit courts;

and for that purpose the several Territories shall, by orders of the Supreme Court, to be made from time to time, be assigned to particular circuits.

Joint Resolution to Provide for the Organization of the Circuit Courts of Appeals, March 3, 1891.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the first meetings of the several circuit courts of appeals mentioned in the act of Congress passed at this present session, entitled, "An act to establish circuit courts of appeals, and to define and regulate, in certain cases, the jurisdiction of the courts of the United States, and for other purposes," shall be held on the third Tuesday in June, A. D. 1891; and if, from any casualty, the first meeting of any of said courts shall fail to be so held on that day, the first meeting of any such court so failing to be held shall be held on such day subsequent thereto as the Chief Justice, or any justice of the Supreme Court of the United States assigned to such circuit, shall direct. And be it further resolved, That nothing in said act shall be held or construed in anywise to impair the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court or any circuit court of the United States in any case now pending before it, or in respect of any case wherein the writ of error or the appeal shall have been sued out or taken to any of said courts before the first day of July, anno domini eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

Chap. 68. An Act to withdraw from the Supreme Court jurisdiction of criminal cases not capital and confer the same on the Circuit Courts of Appeals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That so much of Section five of the act entitled "An Act to establish Circuit Courts of Appeals, and to define and regulate in certain cases the jurisdiction of the courts of the United States, and for other purposes," approved March third, eighteen hundred and ninety-one, as reads "in cases of conviction of a capital or otherwise infamous crime," be amended by striking out the words "or otherwise infamous" so that the same will read "in cases of conviction of a capital crime"; and that appeals, or writs of error may be taken from the district courts or circuit courts to the proper circuit court of appeals in cases of conviction of an infamous crime not capital; Provided, That no case now pending in the Supreme Court or in which an appeal or writ of error shall have been taken or sued out before the passage of this Act shall be hereby affected, but in all such cases the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court shall remain, and said Supreme Court shall proceed therein as if this Act had not been passed.

Rules of United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

Approved July 1, 1898.

Sec. 24 and Sec. 25 of an Act to establish a uniform system of Bankruptcy throughout the United States relating to jurisdiction of Appellate Courts and to Appeals and Writs of Error.

Sec. 24. Jurisdiction of Appellate Courts.—a. The Supreme Court of the United States, the circuit courts of appeals of the United States, and the supreme courts of the Territories, in vacation in chambers and during their respective terms, as now or as they may be hereafter held, are hereby invested with appellate jurisdiction of controversies arising in bankruptcy proceedings from the courts of bankruptcy from which they have appellate jurisdiction in other cases. The Supreme Court of the United States shall exercise a like jurisdiction from courts of bankruptcy not within any organized circuit of the United States and from the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia.

b. The several circuit courts of appeals shall have jurisdiction in equity, either interlocutory or final, to superintend and revise in matter of law the proceedings of the several inferior courts of bankruptcy within their jurisdiction. Such power shall be exercised on due notice and petition by any party aggrieved.

Sec. 25. Appeals and Writs of Error.—a. That appeals, as in equity cases, may be taken in bankruptcy proceedings from the courts of bankruptcy to the circuit court of appeals of the United States, and to the supreme court of the Territories, in the following cases, to wit: (1) from a judgment adjudging or refusing to adjudge the defendant a bankrupt; (2) from a judgment granting or denying a discharge; and (3) from a judgment allowing or rejecting a debt or claim of five hundred dollars or over. Such appeal shall be taken within ten days after the judgment appealed from has been rendered, and may be heard and determined by the appellate court in term or vacation, as the case may be.

b. From any final decision of a court of appeals, allowing or rejecting a claim under this act, an appeal may be had under such rules, and within such time as may be prescribed by the Supreme Court of the United States, in the following cases and no other:

1. Where the amount in controversy exceeds the sum of two thousand dollars, and the question involved is one which might have been taken on appeal or writ of error from the highest court of a State to the Supreme Court of the United States; or

2. Where some Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States shall certify that in his opinion the determination of the question or questions involved in the allowance or rejection of such claim is essential to a uniform construction of this act throughout the United States.

c. Trustees shall not be required to give bond when they take appeals or sue out writs of error.

d. Controversies may be certified to the Supreme Court of the United States from other courts of the United States, and the former court may ex-

ercise jurisdiction thereof and issue writs of certiorari pursuant to the provisions of the United States laws now in force or such as may be hereafter enacted.

Section XXXVI of General Orders in Bankruptcy Adopted by the Supreme Court of the United States, November 28, 1889.

XXXVI.

Appeals.

1. Appeals from a court of bankruptcy to a circuit court of appeals, or to the supreme court of a Territory, shall be allowed by a judge of the court appealed from or of the court appealed to and shall be regulated, except as otherwise provided in the act, by the rules governing appeals in equity in the courts of the United States.

2. Appeals under the act to the Supreme Court of the United States from a circuit court of appeals, or from the supreme court of a Territory, or from the supreme court of the District of Columbia, or from any court of bankruptcy whatever, shall be taken within thirty days after the judgment or decree, and shall be allowed by a judge of the court appealed from, or by a justice of the Supreme Court of the United States.

3. In every case in which either party is entitled by the act to take an appeal to the Supreme Court of the United States, the court from which the appeal lies shall, at or before the time of entering its judgment or decree, make and file a finding of the facts, and its conclusions of law thereon, stated separately; and the record transmitted to the Supreme Court of the United States on such an appeal shall consist only of the pleadings, the judgment or decree, the finding of facts, and the conclusions of law.

Rule 37 of the Supreme Court of the United States.

37. Cases from Circuit Courts of Appeals.

1. Where, under section 6 of the said act, a circuit court of appeals shall certify to this court a question or proposition of law, concerning which it desires the instruction of this court for its proper decision, the certificate shall contain a proper statement of the facts on which such question or proposition of law arises.

2. If application is thereupon made to this court that the whole record and cause may be sent up to it for its consideration, the party making such application shall, as a part thereof, furnish this court with a certified copy of the whole of said record.

3. Where application is made to this court under section 6 of the said act to require a case to be certified to it for its review and determination, a certified copy of the entire record of the case in the circuit court of appeals shall be furnished to this court by the applicant, as a part of the application.

RULES OF PRACTICE

FOR THE

Courts of Equity of the United States

Promulgated November 4, 1912

RULE 1.

District Court Always Open for Certain Purposes—Orders at Chambers.

The District Courts, as courts of equity, shall be deemed always open for the purpose of filing any pleading, of issuing and returning mesne and final process, and of making and directing all interlocutory motions, orders, rules and other proceedings preparatory to the hearing, upon their merits, of all causes pending therein.

Any district judge may, upon reasonable notice to the parties, make, direct and award, at chambers or in the clerk's office, and in vacation as well as in term, all such process, commissions, orders, rules and other proceedings, whenever the same are not grantable of course, according to the rules and practice of the court.

RULE 2.

Clerk's Office Always Open, Except Etc.

The clerk's office shall be open during business hours on all days, except Sundays and legal holidays, and the clerk shall be in attendance for the purpose of receiving and disposing of all motions, rules, orders and other proceedings which are grantable of course.

RULE 3.

Books Kept by Clerk and Entries Therein.

The clerk shall keep a book known as "Equity Docket," in which he shall enter each suit, with a file number corresponding to the folio in the book. All papers and orders filed with the clerk in the suit, all process issued and returns made thereon, and all appearances shall be noted briefly and chronologically in this book on the folio assigned to the suit and shall be marked with its file number.

The clerk shall also keep a book entitled "Order Book," in which shall be entered at length, in the order of their making, all orders made or passed by him as of course and also all orders made or passed by the judge in chambers.

He shall also keep an "Equity Journal," in which shall be entered all orders, decrees and proceedings of the court in equity causes in term time.

Separate and suitable indices of the Equity Docket Order Book and Equity Journal shall be kept by the clerk under the direction of the court.

RULE 4.

Notice of Orders.

Neither the noting of an order in the Equity Docket nor its entry in the Order Book shall of itself be deemed notice to the parties or their solicitors; and when an order is made without prior notice to, and in the absence of, a party, the clerk, unless otherwise directed by the court or judge, shall forthwith send a copy thereof, by mail, to such party or his solicitor and a note of such mailing shall be made in the Equity Docket, which shall be taken as sufficient proof of due notice of the order.

RULE 5.

Motions Grantable of Course by Clerk.

All motions and applications in the clerk's office for the issuing of mesne process or final process to enforce and execute decrees; for taking bills pro confesso; and for other proceedings in the clerk's office which do not require any allowance or order of the court or of a judge, shall be deemed motions and applications grantable of course by the clerk; but the same may be suspended, or altered, or rescinded by the judge upon special cause shown.

RULE 6.

Motion Day.

Each District Court shall establish regular times and places, not less than once each month, when motions requiring notice and hearing may be made and disposed of; but the judge may at any time and place, and on such notice, if any, as he may consider reasonable, make and direct all interlocutory orders, rulings and proceedings for the advancement, conduct and hearing of causes. If the public interest permits, the senior circuit judge of the circuit may dispense with the motion day during not to exceed two months in the year in any district.

RULE 7.

Process, Mesne and Final.

The process of subpoena shall constitute the proper mesne process in all suits in equity, in the first instance, to require the defendant to appear and answer the bill; and, unless otherwise provided in these rules or specially ordered by the court, a writ of attachment and, if the defendant cannot be found, a writ of sequestration, or a writ of assistance to en-

force a delivery of possession, as the case may require, shall be the proper process to issue for the purpose of compelling obedience to any interlocutory or final order or decree of the court.

RULE 8.**Enforcement of Final Decrees.**

Final process to execute any decree may, if the decree be solely for the payment of money, be by a writ of execution, in the form used in the District Court in suits at common law in actions of assumpsit. If the decree be for the performance of any specific act, as, for example, for the execution of a conveyance of land or the delivering up of deeds of other documents, the decree shall, in all cases, prescribe the time within which the act shall be done, of which the defendant shall be bound, without further service, to take notice; and upon affidavit of the plaintiff, filed in the clerk's office, that the same has not been complied with within the prescribed time, the clerk shall issue a writ of attachment against the delinquent party, from which, if attached thereon, he shall not be discharged, unless upon a full compliance with the decree and the payment of all costs, or upon a special order of the court, or a judge thereof, upon motion and affidavit, enlarging the time for the performance thereof. If the delinquent party cannot be found a writ of sequestration shall issue against his estate, upon the return of non est inventus, to compel obedience to the decree. If a mandatory order, injunction or decree for the specific performance of any act or contract be not complied with, the court or a judge, besides, or instead of, proceedings against the disobedient party for a contempt or by sequestration, may by order direct that the act required to be done be done, so far as practicable, by some other person appointed by the court or judge, at the cost of the disobedient party, and the act when so done shall have like effect as if done by him.

RULE 9.**Writ of Assistance.**

When any decree or order is for the delivery of possession, upon proof made by affidavit of a demand and refusal to obey the decree or order, the party prosecuting the same shall be entitled to a writ of assistance from the clerk of the court.

RULE 10.**Decree for Deficiency in Foreclosures, Etc.**

In suits for the foreclosure of mortgages, or the enforcement of other liens, a decree may be rendered for any balance that may be found due to the plaintiff over and above the proceeds of the sale or sales, and execution may issue for the collection of the same, as is provided in rule 8 when the decree is solely for the payment of money.

RULE 11.**Process in Behalf of and Against Persons Not Parties.**

Every person, not being a party in any cause, who has obtained an order, or in whose favor an order shall have been made, may enforce obedience to such order by the same process as if he were a party; and every person, not being a party, against whom obedience to any order of the court may be enforced, shall be liable to the same process for enforcing obedience to such orders as if he were a party.

RULE 12.**Issue of Subpoena—Time for Answer.**

Whenever a bill is filed, and not before, the clerk shall issue the process of subpoena thereon, as of course, upon the application of the plaintiff, which shall contain the names of the parties and be returnable into the clerk's office twenty days from the issuing thereof. At the bottom of the subpoena shall be placed a memorandum, that the defendant is required to file his answer or other defense in the clerk's office on or before the twentieth day after service, excluding the day thereof; otherwise the bill may be taken pro confesso. Where there are more than one defendant, a writ of subpoena may, at the election of the plaintiff, be sued out separately for each defendant, or a joint subpoena against all the defendants.

RULE 13.**Manner of Serving Subpoena.**

The service of all subpoenas shall be by delivering a copy thereof to the defendant personally, or by leaving a copy thereof at the dwelling house or usual place of abode of each defendant, with some adult person who is a member of or resident in the family.

RULE 14.**Alias Subpoena.**

Whenever any subpoena shall be returned not executed as to any defendant, the plaintiff shall be entitled to other subpoenas against such defendant until due service is made.

RULE 15.**Process, by Whom Served.**

The service of all process, mesne and final, shall be by the marshal of the district, or his deputy, or by some other person specially appointed by the court or judge for that purpose, and not otherwise. In the latter case, the person serving the process shall make affidavit thereof.

RULE 16.**Defendant to Answer—Default—Decree Pro Confesso.**

It shall be the duty of defendant, unless the time shall be enlarged, for cause shown, by a judge of the court, to file his answer or other defense to the bill in the clerk's office within the time named in the subpoena as required by rule 12. In default thereof the plaintiff may, at his election,

take an order as of course that the bill be taken pro confesso; and thereupon the cause shall be proceeded in ex parte.

RULE 17.**Decree Pro Confesso to Be Followed by Final Decree—Setting Aside Default.**

When the bill is taken pro confesso the court may proceed to a final decree at any time after the expiration of thirty days after the entry of the order pro confesso, and such decree shall be deemed absolute, unless the court shall, at the same term, set aside the same, or enlarge the time for filing the answer, upon cause shown upon motion and affidavit. No such motion shall be granted, unless upon the payment of the costs of the plaintiff up to that time, or such part thereof as the court shall deem reasonable, and unless the defendant shall undertake to file his answer within such time as the court shall direct, and submit to such other terms as the court shall direct, for the purpose of speeding the cause.

RULE 18.**Pleadings—Technical Forms Abrogated.**

Unless otherwise prescribed by statute or these rules the technical forms of pleadings in equity are abolished.

RULE 19.**Amendments Generally.**

The court may at any time, in furtherance of justice, upon such terms as may be just, permit any process, proceeding, pleading or record to be amended, or material supplemental matter to be set forth in an amended or supplemental pleading. The court, at every stage of the proceeding, must disregard any error or defect in the proceeding which does not affect the substantial rights of the parties.

RULE 20.**Further and Particular Statement in Pleading May Be Required.**

A further and better statement of the nature of the claim or defense, or further and better particulars of any matter stated in any pleading, may in any case be ordered, upon such terms, as to costs and otherwise, as may be just.

RULE 21.**Scandal and Impertinence.**

The right to except to bills, answers, and other proceedings for scandal or impertinence shall not obtain, but the court may, upon motion or its own initiative, order any redundant, impertinent or scandalous matter stricken out, upon such terms as the court shall think fit.

RULE 22.**Action at Law Erroneously Begun as Suit in Equity—Transfer.**

If at any time it appear that a suit commenced in equity should have been brought as an action on the law side of the court, it shall be forthwith transferred to the law side and be

there proceeded with, with only such alteration in the pleadings as shall be essential.

RULE 23.**Matters Ordinarily Determinable at Law, When Arising in Suit in Equity to Be Disposed of Therein.**

If in a suit in equity a matter ordinarily determinable at law arises, such matter shall be determined in that suit according to the principles applicable, without sending the case or question to the law side of the court.

RULE 24.**Signature of Counsel.**

Every bill or other pleading shall be signed individually by one or more solicitors of record, and such signatures shall be considered as a certificate by each solicitor that he has read the pleading so signed by him; that upon the instruction laid before him regarding the case there is good ground for the same; that no scandalous matter is inserted in the pleading; and that it is not interposed for delay.

RULE 25.**Bill of Complaint—Contents.**

Hereafter it shall be sufficient that a bill in equity shall contain, in addition to the usual caption:

First, the full name, when known, of each plaintiff and defendant, and the citizenship and residence of each party. If any party be under any disability that fact shall be stated.

Second, a short and plain statement of the grounds upon which the court's jurisdiction depends.

Third, a short and simple statement of the ultimate facts upon which the plaintiff asks relief, omitting any mere statement of evidence.

Fourth, if there are persons other than those named as defendants who appear to be proper parties, the bill should state why they are not made parties—as that they are not within the jurisdiction of the court, or cannot be made parties without ousting the jurisdiction.

Fifth, a statement of and prayer for any special relief pending the suit or on final hearing, which may be stated and sought in alternative forms. If special relief pending the suit be desired the bill should be verified by the oath of the plaintiff, or someone having knowledge of the facts upon which such relief is asked.

RULE 26.**Joinder of Causes of Action.**

The plaintiff may join in one bill as many causes of action, cognizable in equity, as he may have against the defendant. But when there is more than one plaintiff, the causes of action joined must be joint, and if there be more than one defendant the liability must be one asserted against all of the material defendants, or sufficient grounds must appear for uniting the causes of action in order to promote the convenient administration of justice. If it appear that any such causes of action cannot be con-

Rules for the Courts of Equity of the United States.

veniently disposed of together, the court may order separate trials.

RULE 27.**Stockholder's Bill.**

Every bill brought by one or more stockholders in a corporation against the corporation and other parties, founded on rights which may properly be asserted by the corporation, must be verified by oath, and must contain an allegation that the plaintiff was a shareholder at the time of the transaction of which he complains, or that his share had devolved on him since by operation of law, and that the suit is not a collusive one to confer on a court of the United States jurisdiction of a case of which it would not otherwise have cognizance. It must also set forth with particularity the efforts of the plaintiff to secure such action as he desires on the part of the managing directors or trustees, and, if necessary, of the shareholders, and the causes of his failure to obtain such action, or the reasons for not making such effort.

RULE 28.**Amendment of Bill as of Course.**

The plaintiff may, as of course, amend his bill before the defendant has responded thereto, but if such amendment be filed after any copy has issued from the clerk's office, the plaintiff at his own cost shall furnish to the solicitor of record of each opposing party a copy of the bill as amended, unless otherwise ordered by the court or judge.

After pleading filed by any defendant, plaintiff may amend only by consent of the defendant or leave of the court or judge.

RULE 29.**Defenses—How Presented.**

Demurrers and pleas are abolished. Every defense in point of law arising upon the face of the bill, whether for misjoinder, nonjoinder, or insufficiency of fact to constitute a valid cause of action in equity, which might heretofore have been made by demurrer or plea, shall be made by motion to dismiss or in the answer; and every such point of law going to the whole or a material part of the cause or causes of action stated in the bill may be called up and disposed of before final hearing at the discretion of the court. Every defense heretofore presentable by plea in bar or abatement shall be made in the answer and may be separately heard and disposed of before the trial of the principal case in the discretion of the court. If the defendant move to dismiss the bill or any part thereof, the motion may be set down for hearing by either party upon five days' notice, and, if it be denied, answer shall be filed within five days thereafter or a decree pro confesso entered.

RULE 30.**Answer—Contents—Counter-Claim.**

The defendant in his answer shall in short and simple terms set out his

defense to each claim asserted by the bill, omitting any mere statement of evidence and avoiding any general denial of the averments of the bill, but specifically admitting or denying or explaining the facts upon which the plaintiff relies, unless the defendant is without knowledge, in which case he shall so state, such statement operating as a denial. Averments other than of value or amount of damage, if not denied, shall be deemed confessed, except as against an infant, lunatic or other person non compos and not under guardianship, the answer may be amended, by leave of the court or judge, upon reasonable notice, so as to put any averment in issue, when justice requires it. The answer may state as many defenses, in the alternative, regardless of consistency, as the defendant deems essential to his defense.

The answer must state in short and simple form any counter-claim arising out of the transaction which is the subject matter of the suit, and may, without cross-bill, set out any set-off or counter-claim against the plaintiff which might be the subject of an independent suit in equity against him, and such set-off or counter-claim, so set up, shall have the same effect as a cross-suit, so as to enable the court to pronounce a final judgment in the same suit both on the original and cross-claims.

RULE 31.**Reply—When Required—When Cause at Issue.**

Unless the answer assert a set-off or counter-claim, no reply shall be required without special order of the court or judge, but the cause shall be deemed at issue upon the filing of the answer, and any new or affirmative matter therein shall be deemed to be denied by the plaintiff. If the answer include a set-off or counter-claim, the party against whom it is asserted shall reply within ten days after the filing of the answer, unless a longer time be allowed by the court or judge. If the counter-claim is one which affects the rights of other defendants they or their solicitors shall be served with a copy of the same within ten days from the filing thereof, and ten days shall be accorded to such defendants for filing a reply. In default of a reply, a decree pro confesso on the counter-claim may be entered as in default of an answer to the bill.

RULE 32.**Answer to Amended Bill.**

In every case where an amendment to the bill shall be made after answer filed, the defendant shall put in a new or supplemental answer within ten days after that on which the amendment or amended bill is filed, unless the time is enlarged or otherwise ordered by a judge of the court; and upon his default, the like proceedings may be had as in case of an omission to put in an answer.

Rules for the Courts of Equity of the United States.**RULE 33.****Testing Sufficiency of Defense.**

Exceptions for insufficiency of an answer are abolished. But if an answer set up an affirmative defense, set-off or counter-claim, the plaintiff may, upon five days' notice, or such further time as the court may allow, test the sufficiency of the same by motion to strike out. If found insufficient but amendable the court may allow an amendment upon terms, or strike out the matter.

RULE 34.**Supplemental Pleading.**

Upon application of either party the court or judge, may, upon reasonable notice and such terms as are just, permit him to file and serve a supplemental pleading, alleging material facts occurring after his former pleading, or of which he was ignorant when it was made, including the judgment or decree of a competent court rendered after the commencement of the suit determining the matters in controversy or a part thereof.

RULE 35.**Bill of Revivor and Supplemental Bills—Form.**

It shall not be necessary in any bill of revivor or supplemental bill to set forth any of the statements in the original suit, unless the special circumstances of the case may require it.

RULE 36.**Officers Before Whom Pleadings Verified.**

Every pleading which is required to be sworn to by statute, or these rules, may be verified before any justice or judge of any court of the United States, or of any State or Territory, or of the District of Columbia, or any clerk of any court of the United States, or of any Territory, or of the District of Columbia, or any notary public.

RULE 37.**Parties Generally—Intervention.**

Every action shall be prosecuted in the name of the real party in interest, but an executor, administrator, guardian, trustee of an express trust, a party with whom or in whose name a contract has been made for the benefit of another, or a party expressly authorized by statute, may sue in his own name without joining with him the party for whose benefit the action is brought. All persons having an interest in the subject of the action and in obtaining the relief demanded may join as plaintiffs, and any person may be made a defendant who has or claims an interest adverse to the plaintiff. Any person may at any time be made a party if his presence is necessary or proper to a complete determination of the cause. Persons having a united interest must be joined on the same side as plaintiffs or defendants, but when any one refuses to join, he may for such reason be made a defendant.

Any one claiming an interest in the litigation may at any time be per-

mitted to assert his right by intervention, but the intervention shall be in subordination to, and in recognition of, the propriety of the main proceeding.

RULE 38.**Representatives of Class.**

When the question is one of common or general interest to many persons constituting a class so numerous as to make it impracticable to bring them all before the court, one or more may sue or defend for the whole.

RULE 39.**Absence of Persons Who Would Be Proper Parties.**

In all cases where it shall appear to the court that persons, who might otherwise be deemed proper parties to the suit, cannot be made parties by reason of their being out of the jurisdiction of the court, or incapable otherwise of being made parties, or because their joinder would oust the jurisdiction of the court as to the parties before the court, the court may, in its discretion, proceed in the cause without making such persons parties; and in such cases the decree shall be without prejudice to the rights of the absent parties.

RULE 40.**Nominal Parties.**

Where no account, payment, conveyance, or other direct relief is sought against a party to a suit, not being an infant, the party, upon service of the subpoena upon him, need not appear and answer the bill, unless the plaintiff specially requires him to do so by the prayer; but he may appear and answer at his option; and if he does not appear and answer he shall be bound by all the proceedings in the cause. If the plaintiff shall require him to appear and answer he shall be entitled to the costs of all the proceedings against him, unless the court shall otherwise direct.

RULE 41.**Suit to Execute Trusts of Will—Heir as Party.**

In suits to execute the trusts of a will, it shall not be necessary to make the heir at law a party; but the plaintiff shall be at liberty to make the heir at law a party where he desires to have the will established against him.

RULE 42.**Joint and Several Demands.**

In all cases in which the plaintiff has a joint and several demand against several persons, either as principals or sureties, it shall not be necessary to bring before the court as parties to a suit concerning such demand all the persons liable thereto; but the plaintiff may proceed against one or more of the persons severally liable.

RULE 43.**Defects of Parties—Resisting Objection.**

Where the defendant shall by his answer suggest that the bill of complaint is defective for want of parties,

the plaintiff may, within fourteen days after answer filed, set down the cause for argument as a motion upon the objection only; and where the plaintiff shall not so set down his cause, but shall proceed therewith to a hearing notwithstanding an objection for want of parties taken by the answer, he shall not at the hearing of the cause, if the defendant's objection shall then be allowed, be entitled as of course to an order to amend his bill by adding parties; but the court shall be at liberty to dismiss the bill, or to allow an amendment on such terms as justice may require.

RULE 44.**Defect of Parties—Tardy Objection.**

If a defendant shall, at the hearing of a cause, object that a suit is defective for want of parties, not having by motion or answer taken the objection and therein specified by name or description the parties to whom the objection applies, the court shall be at liberty to make a decree saving the rights of the absent parties.

RULE 45.**Death of Party—Revivor.**

In the event of the death of either party the court may, in a proper case, upon motion, order the suit to be revived by the substitution of the proper parties. If the successor or representatives of the deceased party fail to make such application within a reasonable time, then any other party may, on motion, apply for such relief and the court, upon any such motion may make the necessary orders for notice to the parties to be substituted and for the filing of such pleadings or amendments as may be necessary.

RULE 46.**Trial—Testimony Usually Taken in Open Court—Rulings on Objections to Evidence.**

In all trials in equity the testimony of witnesses shall be taken orally in open court, except as otherwise provided by statute or these rules. The court shall pass upon the admissibility of all evidence offered as in actions at law. When evidence is offered and excluded, and the party against whom the ruling is made excepts thereto at the time, the court shall take and report so much thereof, or make such a statement respecting it, as will clearly show the character of the evidence, the form in which it was offered, the objection made, the ruling, and the exception. If the appellate court shall be of opinion that the evidence should have been admitted, it shall not reverse the decree unless it be clearly of opinion that material prejudice will result from an affirmation, in which event it shall direct such further steps as justice may require.

RULE 47.**Depositions—To Be Taken in Exceptional Instances.**

The court, upon application of either party, when allowed by statute, or for

good and exceptional cause for departing from the general rule, to be shown by affidavit, may permit the deposition of named witnesses, to be used before the court or upon a reference to a master, to be taken before an examiner or other named officer, upon the notice and terms specified in the order. All depositions taken under a statute, or under any such order of the court, shall be taken and filed as follows, unless otherwise ordered by the court or judge for good cause shown: Those of the plaintiff within sixty days from the time the cause is at issue; those of the defendant within thirty days from the expiration of the time for the filing of plaintiff's depositions; and rebutting depositions by either party within twenty days after the time for taking original depositions expires.

RULE 48.**Testimony of Expert Witnesses in Patent and Trade-Mark Cases.**

In a case involving the validity or scope of a patent or trade-mark, the district court may, upon petition, order that the testimony in chief of expert witnesses, whose testimony is directed to matters of opinion, be set forth in affidavits and filed as follows: Those of the plaintiff within forty days after the cause is at issue; those of the defendant within twenty days after plaintiff's time has expired; and rebutting affidavits within fifteen days after the expiration of the time for filing original affidavits. Should the opposite party desire the production of any affiant for cross-examination, the court or judge shall, on motion direct that said cross-examination and any re-examination take place before the court upon the trial, and unless the affiant is produced and submits to cross-examination in compliance with such direction, his affidavit shall not be used as evidence in the cause.

RULE 49.**Evidence Taken Before Examiners, Etc.**

All evidence offered before an examiner or like officer, together with any objections, shall be saved and returned into the court. Depositions, whether upon oral examination before an examiner or like officer or otherwise, shall be taken upon questions and answers reduced to writing, or in the form of narrative, and the witness shall be subject to cross and re-examination.

RULE 50.**Stenographer—Appointment—Fees.**

When deemed necessary by the court or officer taking testimony, a stenographer may be appointed who shall take down testimony in shorthand and, if required, transcribe the same. His fee shall be fixed by the court and taxed ultimately as costs. The expense of taking a deposition, or the cost of a transcript, shall be advanced by the party calling the witness or ordering the transcript.

Rules for the Courts of Equity of the United States.**RULE 51.****Evidence Taken Before Examiners, Etc.**

Objections to the evidence, before an examiner or like officer, shall be in short form, stating the grounds of objection relied upon, but no transcript filed by such officer shall include argument or debate. The testimony of each witness, after being reduced to writing, shall be read over to or by him, and shall be signed by him in the presence of the officer; provided, that if the witness shall refuse to sign his deposition so taken, the officer shall sign the same, stating upon the record the reasons, if any, assigned by the witness for such refusal. Objection to any question or questions shall be noted by the officer upon the deposition, but he shall not have power to decide on the competency or materiality or relevancy of the questions. The court shall have power, and it shall be its duty, to deal with the costs of incompetent and immaterial or irrelevant depositions, or parts of them, as may be just.

RULE 52.**Attendance of Witness Before Commissioner, Master or Examiner.**

Witnesses who live within the district, and whose testimony may be taken out of court by these rules, may be summoned to appear before a commissioner appointed to take testimony, or before a master or examiner appointed in any cause, by subpoena in the usual form, which may be issued by the clerk in blank and filled up by the party praying the same, or by the commissioner, master, or examiner, requiring the attendance of the witnesses at the time and place specified, who shall be allowed for attendance the same compensation as for attendance in court; and if any witness shall refuse to appear or give evidence, it shall be deemed a contempt of the court, which being certified to the clerk's office by the commissioner, master, or examiner, an attachment may issue thereupon by order of the court or of any judge thereof, in the same manner as if the contempt were for not attending, or for refusing to give testimony in, the court.

In case of refusal of witnesses to attend or be sworn or to answer any question put by the commissioner, master or examiner or by counsel or solicitor, the same practice shall be adopted as is now practiced with respect to witnesses to be produced on examination before an examiner of said court on written interrogatories.

RULE 53.**Notice of Taking Testimony Before Examiner, Etc.**

Notice shall be given by the respective counsel or parties to the opposite counsel or parties of the time and place of examination before an examiner or like officer for such reasonable time as the court or officer may fix by order in each case.

RULE 54.**Depositions Under Rev. Stat. Secs 863,****865, 866, 867—Cross-Examination.**

After a cause is at issue, depositions may be taken as provided by sections 863, 865, 866 and 867, Revised Statutes. But if in any case no notice has been given the opposite party of the time and place of taking the deposition, he shall, upon application and notice, be entitled to have the witness examined orally before the court, or to a cross-examination before an examiner or like officer, or a new deposition taken with notice, as the court or judge under all the circumstances shall order.

RULE 55.**Deposition Deemed Published When Filed.**

Upon the filing of any deposition or affidavit taken under these rules or any statute, it shall be deemed published, unless otherwise ordered by the court.

RULE 56.**On Expiration of Time for Depositions, Case Goes on Trial Calendar.**

After the time has elapsed for taking and filing depositions under these rules, the case shall be placed on the trial calendar. Thereafter no further testimony by deposition shall be taken except for some strong reason shown by affidavit. In every such application the reason why the testimony of the witness cannot be had orally on the trial, and why his deposition has not been before taken, shall be set forth, together with the testimony which it is expected the witness will give.

RULE 57.**Continuances.**

After a cause shall be placed on the trial calendar it may be passed over to another day of the same term, by consent of counsel or order of the court, but shall not be continued beyond the term save in exceptional cases by order of the court upon good cause shown by affidavit and upon such terms as the court shall in its discretion impose. Continuances beyond the term by consent of the parties shall be allowed on condition only that a stipulation be signed by counsel for all the parties and that all costs incurred therefore be paid. Thereupon an order shall be entered dropping the case from the trial calendar, subject to reinstatement within one year upon application to the court by either party, in which event it shall be heard at the earliest convenient day. If not so reinstated within the year, the suit shall be dismissed without prejudice to a new one.

RULE 58.**Discovery — Interrogatories — Inspection and Production of Documents — Admission of Execution or Genuineness.**

The plaintiff at any time after filing the bill and not later than twenty-one days after the joinder of issue, and

the defendant at any time after filing his answer and not later than twenty-one days after the joinder of issue, and either party at any time thereafter by leave of the court or judge, may file interrogatories in writing for the discovery by the opposite party or parties of facts and documents material to the support or defense of the cause, with a note at the foot thereof stating which of the interrogatories each of the parties is required to answer. But no party shall file more than one set of interrogatories to the same party without leave of the court or judge.

If any party to the cause is a public or private corporation, any opposite party may apply to the court or judge for an order allowing him to file interrogatories to be answered by any officer of the corporation, and an order may be made accordingly for the examination of such officer as may appear to be proper upon such interrogatories as the court or judge shall think fit.

Copies shall be filed for the use of the interrogated party and shall be sent by the clerk to the respective solicitors of record, or to the last known address of the opposite party if there be no record solicitor.

Interrogatories shall be answered, and the answers filed in the clerk's office, within fifteen days after they have been served, unless the time be enlarged by the court or judge. Each interrogatory shall be answered separately and fully and the answers shall be in writing, under oath, and signed by the party or corporate officer interrogated. Within ten days after the service of interrogatories, objections to them, or any of them, may be presented to the court or judge, with proof of notice of the purpose so to do, and answers shall be deferred until the objections are determined, which shall be at as early a time as practicable. In so far as the objections are sustained, answers shall not be required.

The court or judge, upon motion and reasonable notice, may make all such orders as may be appropriate to enforce answers to interrogatories or to effect the inspection or production of documents in the possession of either party and containing evidence material to the cause of action or defense of his adversary. Any party failing or refusing to comply with such an order shall be liable to attachment, and shall also be liable, if a plaintiff to have his bill dismissed, and, if a defendant, to have his answer stricken out and be placed in the same situation as if he had failed to answer.

By a demand served ten days before the trial, either party may call on the other to admit in writing the execution or genuineness of any document, letter or other writing, saving all just exceptions; and if such admission be not made within five days after such service, the costs of proving the document, letter or writing shall be paid by the party refusing or neglecting to make such admission, unless at the

trial the court shall find that the refusal or neglect was reasonable.

RULE 59.**Reference to Master—Exceptional, Not Usual.**

Save in matters of account, a reference to a master shall be the exception, not the rule, and shall be made only upon a showing that some exceptional condition requires it. When such a reference is made, the party at whose instance or for whose benefit it is made shall cause the order of reference to be presented to the master for a hearing within twenty days succeeding the time when the reference was made, unless a longer time be specially granted by the court or judge; if he shall omit to do so, the adverse party shall be at liberty forthwith to cause proceedings to be had before the master, at the costs of the party procuring the reference.

RULE 60.**Proceedings Before Master.**

Upon every such reference, it shall be the duty of the master, as soon as he reasonably can after the same is brought before him, to assign a time and place for proceedings in the same, and to give due notice thereof to each of the parties, or their solicitors; and if either party shall fail to appear at the time and place appointed, the master shall be at liberty to proceed ex parte, or, in his discretion, to adjourn the examination and proceedings to a future day, giving notice to the absent party or his solicitor of such adjournment; and it shall be the duty of the master to proceed with all reasonable diligence in every such reference, and with the least practicable delay, and either party shall be at liberty to apply to the court, or a judge thereof, for an order to the master to speed the proceedings and to make his report, and to certify to the court or judge the reason for any delay.

RULE 61.**Master's Report—Documents Identified but Not Set Forth.**

In the reports made by the master to the court, no part of any state of facts, account, charge, affidavit, deposition, examination, or answer brought in or used before him shall be stated or recited. But such state of facts, account, charge, affidavit, deposition, examination or answer shall be identified and referred to, so as to inform the court what state of facts, account, charge, affidavit, deposition, examination or answer were so brought in or used.

RULE 62.**Powers of Master.**

The master shall regulate all the proceedings in every hearing before him, upon every reference; and he shall have full authority to examine the parties in the cause, upon oath, touching all matters contained in the reference; and also to require the production of all books, papers, writings, vouchers, and other documents

applicable thereto; and also to examine on oath, viva voce, all witnesses produced by the parties before him, or by deposition, according to the acts of Congress, or otherwise, as here provided; and also to direct the mode in which the matters requiring evidence shall be proved before him; and generally to do all other acts, and direct all other inquiries and proceedings in the matters before him, which he may deem necessary and proper to the justice and merits thereof and the rights of the parties.

RULE 63.**Form of Account Before Master.**

All parties accounting before a master shall bring in their respective accounts in the form of debtor and creditor; and any of the other parties who shall not be satisfied with the account so brought in shall be at liberty to examine the accounting party viva voce, or upon interrogatories, as the master shall direct.

RULE 64.**Former Depositions, Etc., May Be Used Before Master.**

All affidavits, depositions and documents which have been previously made, read, or used in the court upon any proceeding in any cause or matter may be used before the master.

RULE 65.**Claimants Before Master Examinable By Him.**

The master shall be at liberty to examine any creditor or other person coming in to claim before him, either upon written interrogatories or viva voce, or in both modes, as the nature of the case may appear to him to require. The evidence upon such examinations shall be taken down by the master, or by some other person by his order and in his presence, if either party requires it, in order that the same may be used by the court if necessary.

RULE 66.**Return of Master's Report—Exceptions—Hearing.**

The master, as soon as his report is ready, shall return the same into the clerk's office and the day of the return shall be entered by the clerk in the Equity Docket. The parties shall have twenty days from the time of the filing of the report to file exceptions thereto, and if no exceptions are within that period filed by either party, the report shall stand confirmed. If exceptions are filed, they shall stand for hearing before the court, if then in session, or, if not, at the next sitting held thereafter, by adjournment or otherwise.

RULE 67.**Costs on Exceptions to Master's Report.**

In order to prevent exceptions to reports from being filed for frivolous causes, or for mere delay, the party whose exceptions are overruled, shall, for every exception overruled, pay five dollars costs to the other party, and

for every exception allowed shall be entitled to the same costs.

RULE 68.**Appointment and Compensation of Masters.**

The district courts may appoint standing masters in chancery in their respective districts (a majority of all the judges thereof concurring in the appointment), and they may also appoint a master pro hac vice in any particular case. The compensation to be allowed to every master shall be fixed by the district court, in its discretion, having regard to all the circumstances thereof, and the compensation shall be charged upon and borne by such of the parties in the cause as the court shall direct. The master shall not retain his report as security for his compensation; but when the compensation is allowed by the court, he shall be entitled to an attachment for the amount against the party who is ordered to pay the same, if, upon notice thereof, he does not pay it within the time prescribed by the court.

RULE 69.**Petition for Rehearing.**

Every petition for a rehearing shall contain the special matter or cause on which such rehearing is applied for, shall be signed by counsel, and the facts therein stated, if not apparent on the record, shall be verified by the oath of the party or by some other person. No rehearing shall be granted after the term at which the final decree of the court shall have been entered and recorded, if an appeal lies to the Circuit Court of Appeals or the Supreme Court. But if no appeal lies, the petition may be admitted at any time before the end of the next term of the court, in the discretion of the court.

RULE 70.**Suits By or Against Incompetents.**

Guardians ad litem to defend a suit may be appointed by the court, or by any judge thereof, for infants or other persons who are under guardianship, or otherwise incapable of suing for themselves. All infants and other persons so incapable may sue by their guardians, if any, or by their prochein ami; subject, however, to such orders as the court or judge may direct for the protection of infants and other persons.

RULE 71.**Form of Decree.**

In drawing up decrees and orders, neither the bill, nor answer, nor other pleadings, nor any part thereof, nor the report of any master, nor any other prior proceeding, shall be recited or stated in the decree or order; but the decree and order shall begin, in substance, as follows: "This cause came on to be heard (or to be further heard, as the case may be) at this term, and was argued by counsel; and thereupon, upon consideration thereof, it was ordered, adjudged and decreed as follows, viz:." (Here insert the decree or order.)

Rules for the Courts of Equity of the United States.

RULE 72.**Correction of Clerical Mistakes In Orders and Decrees.**

Clerical mistakes in decree or decretal orders, or errors arising from any accidental slip or omission, may, at any time before the close of the term at which final decree is rendered, be corrected by order of the court or a judge thereof, upon petition, without the form or expense of a rehearing.

RULE 73.**Preliminary Injunction and Temporary Restraining Orders.**

No preliminary injunction shall be granted without notice to the opposite party. Nor shall any temporary restraining order be granted without notice to the opposite party, unless it shall clearly appear from specific facts, shown by affidavit or by the verified bill, that immediate and irreparable loss or damage will result to the applicant before the matter can be heard on notice. In case a temporary restraining order shall be granted without notice, in the contingency specified, the matter shall be made returnable at the earlier possible time, and in no event later than ten days from the date of the order, and shall take precedence of all matters, except older matters of the same character. When the matter comes up for hearing the party who obtained the temporary restraining order shall proceed with his application for a preliminary injunction, and if he does not do so the court shall dissolve his temporary restraining order. Upon two days notice to the party obtaining such temporary restraining order, the opposite party may appear and move the dissolution or modification of the order, and in that event the court or judge shall proceed to hear and determine the motion as expeditiously as the ends of justice may require. Every temporary restraining order shall be forthwith filed in the clerk's office.

RULE 74.**Injunction Pending Appeal.**

When an appeal from a final decree, in an equity suit, granting or dissolving an injunction, is allowed by a justice or a judge who took part in the decision of the cause, he may, in his discretion, at the time of such allowance, make an order suspending, modifying or restoring the injunction during the pendency of the appeal, upon such terms, as to bond or otherwise, as he may consider proper for the security of the rights of the opposite party.

RULE 75.**Record on Appeal—Reduction and Preparation.**

In case of appeal:

(a) It shall be the duty of the appellant or his solicitor to file with the clerk of the court from which the appeal is prosecuted, together with proof or acknowledgment of service of a copy on the appellee or his solicitor, a praecipe which shall indicate the

portions of the record to be incorporated into the transcript on such appeal. Should the appellee or his solicitor desire additional portions of the record incorporated into the transcript, he shall file with the clerk of the court his praecipe also within ten days thereafter, unless the time shall be enlarged by the court or a judge thereof, indicating such additional portions of the record desired by him.

(b) The evidence to be included in the record shall not be set forth in full, but shall be stated in simple and condensed form, all parts not essential to the decision of the questions presented by the appeal being omitted and the testimony of witnesses being stated only in narrative form, save that if either party desires it, and the court or judge so directs, any part of the testimony shall be reproduced in the exact words of the witness. The duty of so condensing and stating the evidence shall rest primarily on the appellant, who shall prepare his statement thereof and lodge the same in the clerk's office for the examination of the other parties at or before the time of filing his praecipe under paragraph a of this rule. He shall also notify the other parties or their solicitors of such lodgment and shall name a time and place when he will ask the court or judge to approve the statement, the time so named to be at least ten days after such notice. At the expiration of the time named or such further time as the court or judge may allow, the statement, together with any objections made or amendments proposed by any party, shall be presented to the court or the judge, and if the statement be true, complete and properly prepared, it shall be approved by the court or judge, and if it be not true, complete or properly prepared, it shall be made so under the direction of the court or judge and shall then be approved. When approved, it shall be filed in the clerk's office and become a part of the record for the purposes of the appeal.

(c) If any difference arise between the parties concerning directions as to the general contents of the record to be prepared on the appeal, such difference shall be submitted to the court or judge in conformity with the provisions of paragraph b of this rule and shall be covered by the directions which the court or judge may give on the subject.

RULE 76.**Record on Appeal—Reduction and Preparation—Costs—Correction of Omissions.**

In preparing the transcript on an appeal, especial care shall be taken to avoid the inclusion of more than one copy of the same paper and to exclude the formal and immaterial parts of all exhibits, documents and other papers included therein; and for any infraction of this or any kindred rule the Appellate Court may withhold or impose costs as the circumstances of the case and the discouragement of like infractions in the future may require. Costs for such an infraction

may be imposed upon offending solicitors as well as parties.

If, in the transcript, anything material to either party be omitted by accident or error, the Appellate Court, on a proper suggestion or its own motion, may direct that the omission be corrected by a supplemental transcript.

RULE 77.

Record of Appeal—Agreed Statement.

When the questions presented by an appeal can be determined by the Appellate Court without an examination of all the pleadings and evidence the parties, with the approval of the district court or the judge thereof, may prepare and sign a statement of the case showing how the questions arose and were decided in the district court and setting forth so much only of the facts alleged and proved, or sought to be proved, as is essential to a decision of such questions by the Appellate Court. Such statement, when filed in the office of the clerk of the district court, shall be treated as superseding, for the purposes of the appeal, all parts of the record other than the decree from which the appeal is taken, and, together with such decree, shall be copied and certified to the Appellate Court as the record on appeal.

RULE 78.

Affirmation in Lieu of Oath.

Whenever under these rules an oath is or may be required to be taken, the party may, if conscientiously scrupulous of taking an oath, in lieu thereof make solemn affirmation to the truth of the facts stated by him.

RULE 79.

Additional Rules by District Court.

With the concurrence of a majority of the circuit judges for the circuit, the district courts may make any other and further rules and regulations for the practice, proceedings and process, mesne and final, in their respective districts, not inconsistent with the rules hereby prescribed, and from time to time after and amend the same.

RULE 80.

Computation of Time—Sundays and Holidays.

When the time prescribed by these rules for doing any act expires on a Sunday or legal holiday, such time shall extend to and include the next succeeding day that is not a Sunday or legal holiday.

RULE 81.

These Rules Effective February 1, 1913—Old Rules Abrogated.

These rules shall be in force on and after February 1, 1913, and shall govern all proceedings in cases then pending or thereafter brought, save that where in any then pending cause an order has been made or act done which cannot be changed without doing substantial injustice, the court may give effect to such order or act to the extent necessary to avoid any such injustice.

All rules theretofore prescribed by the Supreme Court, regulating the practice in suits in equity, shall be abrogated when these rules take effect.
